<u>appalling</u>	Causing shock or dismay; horrific. <i>Appalling</i> conditions.
black	Of a ski run of the highest level of difficulty as indicated by black markers positioned along it. A <b>black</b> moonless night.
<u>dreadful</u>	Used to emphasize the degree to which something is the case, especially something regarded with sadness or disapproval. <i>I feel dreadful I hate myself.</i>
fearsome	Causing fear or dread or terror. The cat mewed displaying a <b>fearsome</b> set of teeth.
<u>frightening</u>	Making someone afraid or anxious; terrifying. A <b>frightening</b> experience.
frightful	Very unpleasant, serious, or shocking. In a <b>frightful</b> hurry.



<u>ghastly</u>	Shockingly repellent; inspiring horror. She had sobered up but she felt <b>ghastly</b> .
<u>gory</u>	Involving or showing violence and bloodshed. A <b>gory</b> dagger.
<u>grim</u>	(of humour) lacking genuine levity; black. A <b>grim</b> man loving duty more than humanity.
grisly	Causing horror or disgust. The town was shaken by a series of <b>grisly</b> crimes.
<u>grotesque</u>	Distorted and unnatural in shape or size; abnormal and hideous. A <b>grotesque</b> reflection in the mirror.
<u>gruesome</u>	Shockingly repellent; inspiring horror. <i>Gruesome</i> evidence of human sacrifice.
hideous	Grossly offensive to decency or morality; causing horror. <i>Hideous lizard like creatures.</i>
horrendous	Causing fear or dread or terror. She suffered <b>horrendous</b> injuries.
horrible	Provoking horror. The tea tasted <b>horrible</b> .
horrid	Grossly offensive to decency or morality; causing horror. A <b>horrid</b> beard.
<u>horrific</u>	Causing horror. <i>Horrific</i> injuries.
<u>horrifying</u>	Provoking horror. A <b>horrifying</b> incident.
loathsome	Causing or able to cause nausea. This <b>loathsome</b> little swine.
lurid	Unpleasantly bright in colour, especially so as to create a harsh or unnatural effect. <i>Lurid crimes.</i>
<u>morbid</u>	Characterized by an abnormal and unhealthy interest in disturbing and unpleasant subjects, especially death and disease. <i>Morbid details.</i>
repugnant	Offensive to the mind. Morally <b>repugnant</b> customs.
repulsive	Offensive to the mind. A <b>repulsive</b> force.



<u>shocking</u>	Causing indignation or disgust; offensive. She brought <b>shocking</b> news.
sick	Affected by physical or mental illness. The British economy remains <b>sick</b> .
<u>sickening</u>	Causing or liable to cause a feeling of nausea or disgust. A <b>sickening</b> stench of blood.
terrifying	Causing extreme fear. A <b>terrifying</b> wail.
unearthly	Suggesting the operation of supernatural influences- John Galsworthy. <i>Unearthly quiet.</i>
<u>unhealthy</u>	Not conducive to good health. <b>Unhealthy</b> ulcers.
weird	Very strange; bizarre. The three <b>weird</b> sisters.

<u>alarming</u>	Frightening because of an awareness of danger. <i>Our countryside is disappearing at an alarming rate.</i>
<u>appalling</u>	Causing shock or dismay; horrific. <i>Appalling</i> conditions.
<u>astounding</u>	Surprisingly impressive or notable. The summit offers <b>astounding</b> views.
<u>atrocious</u>	Of a very poor quality; extremely bad or unpleasant. <i>Atrocious</i> weather.
<u>deformed</u>	So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly. <b>Deformed</b> thalidomide babies.



Extremely evil or cruel; expressive of cruelty or befitting hell. <b>Diabolical</b> sorcerers under the influence of devils.
Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust. A <b>disgusting</b> smell.

monstrosity	A thing, especially a building, which is very large and unsightly. The shopping centre a multi storey <b>monstrosity</b> of raw concrete.
scary	Frightening; causing fear. A <b>scary</b> movie.
sepulchral	Relating to a tomb or interment. Hollow <b>sepulchral</b> tones.
<u>spooky</u>	Unpredictably excitable (especially of horses. Some horses are more <b>spooky</b> by nature than others.
terrible	Causing or likely to cause terror; sinister. I was <b>terrible</b> at basketball.
unlovely	Not attractive; ugly. <b>Unlovely</b> tower blocks.
unsightly	Unpleasant to look at. An <b>unsightly</b> rubbish tip.
