<b>abatement</b>	The action of abating or being abated; ending or subsiding. <i>This trend shows no sign of <b>abatement</b>.</i>
<b>alto</b>	The lowest female singing voice contralto. <i><b>Alto</b> flute.</i>
<b>baritone</b>	A part written for a baritone voice. <i>A <b>baritone</b> voice.</i>
<a href="#">cash</a>	Exchange for cash. <i>The bank <b>cash</b>ed her cheque.</i>
<b>confiscation</b>	Seizure by the government. <i>A court ordered the <b>confiscation</b> of her property.</i>
<b>customs</b>	The official department that administers and collects the duties levied by a government on imported goods. <i>An inflow of <b>customs</b> duties to the Treasury.</i>
<b>declivity</b>	A downward slope. <i>A thickly wooded <b>declivity</b>.</i>
<b>deductible</b>	Able to be deducted, especially from taxable income or tax to be paid. <i>Childcare vouchers will be <b>deductible</b> expenses for employers.</i>
<b>droop</b>	An act or instance of drooping a limp or weary attitude. <i>A long black cloak <b>drooped</b> from his shoulders.</i>
<a href="#">earn</a>	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>Through the years she has <b>earned</b> affection and esteem.</i>
<a href="#">earned</a>	Gained or acquired; especially through merit or as a result of effort or action. <i>A well <b>earned</b> reputation for honesty.</i>
<b>earnings</b>	Something that remunerates. <i>He claimed damages for loss of <b>earnings</b>.</i>

<b>emolument</b>	Compensation received by virtue of holding an office or having employment (usually in the form of wages or fees. <i>The directors <b>emoluments</b>.</i>
<b>expense</b>	Offset an item of expenditure as an expense against taxable income. <i>I can <b>expense</b> the refreshments.</i>
<b>improbably</b>	Not easy to believe. <i>A barbecue lunch including <b>improbably</b> a jar of caviar each.</i>
<b>lucre</b>	Informal terms for money. <i>Officials getting their hands grubby with filthy <b>lucre</b>.</i>
<b>overpayment</b>	A payment larger than needed or expected. <i>He received 20 000 in benefit <b>overpayments</b>.</i>
<b>paycheck</b>	A check issued in payment of wages or salary.
<b>purchaser</b>	A person who buys. <i>One of the club s prospective <b>purchasers</b>.</i>
<b>redistribute</b>	Distribute (something) differently or again, typically to achieve greater social equality. <i><b>Redistribute</b> the troops more strategically.</i>
<b>redistribution</b>	Distributing again. <i>The revolution resulted in a <b>redistribution</b> of wealth.</i>
<b>remuneration</b>	The act of paying for goods or services or to recompense for losses. <i>Adequate <b>remuneration</b> for his work.</i>
<u><a href="#">revenue</a></u>	The department of the civil service collecting state revenue. <i>The government s tax <b>revenues</b>.</i>
<b>tariff</b>	Charge a tariff. <i>These services are <b>tariffed</b> by volume.</i>
<u><a href="#">tax</a></u>	Levy a tax on. <i>A <b>tax</b> on fuel.</i>
<b>taxation</b>	Government income due to taxation. <i>The progressive nature of <b>taxation</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">tithe</a></u>	Pay or give as a tithe. <i>He <b>tithe</b>s 10 per cent of his income to the Church.</i>
<b>vat</b>	Place or treat in a vat. <i>A <b>vat</b> of hot tar.</i>
<b>wage</b>	Carry on (wars, battles, or campaigns). <i>Disasters are the <b>wages</b> of sin.</i>
<b>wealth</b>	An abundance of valuable possessions or money. <i>The tables and maps contain a <b>wealth</b> of information.</i>
