<a href="#">artificial</a>	Artificially formal. <i>That <b>artificial</b> humility that her husband hated.</i>
<b>build</b>	Commission finance and oversee the building of something. <i>The government is <b>building</b> new schools in this state.</i>
<b>compel</b>	Force somebody to do something. <i>We <b>compel</b> all students to fill out this form.</i>
<a href="#">compulsion</a>	The action or state of forcing or being forced to do something; constraint. <i>Her <b>compulsion</b> to wash her hands repeatedly.</i>
<a href="#">concoct</a>	Make a concoction of by mixing. <i>His cronies <b>concocted</b> a simple plan.</i>
<b>constrain</b>	Severely restrict the scope, extent, or activity of. <i>Children are <b>constrained</b> to work in the way the book dictates.</i>
<b>construct</b>	A group of words forming a phrase. <i>Some eccentric <b>constructed</b> an electric brassiere warmer.</i>
<b>create</b>	Create or manufacture a man made product. <i>Callas <b>created</b> only one role and that was Eurydice.</i>
<b>creativity</b>	The ability to create. The use of imagination or original ideas to create something; inventiveness. <i>Firms are keen to encourage <b>creativity</b>.</i>
<b>fabricate</b>	Construct or manufacture (an industrial product), especially from prepared components. <i>Officers <b>fabricated</b> evidence.</i>
<b>fabrication</b>	A deliberately false or improbable account. <i>The synthesis and <b>fabrication</b> of single crystals.</i>
<a href="#">factory</a>	An establishment for traders carrying on business in a foreign country. <i><b>Factory</b> workers.</i>

<b>fancied</b>	Formed or conceived by the imagination. <i>A <b>fancied</b> wrong.</i>
<b>fecundity</b>	The intellectual productivity of a creative imagination. <i>Age related decline in female <b>fecundity</b>.</i>
<b>figment</b>	A contrived or fantastic idea. <i>A <b>figment</b> of the imagination.</i>
<b><u>forge</u></b>	A furnace for melting or refining metal. <i>The signature on the cheque was <b>forged</b>.</i>
<b>found</b>	Of art comprising or making use of found objects. <i>The ship was well <b>found</b> and seaworthy.</i>
<b>generate</b>	Produce (a sentence or other unit, especially a well-formed one) by the application of a finite set of rules to lexical or other linguistic input. <i>The new manager <b>generated</b> a lot of problems.</i>
<b><u>imagination</u></b>	The ability to deal resourcefully with unusual problems. <i>Popular <b>imagination</b> created a world of demons.</i>
<b><u>invent</u></b>	Come up with (an idea, plan, explanation, theory, or principle) after a mental effort. <i>He <b>invented</b> an improved form of the steam engine.</i>
<b><u>invention</u></b>	Something fabricated or made up. <i>His powers of <b>invention</b> were rather limited.</i>
<b><u>inventive</u></b>	(used of persons or artifacts) marked by independence and creativity in thought or action. <i>A courageous and <b>inventive</b> piece of film making.</i>
<b><u>inventor</u></b>	Someone who is the first to think of or make something.
<b>manufacture</b>	Manufactured articles. <i>He <b>manufactured</b> a popular cereal.</i>
<b>manufacturing</b>	The making of articles on a large scale using machinery; industrial production. <i><b>Manufacturing</b> is vital to Great Britain.</i>
<b>prevarication</b>	The deliberate act of deviating from the truth.
<b>produce</b>	Administer the financial and managerial aspects of (a film or broadcast) or the staging of (a play, opera, etc). <i><b>Produce</b> a movie.</i>
<b>productive</b>	Producing or able to produce large amounts of goods, crops, or other commodities. <i>The hotel was not <b>productive</b> of amusing company.</i>
