## Associations of "Made up" (30 Words)

<b>ascend</b>	(of a road or flight of steps) slope or lead up. <i>The path <b>ascended</b> to the top of the hill.</i>
<b>ascending</b>	Moving or going or growing upward. <i>A gently <b>ascending</b> forest path.</i>
<b>ascent</b>	An upward slope or grade (as in a road). <i>The first balloon <b>ascent</b> was in 1783.</i>
<b>boost</b>	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>The tax cut will <b>boost</b> the economy.</i>
<a href="#">climb</a>	The act of climbing something. <i>We decided to <b>climb</b> to 6 000 feet.</i>
<a href="#">climbing</a>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i><b>Climbing</b> equipment.</i>
<b>construct</b>	Build or make (something, typically a building, road, or machine). <i>Poetics should <b>construct</b> a theory of literary discourse.</i>
<b>create</b>	Create by artistic means. <i>The company was <b>created</b> 25 years ago.</i>
<a href="#">elevate</a>	Raise from a lower to a higher position. <i>The exercise will naturally <b>elevate</b> your chest and head.</i>
<b>elevator</b>	A shoe with a raised insole designed to make the wearer appear taller. <i>Something in his gait made me sure he was wearing <b>elevator</b> shoes.</i>
<a href="#">ennoble</a>	Confer dignity or honor upon. <i>They receive life baronies on appointment unless they are already <b>ennobled</b>.</i>
<b>escalator</b>	A stairway whose steps move continuously on a circulating belt.
<b>exalt</b>	Raise to a higher rank or position. <i>The party will continue to <b>exalt</b> their hero.</i>
<a href="#">forge</a>	Move ahead steadily. <i>He <b>forged</b> a great suit of black armour.</i>

<b>heave</b>	A horizontal dislocation. <i>She <b>heaved</b> a deep sigh when she saw the list of things to do.</i>
<b>hoist</b>	A group of flags raised as a signal. <i><b>Hoist</b> the bicycle onto the roof of the car.</i>
<b>lift</b>	A wave that lifts the surface of the water or ground. <i>He responded with a <b>lift</b> of his eyebrow.</i>
<b>mounting</b>	The action of mounting something. <i>The <b>mounting</b> of rapid fire guns.</i>
<b>precipitate</b>	A substance precipitated from a solution. <i>I must apologize for my staff their actions were <b>precipitate</b>.</i>
<b>raise</b>	Raise in rank or condition. <i><b>Raise</b> a smile.</i>
<b>rise</b>	Rise up. <i><b>Rise</b> to the occasion.</i>
<b>risen</b>	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>
<b>rising</b>	(of a bird) depicted with the wings open but not fully displayed, as if preparing for flight. <i>The <b>rising</b> generation.</i>
<b>soar</b>	The act of rising upward into the air. <i>The dollar <b>soared</b> against the yen.</i>
<b>stairs</b>	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
<b>underpin</b>	Support (a building or other structure) from below by laying a solid foundation below ground level or by substituting stronger for weaker materials. <i>The theme of honour <b>underpinning</b> the two books.</i>
<b>uphill</b>	Towards the top of a hill or slope. <i>An <b>uphill</b> struggle to gain worldwide recognition.</i>
<b>upstairs</b>	On or of upper floors of a building. <i>The <b>upstairs</b> maid.</i>
<b>upward</b>	Directed up. <i>The cards were face <b>upward</b>.</i>
<b>vertically</b>	(with reference to passage of diseases) from one generation to the next. <i><b>Vertically</b> stacked books.</i>
