## Luckily as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Luckily" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “luckily” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *It is fortunate that.*
- *By good fortune.*

### Synonyms of "Luckily" as an adverb (8 Words)

<b>as luck would have it</b>	To the same degree (often followed by `as.
<b>by good fortune</b>	In reserve; not for immediate use.
<b>by good luck</b>	So as to pass a given point.
<b>fortuitously</b>	By good fortune. <i>My arrival appears to be <b>fortuitously</b> timed.</i>
<b>fortunately</b>	By good fortune. <i><b>Fortunately</b> no shots were fired and no one was hurt.</i>
<b><a href="#">happily</a></b>	In a joyous manner. <i>They shouted <b>happily</b>.</i>
<b>propitiously</b>	In an auspicious manner.
<b>providentially</b>	In a prudent manner.

## Usage Examples of "Luckily" as an adverb

- *Luckily for me it's worked out.*
- *Luckily they didn't recognize me.*

## Associations of "Luckily" (30 Words)

<b>acknowledge</b>	Report the receipt of. <i>She <b>acknowledged</b> that she might have forgotten.</i>
<b>appreciate</b>	Recognize with gratitude; be grateful for. <i>She feels that he does not <b>appreciate</b> her.</i>
<b>appreciative</b>	Having or showing appreciation or a favorable critical judgment or opinion. <i>An <b>appreciative</b> audience.</i>
<b>appreciatively</b>	With appreciation; in a grateful manner. <i>He accepted my offer <b>appreciatively</b>.</i>
<b>cheerfully</b>	In a cheerful way. <i>He was whistling <b>cheerfully</b>.</i>
<b>chortle</b>	Laugh quietly or with restraint. <i>He <b>chortled</b> at his own pun.</i>
<b><u>chuckle</u></b>	A quiet or suppressed laugh. <i>Melissa gave a <b>chuckle</b>.</i>
<b>delighted</b>	Feeling or showing great pleasure. <i>We were <b>delighted</b> to see her.</i>
<b><u>delightful</u></b>	Causing delight; charming. <i>A <b>delightful</b> secluded garden.</i>
<b>fain</b>	Gladly. <i>He was <b>fain</b> to acknowledge that the agreement was sacrosanct.</i>
<b>fortunately</b>	By good fortune. <i><b>Fortunately</b> no shots were fired and no one was hurt.</i>
<b><u>giggle</u></b>	Laugh lightly and repeatedly in a silly way, from amusement, nervousness, or embarrassment. <i>The girls <b>giggled</b> when the rock star came into the classroom.</i>
<b><u>gladly</u></b>	Willingly or eagerly. <i>I would have <b>gladly</b> paid for it.</i>
<b>good</b>	In a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>I m feeling pretty <b>good</b> all things considered.</i>

<b>grateful</b>	Feeling or showing an appreciation for something done or received. <i>The <b>grateful</b> shade.</i>
<b>gratefully</b>	With appreciation; in a grateful manner. <i>Your financial support is <b>gratefully</b> acknowledged.</i>
<b>gratitude</b>	The quality of being thankful; readiness to show appreciation for and to return kindness. <i>She expressed her <b>gratitude</b> to the committee for their support.</i>
<b><u>greet</u></b>	Send greetings to. <i>Sam threw open the door and was <b>greeted</b> by a cacophony of noise.</i>
<b><u>happily</u></b>	In a joyous manner. <i>Eleanor giggled <b>happily</b>.</i>
<b><u>honorable</u></b>	Adhering to ethical and moral principles. <i>Followed the only <b>honorable</b> course of action.</i>
<b>inclined</b>	Leaning or turning away from the vertical or horizontal; sloping. <i>Wasn't <b>inclined</b> to believe the excuse.</i>
<b>laugh</b>	The sound of laughing. <i>Come along it'll be a <b>laugh</b>.</i>
<b>luck</b>	An unknown and unpredictable phenomenon that causes an event to result one way rather than another. <i>I don't like Friday it's bad <b>luck</b>.</i>
<b>nice</b>	Exhibiting courtesy and politeness. <i>A <b>nice</b> bit of craft.</i>
<b>relieved</b>	Extending out above or beyond a surface or boundary. <i><b>Relieved</b> parents who had waited anxiously for news.</i>
<b>smile</b>	Express with a smile. <i>At first fortune <b>smiled</b> on him.</i>
<b>smiling</b>	Smiling with happiness or optimism Lewis Carroll. <i><b>Smiling</b> groves and terraces.</i>
<b><u>thankfully</u></b>	In a thankful manner; with thanks. <i>She <b>thankfully</b> accepted the armchair she was offered.</i>
<b>titter</b>	A short, half-suppressed laugh. <i>Her stutter caused the children to <b>titter</b>.</i>
<b><u>willingly</u></b>	In a willing manner. <i>I <b>willingly</b> accept.</i>
