cherish Be fond of; be attached to.

cuddly Inviting cuddling or hugging.

A cuddly teddybear.

husband Use (resources) economically.

join Cause to become joined or linked.

kiss Touch lightly or gently.

There was a brief **kiss** of their hands in passing.

kissing Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs.

kith Your friends and acquaintances.

A widow without **kith** or kin.

loyable Inspiring or deserving love or affection.

A mischievous but lovable child.

A person or thing that one loves.

She **love**s her boss and works hard for him.

marriageThe act of marrying; the nuptial ceremony.

A happy **marriage**.

A person who is married.

married Married life.

South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly

mate called mate.

Camels hate leaving their **mate**s.

newlywed Someone recently married.

Associate or work together as partners.

Young farmers who **partner**ed Isabel to the village dance.

Pat or squeeze fondly or playfully especially under the chin.

He **pat**ted him consolingly on the shoulder.
