fondly With fondness; with love. They **fondly** believed the cheers were for them.

- A lovingly restored building.
- They smile lovingly at each other.

Associations of "Lovingly" (30 Words)

affection	A gentle feeling of fondness or liking. <i>He had trouble expressing the affection he felt.</i>
<u>caress</u>	A gentle affectionate stroking (or something resembling it. <i>She caressed the girl s forehead.</i>
cherish	Be fond of; be attached to. I cherish the letters she wrote.
<u>couple</u>	An indefinite small number. He hoped she d be better in a couple of days.
cuddly	Inviting cuddling or hugging. A cuddly teddybear.
<u>duo</u>	Two items of the same kind. Two duo s for violin and viola.



embrace	Used to refer to something which is regarded as surrounding, holding, or restricting someone. <i>They</i> embrace <i>d</i> .
family	A social unit living together. All manuscripts that share this reading constitute a family .
<u>fondly</u>	With affection or liking. Things I fondly recall from my childhood.
househusband	A husband who keeps house while his wife earns the family income.
hug	Hold (something) closely or tightly round or against part of one's body. <i>Come here and give me a big hug.</i>
<u>husband</u>	Use (resources) economically. She husband ed their financial resources through difficult times.
join	Cause to become joined or linked. <i>Her brothers joined up in 1914.</i>
kiss	Touch lightly or gently. There was a brief kiss of their hands in passing.
kissing	Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs.
kith	Your friends and acquaintances. A widow without kith or kin.
lovable	Inspiring or deserving love or affection. A mischievous but lovable child.
love	A person or thing that one loves. She love s her boss and works hard for him.
marriage	The act of marrying; the nuptial ceremony. A happy marriage .
married	A person who is married. <i>Married</i> life.
mate	South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly called mate. <i>Camels hate leaving their mates.</i>
newlywed	Someone recently married.
<u>partner</u>	Associate or work together as partners. Young farmers who partner ed Isabel to the village dance.
pat	Pat or squeeze fondly or playfully especially under the chin. <i>He patted him consolingly on the shoulder.</i>
polygamist	Someone who is married to two or more people at the same time. A Mississippi based group of practising polygamist s.



prenuptial	Relating to events before a marriage. <i>Prenuptial pregnancy.</i>
treasure	Be fond of; be attached to. She set out to look at the art treasure s.
wed	Combine (two factors or qualities, especially desirable ones. <i>Will you wed your daughter to him.</i>
