### Synonyms of "Lucrative" as an adjective (8 Words)

<b>bankable</b>	Acceptable to or at a bank. <i><b>Bankable</b> funds.</i>
<b>cost-effective</b>	Productive relative to the cost.
<b>gainful</b>	Serving to increase wealth or resources; providing money or other benefit. <i>He soon found <b>gainful</b> employment.</i>
<b>moneymaking</b>	Producing a profit, especially with little effort; profitable. <i>A <b>moneymaking</b> business.</i>
<b>paying</b>	Yielding a fair profit. <i>A <b>paying</b> job.</i>
<b>profitable</b>	Beneficial; useful. <i>He d had a <b>profitable</b> day.</i>

**remunerative** Financially rewarding; lucrative.  
*Since June 2003 he has not had any **remunerative** employment.*

**well paid** Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.

## Usage Examples of "Lucrative" as an adjective

- *A lucrative career as a stand-up comedian.*

## Associations of "Lucrative" (30 Words)

**advantageous** Involving or creating favourable circumstances that increase the chances of success or effectiveness; beneficial.  
*We are in an **advantageous** position.*

**affluent** An affluent person a person who is financially well off.  
*The so called emerging **affluents**.*

**alimony** Court-ordered support paid by one spouse to another after they are separated.  
*He is said to have paid 300 000 **alimony** to his first wife.*

**beneficial** Promoting or enhancing well-being.  
*The process was **beneficial** to both supplier and customer.*

**benefit** Derive a benefit from.  
*The areas would **benefit** from regeneration.*

**bough** Any of the larger branches of a tree.  
*Apple **boughs** laden with blossom.*

**business** Business concerns collectively.  
*The tea **business**.*

**cash** Exchange for cash.  
*She was always short of **cash**.*

**earnings** Income derived from an investment or product.  
*Export **earnings**.*

**fecund** Producing or capable of producing an abundance of offspring or new growth; highly fertile.  
*A **fecund** imagination.*

**fertile** Marked by great fruitfulness.  
*Her **fertile** imagination.*

**flourishing** Developing rapidly and successfully; thriving.  
***Flourishing** businesses.*

<b>fruitful</b>	(of a tree, plant, or land) producing much fruit; fertile. <i>Be <b>fruitful</b> and multiply.</i>
<b>gainful</b>	Serving to increase wealth or resources; providing money or other benefit. <i>He soon found <b>gainful</b> employment.</i>
<b>helpful</b>	Useful. <i>People are friendly and <b>helpful</b>.</i>
<b>industrialist</b>	Someone who manages or has significant financial interest in an industrial enterprise. <i>The exploitation of child labour by nineteenth century <b>industrialists</b>.</i>
<b>money</b>	Sums of money. <i>The college is very short of <b>money</b>.</i>
<b>paid</b>	Marked by the reception of pay. <i>A <b>paid</b> check.</i>
<b>pawnbroker</b>	A person who lends money at interest in exchange for personal property that is deposited as security.
<b>paying</b>	For which money is paid. <i>A <b>paying</b> job.</i>
<b>productive</b>	(of a cough) that raises mucus from the respiratory tract. <i>Many suffixes are common and <b>productive</b>.</i>
<b>profit</b>	Make a profit gain money or materially. <i>The only people to <b>profit</b> from the episode were the lawyers.</i>
<b>profitable</b>	Beneficial; useful. <i>He d had a <b>profitable</b> day.</i>
<b>prolific</b>	(of an artist, author, or composer) producing many works. <i>Flying foxes are extremely <b>prolific</b>.</i>
<b>remunerative</b>	Financially rewarding; lucrative. <i>Highly <b>remunerative</b> activities.</i>
<b>reward</b>	Strengthen and support with rewards. <i>The scout was <b>rewarded</b> for courageous action.</i>
<b>rich</b>	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>A <b>rich</b> gas mixture.</i>
<b>sinecure</b>	A benefice to which no spiritual or pastoral duties are attached. <i>Political <b>sinecures</b> for the supporters of ministers.</i>
<b>successful</b>	Having achieved fame, wealth, or social status. <i>A <b>successful</b> actor.</i>
<b>wages</b>	A recompense for worthy acts or retribution for wrongdoing. <i>The <b>wages</b> of sin is death.</i>
