gilded	Based on pretense; deceptively pleasing. An elegant gilded birdcage.
grand	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks. She was such a grand lady.
hedonistic	Devoted to pleasure. A hedonistic existence of booze drugs and parties.
immoderate	Not sensible or restrained; excessive. <i>Immoderate laughter</i> .
<u>lavish</u>	Very generous. The critics were lavish in their praise.
<u>lush</u>	Sexually attractive. <i>Lush</i> orchestrations.
luxuriant	Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses. She tossed her luxuriant dark hair.
magnificent	Extremely beautiful, elaborate, or impressive. She paid tribute to their magnificent efforts.
<u>opulent</u>	Wealthy. The opulent comfort of a limousine.
<u>ornate</u>	Marked by elaborate rhetoric and elaborated with decorative details. <i>An ornate</i> wrought iron railing.
palatial	Resembling a palace in being spacious and splendid. A palatial yacht.
princely	Relating to a prince. The princely states of India.
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. These comments are a bit rich coming from a woman with no money worries.
self-indulgent	Indulgent of your own appetites and desires- Havelock Ellis.
sensual	Sexually exciting or gratifying. The production of the ballet is sensual and passionate.



splendid	Having great beauty and splendor. The splendid coronation ceremony.
<u>stylish</u>	Having elegance or taste or refinement in manners or dress. A stylish cocktail bar.
<u>sumptuous</u>	Ostentatiously rich and superior in quality. The banquet was a sumptuous luxurious meal.
sybaritic	Fond of sensuous luxury or pleasure; self-indulgent. Their opulent and sybaritic lifestyle.
voluptuary	Concerned with or characterized by luxury and sensual pleasure. A voluptuary decade when high living was in style.
<u>voluptuous</u>	Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses. <i>A voluptuous woman.</i>

well appointed In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

languor	A relaxed comfortable feeling. Her whole being was pervaded by a dreamy languor .
languorous	Lacking spirit or liveliness. The atmosphere is languorous and sultry.
<u>lavish</u>	Very generous. The critics were lavish in their praise.
luxuriant	(of hair) thick and healthy. Forests of dark luxuriant foliage.
luxury	Luxurious or of the nature of a luxury. <i>Luxury</i> goods.
<u>opulent</u>	Wealthy. His more opulent tenants.
<u>ornate</u>	(of literary style) using unusual words and complex constructions. Ornate rhetoric taught out of the rule of Plato.
<u>ostentatious</u>	(of a display) tawdry or vulgar. A simple design that is glamorous without being ostentatious .
palatial	Resembling a palace in being spacious and splendid. <i>Her palatial apartment in Mayfair.</i>
plenitude	A full supply. An ancient Celtic god thought to bring a plenitude of wealth or food.
plenteous	Affording an abundant supply. The meal was astonishingly plenteous .
plentiful	Existing in great number or quantity. A plentiful year.
plentitude	A full supply.
<u>plenty</u>	A full supply. There was plenty of food for everyone.
profusion	An abundance or large quantity of something. The beautiful pink foxgloves growing in profusion among the ferns.
prosper	Succeed in material terms; be financially successful. God has wonderfully prosper ed this nation.



prosperity	The state of being prosperous. A long period of peace and prosperity .
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>Rich</i> seams of coal.
richness	The property of a sensation that is rich and pleasing. Tropical gardens with an enormous richness of flora and fauna.
<u>sumptuous</u>	Splendid and expensive-looking. The banquet was a sumptuous luxurious meal.
sybarite	A person who is self-indulgent in their fondness for sensuous luxury.
voluptuary	Concerned with or characterized by luxury and sensual pleasure. A voluptuary decade when high living was in style.
