Synonyms of "Macabre" as an adjective (30 Words)

<u>appalling</u>	Causing shock or dismay; horrific. <i>Appalling conditions.</i>
black	Of a ski run of the highest level of difficulty as indicated by black markers positioned along it. <i>A black moonless night.</i>
<u>dreadful</u>	Used to emphasize the degree to which something is the case, especially something regarded with sadness or disapproval. <i>I feel dreadful I hate myself.</i>
fearsome	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i>The cat mewed displaying a fearsome set of teeth.</i>
<u>frightening</u>	Making someone afraid or anxious; terrifying. <i>A frightening experience.</i>
frightful	Very unpleasant, serious, or shocking. <i>In a frightful hurry.</i>

<u>ghastly</u>	Shockingly repellent; inspiring horror. <i>She had sobered up but she felt ghastly.</i>
<u>gory</u>	Involving or showing violence and bloodshed. <i>A gory dagger.</i>
<u>grim</u>	(of humour) lacking genuine levity; black. <i>A grim man loving duty more than humanity.</i>
grisly	Causing horror or disgust. <i>The town was shaken by a series of grisly crimes.</i>
<u>grotesque</u>	Distorted and unnatural in shape or size; abnormal and hideous. <i>A grotesque reflection in the mirror.</i>
<u>gruesome</u>	Shockingly repellent; inspiring horror. <i>Gruesome evidence of human sacrifice.</i>
hideous	Grossly offensive to decency or morality; causing horror. <i>Hideous lizard like creatures.</i>
<u>horrendous</u>	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i>She suffered horrendous injuries.</i>
horrible	Provoking horror. <i>The tea tasted horrible.</i>
horrid	Grossly offensive to decency or morality; causing horror. <i>A horrid beard.</i>
<u>horrific</u>	Causing horror. <i>Horrific injuries.</i>
<u>horrifying</u>	Provoking horror. <i>A horrifying incident.</i>
loathsome	Causing or able to cause nausea. <i>This loathsome little swine.</i>
lurid	Unpleasantly bright in colour, especially so as to create a harsh or unnatural effect. <i>Lurid crimes.</i>
<u>morbid</u>	Characterized by an abnormal and unhealthy interest in disturbing and unpleasant subjects, especially death and disease. <i>Morbid details.</i>
repugnant	Offensive to the mind. <i>Morally repugnant customs.</i>
repulsive	Offensive to the mind. <i>A repulsive force.</i>

shocking

Causing indignation or disgust; offensive.
*She brought **shocking** news.*

sick

Affected by physical or mental illness.
*The British economy remains **sick**.*

sickening

Causing or liable to cause a feeling of nausea or disgust.
*A **sickening** stench of blood.*

terrifying

Causing extreme fear.
*A **terrifying** wail.*

unearthly

Suggesting the operation of supernatural influences- John Galsworthy.
***Unearthly** quiet.*

