A **toothsome** blonde in a tight dress.


**vigorous** Characterized by forceful and energetic action or activity.

**jungle** A situation or place of bewildering complexity or brutal competitiveness.

A field covered with grass or herbage and suitable for grazing by livestock.

logging

The work of cutting down trees for timber.

**Logging** companies.

luxuriate Enjoy (something) as a luxury; take self-indulgent delight in.

She was luxuriating in a long bath.

**meadow** A piece of low ground near a river.

A pleasant campsite in a **meadow** complete with sparkling stream.

**nonporous** Not porous; especially not having vessels that appear as pores.

Put animals to graze in a pasture.

Many a horse was put out to **pasture** there.

**prairie** A treeless grassy plain.

rainforest A forest with heavy annual rainfall.

Tracts of **rainforest**.

(of a plant) having a lush and unchecked growth.

rampant Rampant sex.

**savanna** A flat grassland in tropical or subtropical regions.

Relating to or characteristic of the regions adjacent to or bordering on the

subtropical tropics.

North Island enjoys a **subtropical** climate.

Overwhelm or flood with water.

The country was **swamp**ed with goods from abroad.

timber

Used to warn that a tree is about to fall after being cut.

Contracts to cut **timber**.

verdant Of the bright green colour of lush grass.

**verdant Verdant** valleys.

wetland Land consisting of marshes or swamps; saturated land.

The draining of British **wetland**s.

woodland Land covered with trees.

Large areas of ancient woodland.
