## Loop as a Noun

### Definitions of "Loop" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “loop” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A single execution of a set of instructions that are to be repeated.*
- *The topology of a network whose components are serially connected in such a way that the last component is connected to the first component.*
- *A programmed sequence of instructions that is repeated until or while a particular condition is satisfied.*
- *A flight maneuver; aircraft flies a complete circle in the vertical plane.*
- *The basic pattern of the human fingerprint.*
- *A complete circuit for an electric current.*

- *A length of thread, rope, or similar material, doubled or crossing itself, used as a fastening or handle.*
- *An inner circle of advisors (especially under President Reagan).*
- *An intrauterine device in the shape of a loop.*
- *A length of railway track which is connected at either end to the main line and on to which trains can be diverted to allow others to pass.*
- *A structure, series, or process, the end of which is connected to the beginning.*
- *Fastener consisting of a metal ring for lining a small hole to permit the attachment of cords or lines.*
- *A manoeuvre describing a curve that crosses itself, made on a single edge.*
- *A shape produced by a curve that bends round and crosses itself.*
- *A complete electrical circuit around which current flows or a signal circulates.*
- *A stretch of road that diverges from a main road and joins it again.*
- *(computer science) a single execution of a set of instructions that are to be repeated.*
- *Anything with a round or oval shape (formed by a curve that is closed and does not intersect itself).*
- *An endless strip of tape or film allowing continuous repetition.*
- *A manoeuvre in which an aircraft describes a vertical circle in the air.*
- *A computer program that performs a series of instructions repeatedly until some specified condition is satisfied.*
- *A curved stroke forming part of a letter (e.g. b, p).*

- bend** A kind of knot used to join two ropes together or to tie a rope to another object e g a carrick bend.

*She sat in the front row of the **circle**.*
- coil** An electrical device consisting of a coiled wire for converting the level of a voltage producing a magnetic field or adding inductance to a circuit.

*The **convolutions** of farm policy.*

<b>cringle</b>	Fastener consisting of a metal ring for lining a small hole to permit the attachment of cords or lines.
<b>curl</b>	With reference to a person's hair a state or condition of being curled. <i>Your hair has a natural <b>curl</b>.</i>
<b>curve</b>	A pitch of a baseball that is thrown with spin so that its path curves as it approaches the batter. <i>The vehicle rounded a <b>curve</b>.</i>
<b>eyelet</b>	A metal ring used to reinforce an eyelet in leather or cloth. <i>The white <b>eyelet</b> duvet.</i>
<b>grommet</b>	A young or inexperienced surfer or skateboarder. <i>Mega moves that make gods out of <b>grommets</b>.</i>
<b>grummet</b>	Fastener consisting of a metal ring for lining a small hole to permit the attachment of cords or lines.
<b>helix</b>	The rim of the external ear.
<b>hook</b>	A sharp curve or crook a shape resembling a hook. <i>He took lessons to cure his <b>hooking</b>.</i>
<b>hoop</b>	Horizontal circular metal hoop supporting a net through which players try to throw the basketball. <i>By the official rules of the game a basketball <b>hoop</b> must be 18 inches in diameter and 10 feet off the ground.</i>
<b>incurvation</b>	The action of creating a curved shape.
<b>iteration</b>	The repetition of a process or utterance. <i>The solution is obtained by <b>iteration</b>.</i>
<b>kink</b>	A person's unusual sexual preference. <i>Though the system is making some headway there are still some <b>kinks</b> to iron out.</i>
<b>loop topology</b>	An intrauterine device in the shape of a loop.
<b>loop-the-loop</b>	An inner circle of advisors (especially under President Reagan).
<b>noose</b>	A trap for birds or small mammals often has a slip noose. <i>A hangman's <b>noose</b>.</i>
<b>oval</b>	An oval sports field or racing track. <i>Cut out two small <b>ovals</b> from the felt.</i>
<b>ring</b>	A ring shaped or circular object. <i>She had <b>rings</b> on every finger.</i>
<b>spiral</b>	A spiral curve shape pattern or object. <i>An inflationary <b>spiral</b>.</i>

**twirl**

A spiralling or swirling shape, especially a flourish made with a pen.  
*Kate did a **twirl** in front of the mirror.*

**twist**

A fine strong thread consisting of twisted strands of cotton or silk.  
*With a sudden **twist** she got away from him.*

**whorl**

A pattern of spirals or concentric circles.  
*Shelley drew larger and larger dark **whorls** on her notepad.*

**zigzag**

A turn on a zigzag course.  
*She traced a **zigzag** on the metal with her finger.*

<b>bend into spirals</b>	Turn from a straight course, fixed direction, or line of interest.

