<b><u>beguiling</u></b>	Misleading by means of pleasant or alluring methods. <i>Taken in by <b>beguiling</b> tales of overnight fortunes.</i>
<b>bewitching</b>	Enchanting or delightful. <i>A <b>bewitching</b> debut album.</i>
<b>captivating</b>	Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming. <i>A <b>captivating</b> smile.</i>
<b><u>charismatic</u></b>	Relating to the charismatic movement in the Christian Church. <i>A <b>charismatic</b> leader.</i>
<b><u>charming</u></b>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers. <i><b>Charming</b> incantations.</i>
<b>choice</b>	Appealing to refined taste. <i>He had a few <b>choice</b> words at his command.</i>
<b><u>delectable</u></b>	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>The <b>delectable</b> Ms Davis.</i>
<b>delicious</b>	Delightful. <i>A <b>delicious</b> irony.</i>
<b><u>delightful</u></b>	Causing delight; charming. <i>A <b>delightful</b> surprise.</i>
<b><u>desirable</u></b>	Wished for as being an attractive, useful, or necessary course of action. <i>A <b>desirable</b> outcome.</i>

<b><u>enchanting</u></b>	Delightfully charming or attractive. <i><b>Enchanting</b> views.</i>
<b>engaging</b>	Attracting or delighting. <i>An <b>engaging</b> frankness.</i>
<b>fetching</b>	Very attractive; capturing interest. <i>A <b>fetching</b> little garment of pink satin.</i>
<b>flavourful</b>	(of food or drink) having a full, distinctive taste; full of flavour. <i>A higher temperature results in a darker more <b>flavourful</b> beer.</i>
<b>flavoursome</b>	(of food or drink) having a pleasant, distinct flavour; tasty. <i>An incredibly rich and <b>flavoursome</b> dish.</i>
<b>gorgeous</b>	Beautiful; very attractive. <i><b>Gorgeous</b> colours and exquisite decoration.</i>
<b>handsome</b>	Pleasing in appearance especially by reason of conformity to ideals of form and proportion. <i>He was elected by a <b>handsome</b> majority.</i>
<b><u>irresistible</u></b>	Overpoweringly attractive. <i>She felt an <b>irresistible</b> urge to object.</i>
<b><u>juicy</u></b>	Temptingly appealing. <i><b>Juicy</b> gossip.</i>
<b>lovely</b>	Very pleasant or enjoyable; delightful. <i>How <b>lovely</b> to see you.</i>
<b><u>lush</u></b>	(of vegetation, especially grass) growing luxuriantly. <i>I had some really <b>lush</b> pressies.</i>
<b>mouth-watering</b>	Pleasing to the sense of taste.
<b>nubile</b>	Of girls or women who are eligible to marry. <i>He employed a procession of <b>nubile</b> young secretaries.</i>
<b><u>palatable</u></b>	(of food or drink) pleasant to taste. <i>A device that made increased taxation more <b>palatable</b>.</i>
<b>pleasant-tasting</b>	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste.
<b>prepossessing</b>	Attractive or appealing in appearance. <i>Strong and vigorous and of <b>prepossessing</b> appearance.</i>
<b><u>pretty</u></b>	(used ironically) unexpectedly bad. <i>He led me a <b>pretty</b> dance.</i>
<b><u>ravishing</u></b>	Delightful; entrancing. <i>A <b>ravishing</b> blonde.</i>
<b>red-hot</b>	Newest or most recent.

<b><u>scrumptious</u></b>	(of a person) very attractive. <i>A <b>scrumptious</b> chocolate tart.</i>
<b><u>sensuous</u></b>	Attractive or gratifying physically, especially sexually. <i>The work showed a deliberate disregard of the more <b>sensuous</b> and immediately appealing aspects of painting.</i>
<b>sexually attractive</b>	Having power to arouse interest.
<b><u>striking</u></b>	Sensational in appearance or thrilling in effect. <i>His <b>striking</b> good looks always created a sensation.</i>
<b>stunning</b>	Extremely impressive or attractive. <i>A <b>stunning</b> detonation with volumes of black smoke.</i>
<b><u>succulent</u></b>	(of food) tender, juicy, and tasty. <i><b>Succulent</b> plants with thick fleshy leaves.</i>
<b>sultry</b>	Characterized by oppressive heat and humidity. <i>The summer was <b>sultry</b> and oppressive.</i>
<b><u>sweet</u></b>	With sweetening added. <i><b>Sweet</b> milk.</i>
<b><u>tasty</u></b>	Pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>A <b>tasty</b> deal at the building society.</i>
<b>toothsome</b>	(of a person) good-looking; attractive. <i>A <b>toothsome</b> blonde in a tight dress.</i>
<b><u>voluptuous</u></b>	Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses. <i>Lucullus spent the remainder of his days in <b>voluptuous</b> magnificence.</i>
<b>winning</b>	Gaining, resulting in, or relating to victory in a contest or competition. <i>A <b>winning</b> streak.</i>
<b><u>yummy</u></b>	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>Who s that <b>yummy</b> guy with the black hair.</i>

<b>delicious</b>	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>A <b>delicious</b> irony.</i>
<b>eatable</b>	Fit to be consumed as food. <i>Parcels of <b>eatables</b> and gifts.</i>
<b>flavor</b>	Lend flavor to.
<b>flavorful</b>	Full of flavor.
<b>flavour</b>	A substance used to alter or enhance the taste of food or drink a flavouring. <i>Adding sun dried tomatoes gives the sauce extra <b>flavour</b>.</i>
<b>fragrant</b>	Having a pleasant or sweet smell. <i>She gathered the <b>fragrant</b> blooms.</i>
<b>gastronomy</b>	The art and practice of choosing and preparing and eating good food. <i>New England <b>gastronomy</b>.</i>
<b>insipid</b>	Lacking flavour; weak or tasteless. <i>Many artists continued to churn out <b>insipid</b> shallow works.</i>
<b>meal</b>	The food eaten during a meal. <i>The evening <b>meal</b>.</i>
<b>nip</b>	Sever or remove by pinching or snipping. <i>A keen <b>nip</b> in the air.</i>
<b>palatable</b>	Acceptable to the taste or mind. <i>A device that made increased taxation more <b>palatable</b>.</i>
<b>piquancy</b>	The quality of being pleasantly stimulating or exciting; interest. <i>The tangy soy dip gave them a slightly Asian <b>piquancy</b>.</i>
<b>repast</b>	A meal. <i>A sumptuous <b>repast</b>.</i>
<b>savor</b>	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i><b>Savor</b> the soup.</i>
<b>savory</b>	Dwarf aromatic shrub of Mediterranean regions. <i>A past that was scarcely <b>savory</b>.</i>
<b>savour</b>	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>Their genuflections <b>savoured</b> of superstition and popery.</i>

- spicy** Exciting or entertaining, especially through being mildly indecent.  
*Pasta in a **spicy** tomato sauce.*
- sweet** Having a sweet nature befitting an angel or cherub.  
*A **sweet** shop.*
- tang** A characteristic quality.  
*His words came out with a distinct **tang** of broad Lancashire.*
- taste** Have a distinctive or characteristic taste.  
*This pudding is too sweet for my **taste**.*
- tasty** (of food) having a pleasant, distinct flavour.  
*A **tasty** young lady.*
- zesty** Marked by spirited enjoyment.
