Definitions of "Loop" as a noun

- *A single execution of a set of instructions that are to be repeated.*
- *The topology of a network whose components are serially connected in such a way that the last component is connected to the first component.*
- *A programmed sequence of instructions that is repeated until or while a particular condition is satisfied.*
- *A flight maneuver; aircraft flies a complete circle in the vertical plane.*
- *The basic pattern of the human fingerprint.*
- *A complete circuit for an electric current.*

- *A length of thread, rope, or similar material, doubled or crossing itself, used as a fastening or handle.*
- *An inner circle of advisors (especially under President Reagan).*
- *An intrauterine device in the shape of a loop.*
- *A length of railway track which is connected at either end to the main line and on to which trains can be diverted to allow others to pass.*
- *A structure, series, or process, the end of which is connected to the beginning.*
- *Fastener consisting of a metal ring for lining a small hole to permit the attachment of cords or lines.*
- *A manoeuvre describing a curve that crosses itself, made on a single edge.*
- *A shape produced by a curve that bends round and crosses itself.*
- *A complete electrical circuit around which current flows or a signal circulates.*
- *A stretch of road that diverges from a main road and joins it again.*
- *(computer science) a single execution of a set of instructions that are to be repeated.*
- *Anything with a round or oval shape (formed by a curve that is closed and does not intersect itself).*
- *An endless strip of tape or film allowing continuous repetition.*
- *A manoeuvre in which an aircraft describes a vertical circle in the air.*
- *A computer program that performs a series of instructions repeatedly until some specified condition is satisfied.*
- *A curved stroke forming part of a letter (e.g. b, p).*

*Modern welding generators are designed so that there is a high voltage for striking the **arc**.*
- bend** A kind of knot used to join two ropes together or to tie a rope to another object e g a carrick bend.

*She sat in the front row of the **circle**.*
- coil** An electrical device consisting of a coiled wire for converting the level of a voltage producing a magnetic field or adding inductance to a circuit.
*The snake wrapped its **coils** around her.*
- convolution** A sinuous fold in the surface of the brain.
*The **convolutions** of farm policy.*

cringle	Fastener consisting of a metal ring for lining a small hole to permit the attachment of cords or lines.
curl	With reference to a person's hair a state or condition of being curled. <i>Your hair has a natural curl.</i>
curve	A pitch of a baseball that is thrown with spin so that its path curves as it approaches the batter. <i>The vehicle rounded a curve.</i>
eyelet	A metal ring used to reinforce an eyelet in leather or cloth. <i>The white eyelet duvet.</i>
grommet	A young or inexperienced surfer or skateboarder. <i>Mega moves that make gods out of grommets.</i>
grummet	Fastener consisting of a metal ring for lining a small hole to permit the attachment of cords or lines.
helix	The rim of the external ear.
hook	A sharp curve or crook a shape resembling a hook. <i>He took lessons to cure his hooking.</i>
hoop	Horizontal circular metal hoop supporting a net through which players try to throw the basketball. <i>By the official rules of the game a basketball hoop must be 18 inches in diameter and 10 feet off the ground.</i>
incurvation	The action of creating a curved shape.
iteration	The repetition of a process or utterance. <i>The solution is obtained by iteration.</i>
kink	A person's unusual sexual preference. <i>Though the system is making some headway there are still some kinks to iron out.</i>
loop topology	An intrauterine device in the shape of a loop.
loop-the-loop	An inner circle of advisors (especially under President Reagan).
noose	A trap for birds or small mammals often has a slip noose. <i>A hangman's noose.</i>
oval	An oval sports field or racing track. <i>Cut out two small ovals from the felt.</i>
ring	A ring shaped or circular object. <i>She had rings on every finger.</i>
spiral	A spiral curve shape pattern or object. <i>An inflationary spiral.</i>

- twirl** A spiralling or swirling shape, especially a flourish made with a pen.
*Kate did a **twirl** in front of the mirror.*
- twist** A fine strong thread consisting of twisted strands of cotton or silk.
*With a sudden **twist** she got away from him.*
- whorl** A pattern of spirals or concentric circles.
*Shelley drew larger and larger dark **whorls** on her notepad.*
- zigzag** A turn on a zigzag course.
*She traced a **zigzag** on the metal with her finger.*

