<u>graduate</u>	A person who has successfully completed a course of study or training especially a person who has been awarded an undergraduate or first academic degree. <i>He <b>graduate</b>d from Glasgow University in 1990.</i>
homeroom	A classroom in which all students in a particular grade (or in a division of a grade) meet at certain times under the supervision of a teacher who takes attendance and does other administrative business.
mandible	The jaw or a jawbone, especially the lower jawbone in mammals and fishes. The drake is all black except for an orange mark on the upper <b>mandible</b> .
<u>minimize</u>	Represent as less significant or important. The aim is to <b>minimize</b> costs.
pupil	A learner who is enrolled in an educational institution. Will you take me on as your <b>pupil</b> .
<u>relegate</u>	Assign to a class or kind. They aim to prevent women from being <b>relegate</b> d to a secondary role.
retrench	Make (an employee) redundant. <i>If people are forced to <b>retrench</b> their expenditure trade will suffer.</i>
riffraff	Disparaging terms for the common people.
scholastic	An adherent of scholasticism a schoolman. <i>To distinguish between them is little more than a <b>scholastic</b> exercise.</i>
schoolmaster	A male teacher in a school.
shrinkage	An allowance made for reduction in the takings of a business due to wastage or theft. <i>The material lost 2 inches per yard in shrinkage.</i>
sophomore	Used of the second year in United States high school or college. Freshmen performed better than either <b>sophomore</b> s or juniors.
<u>substrate</u>	An underlying substance or layer. The gardener talked about the proper <b>substrate</b> for acid loving plants.
<u>under</u>	Under water. See <b>under</b> for further discussion.
undergraduate	Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. An <b>undergraduate</b> degree.
understate	Represent as less significant or important. The press have <b>understate</b> d the extent of the problem.
<u>university</u>	The body of faculty and students at a university. I went to <b>university</b> at the Sorbonne.