unhealthy

Not conducive to good health.
***Unhealthy** ulcers.*

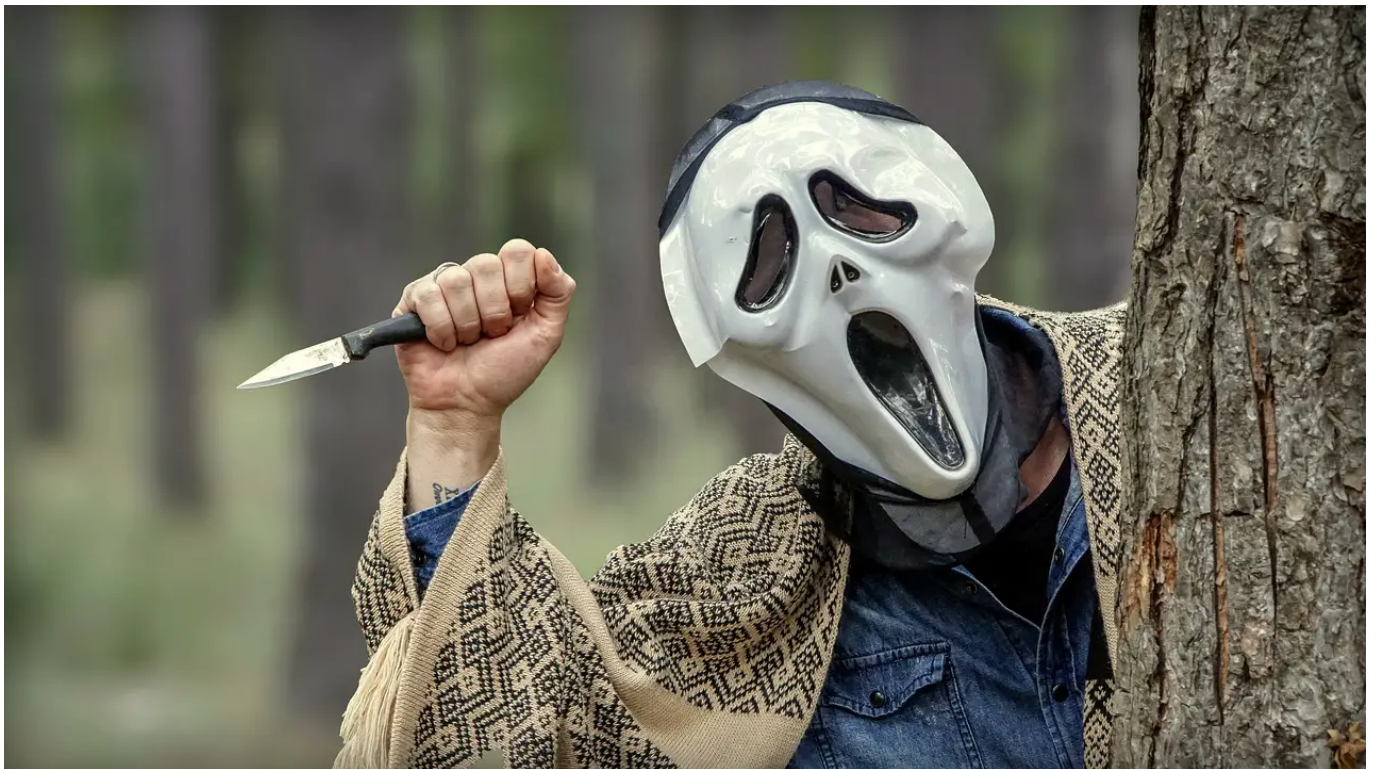
weird

Very strange; bizarre.
*The three **weird** sisters.*



Usage Examples of "Macabre" as an adjective

- *Macabre tortures conceived by madmen.*
- *A macabre series of murders.*
- *Macabre tales of war and plague in the Middle ages.*



Associations of "Macabre" (30 Words)

<u>alarming</u>	Frightening because of an awareness of danger. <i>Our countryside is disappearing at an alarming rate.</i>
<u>appalling</u>	Causing shock or dismay; horrific. <i>Appalling conditions.</i>
<u>astounding</u>	Surprisingly impressive or notable. <i>The summit offers astounding views.</i>
<u>atrocious</u>	Of a very poor quality; extremely bad or unpleasant. <i>Atrocious weather.</i>
<u>deformed</u>	So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly. <i>Deformed thalidomide babies.</i>

<u>diabolical</u>	Extremely evil or cruel; expressive of cruelty or befitting hell. <i>Diabolical sorcerers under the influence of devils.</i>
disgusting	Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust. <i>A disgusting smell.</i>
<u>dreadful</u>	Causing or involving great suffering, fear, or unhappiness; extremely bad or serious. <i>Don't go out the weather is dreadful.</i>
fearsome	Frightening, especially in appearance. <i>The cat mewed displaying a fearsome set of teeth.</i>
<u>frightening</u>	The act of inspiring with fear. <i>A frightening experience.</i>
frightful	Provoking horror- Winston Churchill. <i>A frightful mistake.</i>
<u>frustration</u>	The feeling of being upset or annoyed as a result of being unable to change or achieve something. <i>The inherent frustrations of assembly line work.</i>
<u>ghastly</u>	Shockingly repellent; inspiring horror. <i>She had sobered up but she felt ghastly.</i>
grisly	Causing horror or disgust. <i>A grisly murder.</i>
<u>gruesome</u>	Shockingly repellent; inspiring horror. <i>Gruesome evidence of human sacrifice.</i>
<u>hellish</u>	Of or like hell. <i>It was hellish expensive.</i>
hideous	So extremely ugly as to be terrifying. <i>A hideous scar.</i>
horrible	Causing or likely to cause horror; shocking. <i>A horrible massacre.</i>
<u>horrific</u>	Causing horror. <i>Horrific injuries.</i>
<u>horrifying</u>	Provoking horror. <i>A horrifying incident.</i>
infernal	Of or pertaining to or characteristic of a very uncontrolled and intense fire. <i>You're an infernal nuisance.</i>
monster	An imaginary creature usually having various human and animal parts. <i>A world of fable inhabited by other worldly monsters.</i>

monstrosity A thing, especially a building, which is very large and unsightly.
*The shopping centre a multi storey **monstrosity** of raw concrete.*

scary Frightening; causing fear.
*A **scary** movie.*

sepulchral Relating to a tomb or interment.
*Hollow **sepulchral** tones.*

spooky Unpredictably excitable (especially of horses).
*Some horses are more **spooky** by nature than others.*

terrible Causing or likely to cause terror; sinister.
*I was **terrible** at basketball.*

unlovely Not attractive; ugly.
***Unlovely** tower blocks.*

unsightly Unpleasant to look at.
*An **unsightly** rubbish tip.*
