## Associations of "Look over" (30 Words)

<b>appear</b>	Come into being or existence or appear on the scene. <i>This <b>appears</b> to be a very difficult problem.</i>
<a href="#"><b>askance</b></a>	Directed to one side with or as if with doubt or suspicion or envy- Elizabeth Bowen. <i>A waiter looked <b>askance</b> at his jeans.</i>
<b>at</b>	100 at equal 1 kip in Laos.
<a href="#"><b>browse</b></a>	Feed as in a meadow or pasture. <i>A <b>browse</b> through the sports pages.</i>
<b>contented</b>	Satisfied or showing satisfaction with things as they are. <i>I was never <b>contented</b> with half measures.</i>
<a href="#"><b>emerge</b></a>	Recover from or survive a difficult situation. <i>It <b>emerged</b> that the PM and the Chancellor are still at loggerheads.</i>
<b>find</b>	Get or find back recover the use of. <i><b>Find</b> someone guilty.</i>
<b>fixate</b>	(in Freudian theory) arrest (a person or their libidinal energy) at an immature stage, causing an obsessive attachment. <i>Subjects <b>fixated</b> a central point.</i>
<b>gape</b>	A disease of birds with gaping of the mouth as a symptom caused by infestation with gapeworm. <i>A large duffel bag <b>gaped</b> open by her feet.</i>
<a href="#"><b>gaze</b></a>	A steady intent look. <i>The male <b>gaze</b>.</i>
<b>glance</b>	Throw a glance at take a brief look at. <i>She only <b>glanced</b> at the paper.</i>
<a href="#"><b>glimpse</b></a>	Catch a glimpse of or see briefly. <i>She caught a <b>glimpse</b> of the ocean.</i>
<b>hairstyle</b>	A particular way in which a person's hair is cut or arranged.

<b>observing</b>	Quick to notice; showing quick and keen perception.
<b>onlooker</b>	Someone who looks on. <i>A crowd of fascinated <b>onlookers</b>.</i>
<b>peek</b>	A secret look. <i>I only <b>peeked</b> I didn't see anything interesting.</i>
<b>predominate</b>	Appear very large or occupy a commanding position. <i>Hispanics <b>predominate</b> in this neighborhood.</i>
<b>redundance</b>	The attribute of being superfluous and unneeded.
<b>rummage</b>	An unsystematic and untidy search. <i>Mick <b>rummaged</b> up his skateboard.</i>
<b>searching</b>	Thoroughly scrutinizing, especially in a disconcerting way. <i>You have to ask yourselves some <b>searching</b> questions.</i>
<b>see</b>	Go to see for a social visit. <i>I can <b>see</b> a risk in this strategy.</i>
<b>seem</b>	Seem to be true probable or apparent. <i>It would <b>seem</b> that he has been fooling us all.</i>
<b>sidelong</b>	Inclining or directed to one side. <i>He looked <b>sidelong</b> at her with a quick smile.</i>
<b>sideways</b>	Denoting a job or position at the same level as one previously held rather than one resulting from promotion or demotion. <i>Turned <b>sideways</b> to show the profile.</i>
<b>smug</b>	Marked by excessive complacency or self-satisfaction. <i>He was feeling <b>smug</b> after his win.</i>
<b>squint</b>	The act of squinting looking with the eyes partly closed. <i>Melanie did not <b>squint</b>.</i>
<b>stare</b>	Be unpleasantly prominent or striking. <i>The students <b>stared</b> at the teacher with amazement.</i>
<b>staring</b>	(used of eyes) open and fixed as if in fear or wonder. <i><b>Staring</b> eyes.</i>
<b>visit</b>	The act of visiting in an official capacity as for an inspection. <i>He shall <b>visit</b> earth in mercy.</i>
<b>watch</b>	See or watch. <i>I guess I can rest a while with you here to <b>watch</b> over me.</i>
