abyss	A deep or seemingly bottomless chasm. <i>The abyss between the two nations.</i>
alto	The lowest female singing voice contralto. <i>Alto clarinet or recorder.</i>
baritone	A part written for a baritone voice. <i>Baritone oboe.</i>
below	See below. <i>I ll go below and fix us a drink.</i>
beneath	Extending or directly underneath something. <i>Upper layers can be removed to reveal internal parts beneath.</i>
contralto	A woman singer having a contralto voice. <i>She sang in a high contralto.</i>
depressed	(of a person) in a state of unhappiness or despondency. <i>Depressed by the loss of his job.</i>
descant	Sing in descant. <i>His descant of deprivation.</i>
descend	Be a blood relative of (a specified ancestor). <i>John Dalrymple was descended from an ancient Ayrshire family.</i>
descending	Moving down a scale of quality. <i>The categories are listed in descending order of usefulness.</i>
descent	The kinship relation between an individual and the individual’s progenitors. <i>His descents on the manager of any shop he took a fancy to visit.</i>
down	Bring down or defeat an opponent. <i>The sun started to go down.</i>
downcast	(of a person’s eyes) looking downwards. <i>Her modestly downcast eyes.</i>
downdraft	A strong downward air current.

downswing	A swing downward of a golf club. <i>Your body must not sway to the left during the downswing.</i>
downward	Moving or leading towards a lower place or level. <i>Prices plunged downward.</i>
droop	An act or instance of drooping a limp or weary attitude. <i>The exhausted droop of her shoulders.</i>
drop	A section of theatrical scenery lowered from the flies a drop cloth or drop curtain. <i>A significant drop in consumer spending.</i>
falling	Coming down freely under the influence of gravity. <i>Falling rain.</i>
improbably	Not easy to believe. <i>Everyone in the film is improbably gorgeous.</i>
incredibly	Used to introduce a statement that is hard to believe; strangely. <i>Incredibly she survived the crash.</i>
nether	Located below or beneath something else. <i>The ballast is suspended from its nether end.</i>
sinuosity	A bend, especially in a stream or road. <i>He hated the sinuosity of mountain roads.</i>
soprano	A part written for a soprano voice. <i>A piece composed for soprano flute and continuo.</i>
subculture	A social group within a national culture that has distinctive patterns of behavior and beliefs. <i>In what ways does the social environment predispose certain individuals to join delinquent subcultures.</i>
tenor	A singing voice between baritone and alto or countertenor the highest of the ordinary adult male range. <i>He had a good tenor voice.</i>
under	Under water. <i>The under parts of a machine.</i>
underneath	Situated directly below something else. <i>A crane lifted slabs of concrete to rescue people trapped underneath.</i>
underside	The bottom or lower side or surface of something. <i>The butterfly's wings have a mottled brown pattern on the underside.</i>
vertically	In a way that involves different levels or stages of a hierarchy or process. <i>Vertically stacked books.</i>