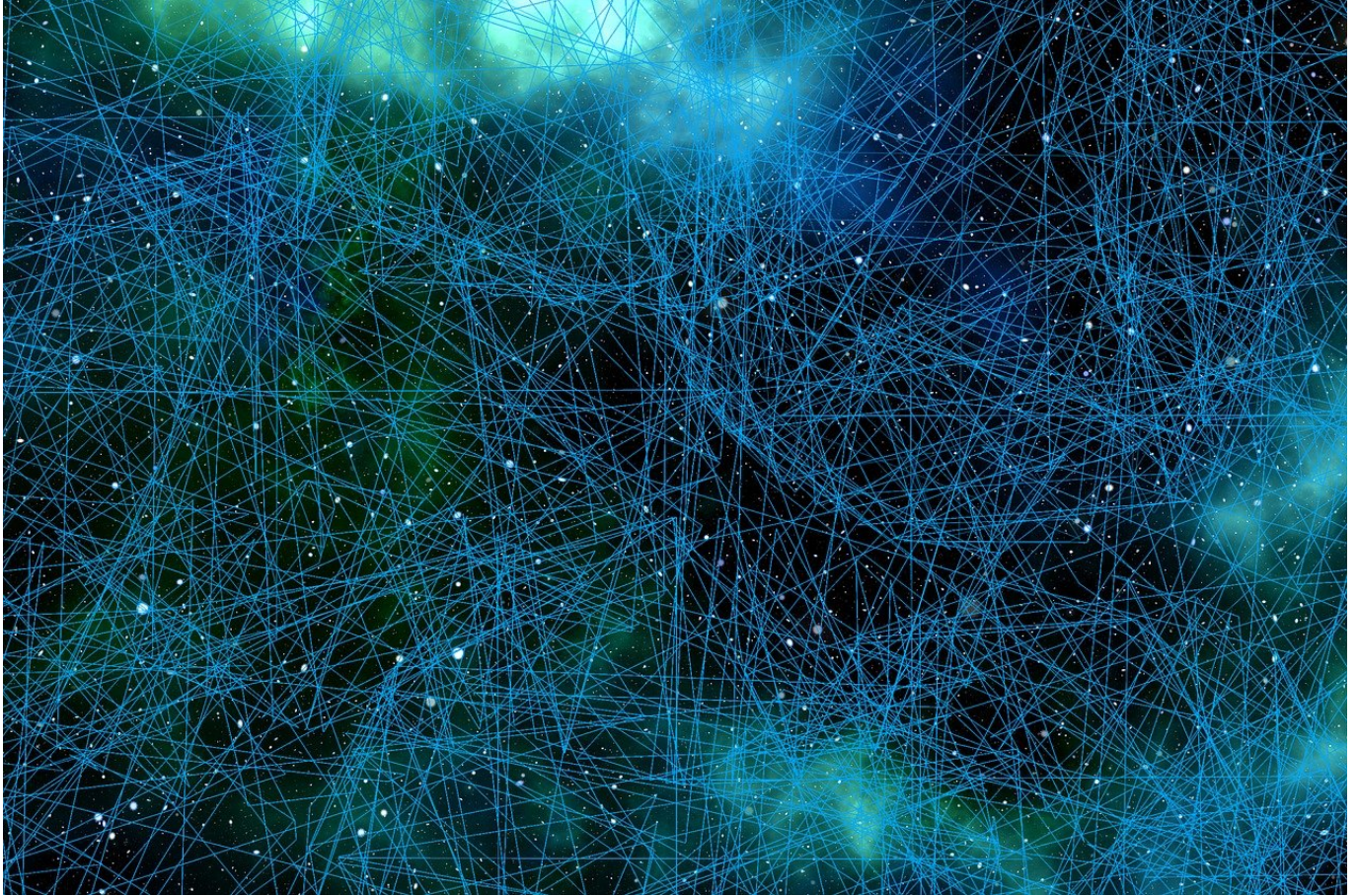

<b>make a circle with</b>	Be or be capable of being changed or made into.
<b>make circles with</b>	Earn on some commercial or business transaction; earn as salary or wages.
<b>meander</b>	(of language, thought, etc.) proceed aimlessly or with little purpose. <i>A stylish offbeat thriller which occasionally <b>meanders</b>.</i>
<b>snake</b>	Move smoothly and sinuously like a snake. <i>A rope <b>snaked</b> down.</i>
<b><u>spiral</u></b>	Cause to have a spiral shape or follow a spiral course. <i>Inflation continued to <b>spiral</b>.</i>
<b>turn</b>	To break and turn over earth especially with a plow. <i>The cream has <b>turned</b> we have to throw it out.</i>

<b>helical</b>	Having the shape or form of a helix; spiral. <i><b>Helical</b> molecules.</i>
<b>helix</b>	A curve that lies on the surface of a cylinder or cone and cuts the element at a constant angle.
<b>interlace</b>	Spin, wind, or twist together. <i>You need different software to <b>interlace</b> the images.</i>
<b>intertwine</b>	Make lacework by knotting or looping. <i>As with most traditions fact and fiction have become inextricably <b>intertwined</b>.</i>
<b>knot</b>	A particular method of making a knot. <i>A small <b>knot</b> of women listened to his sermon.</i>
<b>lace</b>	Of a garment or shoe be fastened by means of laces. <i><b>Lace</b> a tablecloth.</i>
<b>lacing</b>	The act of inflicting corporal punishment with repeated blows. <i>Black coffee with a generous <b>lacing</b> of rum.</i>

**twist** Social dancing in which couples vigorously twist their hips and arms in time to the music was popular in the 1960s.

*He could **twist** a rope strong enough to hold a mule.*

**tying** The act of tying or binding things together.

Make (a complex story or pattern) from a number of interconnected elements.

**weave** *Trailers show him with dyed blond hair and in one scene a flowing blond **weave**.*

**whorl** A set of leaves, flowers, or branches springing from the stem at the same level and encircling it.

*Shelley drew larger and larger dark **whorls** on her notepad.*
