ascend	(of a road or flight of steps) slope or lead up. The path <b>ascend</b> ed to the top of the hill.

ascent	An upward slope or grade (as in a road. <i>The first balloon <b>ascent</b> was in 1783.</i>
boost	Give a boost to be beneficial to. The tax cut will <b>boost</b> the economy.
<u>climb</u>	The act of climbing something. We decided to <b>climb</b> to 6 000 feet.
<u>climbing</u>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>Climbing</i> equipment.
construct	Build or make (something, typically a building, road, or machine. Poetics should <b>construct</b> a theory of literary discourse.
create	Create by artistic means. <i>The company was <b>create</b>d 25 years ago.</i>
<u>elevate</u>	Raise from a lower to a higher position. The exercise will naturally <b>elevate</b> your chest and head.
elevator	A shoe with a raised insole designed to make the wearer appear taller. Something in his gait made me sure he was wearing <b>elevator</b> shoes.
<u>ennoble</u>	Confer dignity or honor upon. They receive life baronies on appointment unless they are already <b>ennoble</b> d.
escalator	A stairway whose steps move continuously on a circulating belt.
exalt	Raise to a higher rank or position. The party will continue to <b>exalt</b> their hero.
<u>forge</u>	Move ahead steadily. He <b>forge</b> d a great suit of black armour.



heave	A horizontal dislocation. She <b>heave</b> d a deep sigh when she saw the list of things to do.
<u>hoist</u>	A group of flags raised as a signal. <i>Hoist</i> the bicycle onto the roof of the car.
lift	A wave that lifts the surface of the water or ground. <i>He responded with a <b>lift</b> of his eyebrow.</i>
mounting	The action of mounting something. The <b>mounting</b> of rapid fire guns.
<u>precipitate</u>	A substance precipitated from a solution. I must apologize for my staff their actions were <b>precipitate</b> .
raise	Raise in rank or condition. <b>Raise</b> a smile.
rise	Rise up. <i>Rise</i> to the occasion.
risen	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>
rising	(of a bird) depicted with the wings open but not fully displayed, as if preparing for flight. The <b>rising</b> generation.
<u>soar</u>	The act of rising upward into the air. The dollar <b>soar</b> ed against the yen.
stairs	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
<u>underpin</u>	Support (a building or other structure) from below by laying a solid foundation below ground level or by substituting stronger for weaker materials. <i>The theme of honour <b>underpin</b>ning the two books.</i>
uphill	Towards the top of a hill or slope. An <b>uphill</b> struggle to gain worldwide recognition.
upstairs	On or of upper floors of a building. <i>The <b>upstairs</b> maid</i> .
upward	Directed up. The cards were face <b>upward</b> .
vertically	(with reference to passage of diseases) from one generation to the next. <i>Vertically stacked books</i> .