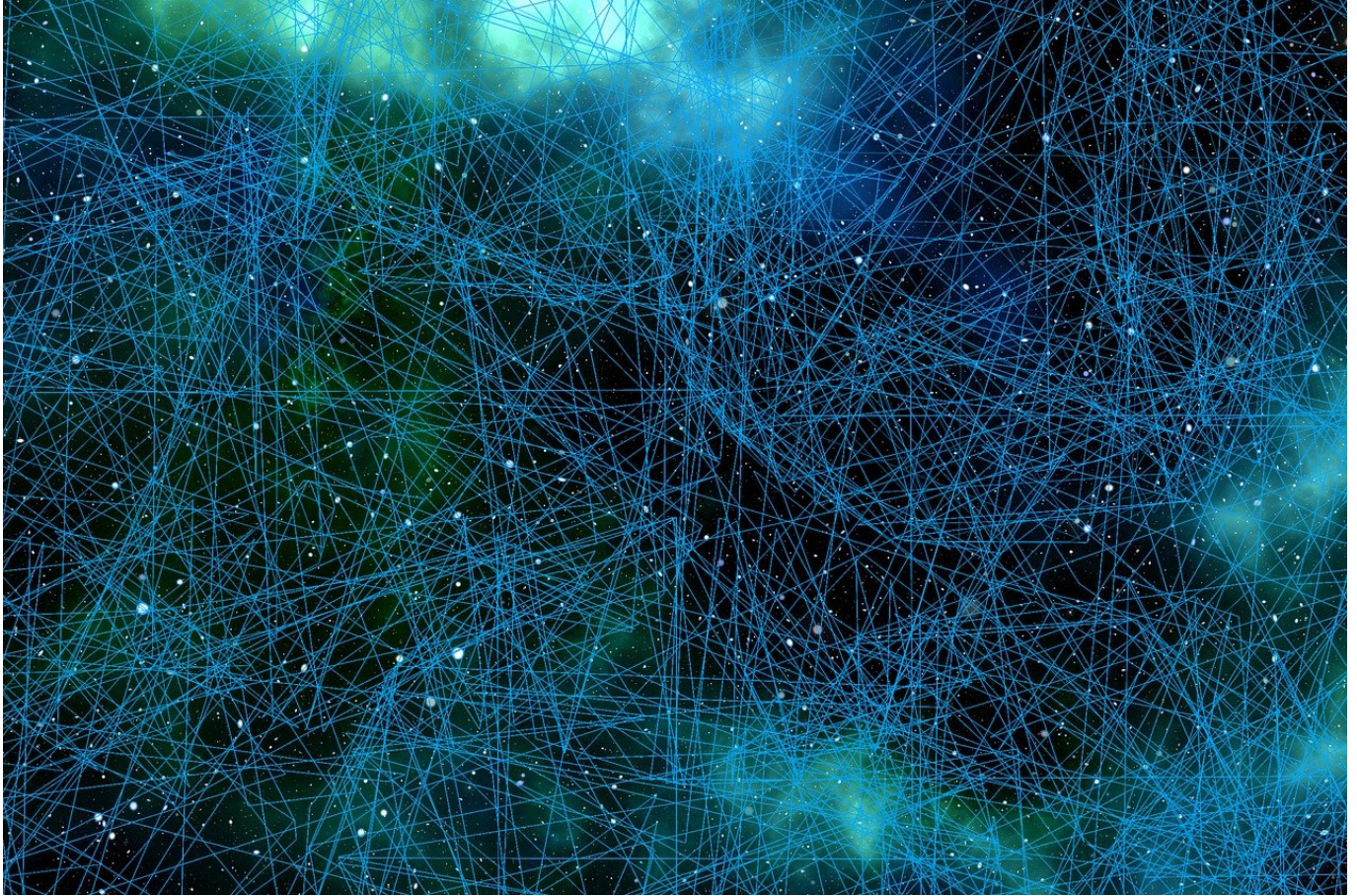
bend	Bend one's back forward from the waist on down. <i>A refusal to bend to mob rule.</i>
bend into spirals	Turn from a straight course, fixed direction, or line of interest.
bend into whorls	Change direction.
coil	Wind around something in coils or loops. <i>He coiled a lock of her hair around his finger.</i>
corkscrew	Move or twist in a spiral motion. <i>The plane was corkscrewing towards the earth.</i>
curl	Form a curl, curve, or kink. <i>Slowly curl the barbell to shoulder height.</i>
<u>curve</u>	Form an arch or curve. <i>Her mouth curved in a smile.</i>
form a hoop with	Establish or impress firmly in the mind.

form hoops with	Give shape or form to.
intertwine	Make a loop in. <i>A net made of cotton intertwined with other natural fibres.</i>
make a circle with	Be or be capable of being changed or made into.
make circles with	Earn on some commercial or business transaction; earn as salary or wages.
meander	(of language, thought, etc.) proceed aimlessly or with little purpose. <i>A stylish offbeat thriller which occasionally meanders.</i>
snake	Move smoothly and sinuously like a snake. <i>A rope snaked down.</i>
<u>spiral</u>	Cause to have a spiral shape or follow a spiral course. <i>Inflation continued to spiral.</i>
turn	To break and turn over earth especially with a plow. <i>The cream has turned we have to throw it out.</i>
<u>twist</u>	Form into twists. <i>She twisted her handkerchief into a knot.</i>
wind	Catch the scent of get wind of. <i>Wind your watch.</i>
wreathe	(especially of smoke) move with a curling motion. <i>Shall I once more wreathe my arms about Antonio s neck.</i>

gyre	A spiral or vortex. <i>A swarm of ghosts gyred around him.</i>
helical	Having the shape or form of a helix; spiral. <i>Helical molecules.</i>
helix	A curve that lies on the surface of a cylinder or cone and cuts the element at a constant angle.
interlace	Spin, wind, or twist together. <i>You need different software to interlace the images.</i>
intertwine	Make lacework by knotting or looping. <i>As with most traditions fact and fiction have become inextricably intertwined.</i>
knot	A particular method of making a knot. <i>A small knot of women listened to his sermon.</i>
lace	Of a garment or shoe be fastened by means of laces. <i>Lace a tablecloth.</i>
lacing	The act of inflicting corporal punishment with repeated blows. <i>Black coffee with a generous lacing of rum.</i>
meander	(of a river or road) follow a winding course. <i>A stylish offbeat thriller which occasionally meanders.</i>
perm	Set the hair in a perm. <i>She perms her hair.</i>
ringlet	Any of various butterflies belonging to the family Satyridae. <i>Her hair fell loose in ringlets.</i>
