artificial	Artificially formal. <i>That artificial humility that her husband hated.</i>
build	Commission finance and oversee the building of something. <i>The government is building new schools in this state.</i>
compel	Force somebody to do something. <i>We compel all students to fill out this form.</i>
compulsion	The action or state of forcing or being forced to do something; constraint. <i>Her compulsion to wash her hands repeatedly.</i>
concoct	Make a concoction of by mixing. <i>His cronies concocted a simple plan.</i>
constrain	Severely restrict the scope, extent, or activity of. <i>Children are constrained to work in the way the book dictates.</i>
construct	A group of words forming a phrase. <i>Some eccentric constructed an electric brassiere warmer.</i>
create	Create or manufacture a man made product. <i>Callas created only one role and that was Eurydice.</i>
creativity	The ability to create. The use of imagination or original ideas to create something; inventiveness. <i>Firms are keen to encourage creativity.</i>
fabricate	Construct or manufacture (an industrial product), especially from prepared components. <i>Officers fabricated evidence.</i>
fabrication	A deliberately false or improbable account. <i>The synthesis and fabrication of single crystals.</i>
factory	An establishment for traders carrying on business in a foreign country. <i>Factory workers.</i>

fancied	Formed or conceived by the imagination. <i>A fancied wrong.</i>
fecundity	The intellectual productivity of a creative imagination. <i>Age related decline in female fecundity.</i>
figment	A contrived or fantastic idea. <i>A figment of the imagination.</i>
<u>forge</u>	A furnace for melting or refining metal. <i>The signature on the cheque was forged.</i>
found	Of art comprising or making use of found objects. <i>The ship was well found and seaworthy.</i>
generate	Produce (a sentence or other unit, especially a well-formed one) by the application of a finite set of rules to lexical or other linguistic input. <i>The new manager generated a lot of problems.</i>
<u>imagination</u>	The ability to deal resourcefully with unusual problems. <i>Popular imagination created a world of demons.</i>
<u>invent</u>	Come up with (an idea, plan, explanation, theory, or principle) after a mental effort. <i>He invented an improved form of the steam engine.</i>
<u>invention</u>	Something fabricated or made up. <i>His powers of invention were rather limited.</i>
<u>inventive</u>	(used of persons or artifacts) marked by independence and creativity in thought or action. <i>A courageous and inventive piece of film making.</i>
<u>inventor</u>	Someone who is the first to think of or make something.
manufacture	Manufactured articles. <i>He manufactured a popular cereal.</i>
manufacturing	The making of articles on a large scale using machinery; industrial production. <i>Manufacturing is vital to Great Britain.</i>
prevarication	The deliberate act of deviating from the truth.
produce	Administer the financial and managerial aspects of (a film or broadcast) or the staging of (a play, opera, etc). <i>Produce a movie.</i>
productive	Producing or able to produce large amounts of goods, crops, or other commodities. <i>The hotel was not productive of amusing company.</i>
