## Associations of "Made up of" (30 Words)

<b>ascend</b>	Go back in order of genealogical succession. <i>Inheritance may not <b>ascend</b> linearly.</i>
<b>ascending</b>	Sloping or leading upwards. <i>Blood pressure in the <b>ascending</b> aorta.</i>
<b>ascent</b>	An upward slope or path that one may walk or climb. <i>The first balloon <b>ascent</b> was in 1783.</i>
<b>boost</b>	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>A range of measures to <b>boost</b> tourism.</i>
<a href="#"><u>climb</u></a>	An ascent especially of a mountain or hill by climbing. <i>The air became colder as they <b>climbed</b> higher.</i>
<a href="#"><u>climbing</u></a>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>His other great interest was <b>climbing</b> especially in the Alps.</i>
<b>construct</b>	Form (an idea or theory) by bringing together various conceptual elements. <i><b>Construct</b> a proof.</i>
<b>create</b>	Create or manufacture a man made product. <i>Over 170 jobs were <b>created</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>elevate</u></a>	Give a promotion to or assign to a higher position. <i>He has <b>elevated</b> bad taste into an art form.</i>
<b>elevator</b>	A platform or compartment housed in a shaft for raising and lowering people or things to different levels; a lift. <i>First you trim the rudder then the ailerons and finally the <b>elevator</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>ennoble</u></a>	Confer dignity or honor upon. <i>They receive life baronies on appointment unless they are already <b>ennobled</b>.</i>
<b>escalator</b>	A stairway whose steps move continuously on a circulating belt.
<b>exalt</b>	Praise, glorify, or honor. <i>The party will continue to <b>exalt</b> their hero.</i>

<b>forge</b>	A furnace for melting or refining metal. <i>The signature on the cheque was <b>forged</b>.</i>
<b>heave</b>	The act of lifting something with great effort. <i>His shoulders <b>heaved</b> as he panted.</i>
<b>hoist</b>	Raise. <i>She <b>hoisted</b> her backpack on to her shoulder.</i>
<b>lift</b>	Lifting device consisting of a platform or cage that is raised and lowered mechanically in a vertical shaft in order to move people from one floor to another in a building. <i>A helicopter <b>lifted</b> 11 crew to safety from the ship.</i>
<b>mounting</b>	The action of mounting something. <i>The <b>mounting</b> of rapid fire guns.</i>
<b>precipitate</b>	A precipitated solid substance in suspension or after settling or filtering. <i>A <b>precipitate</b> decline in Labour fortunes.</i>
<b>raise</b>	Multiply a number by itself a specified number of times 8 is 2 raised to the power 3. <i>The need to <b>raise</b> the quality of education.</i>
<b>rise</b>	Rise up. <i>He didn't <b>rise</b> to my teasing.</i>
<b>risen</b>	Above the horizon. <i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>
<b>rising</b>	A movement upward. <i>The <b>rising</b> fives on the verge of school.</i>
<b>soar</b>	Go or move upward. <i>The stock market <b>soared</b> after the cease fire was announced.</i>
<b>stairs</b>	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
<b>underpin</b>	Support, justify, or form the basis for. <i>The theme of honour <b>underpinning</b> the two books.</i>
<b>uphill</b>	Sloping upward. <i>The journey is slightly <b>uphill</b>.</i>
<b>upstairs</b>	An upper floor. <i>They lived <b>upstairs</b>.</i>
<b>upward</b>	Extending or moving toward a higher place. <i>A general <b>upward</b> movement of fish.</i>
<b>vertically</b>	At right angles to a horizontal plane; aligned in such a way that the top is directly above the bottom. <i><b>Vertically</b> integrated companies.</i>
