| ascend | (of a road or flight of steps) slope or lead up. <i>The path ascended to the top of the hill.</i> |
| ascending | Moving or going or growing upward. <i>A gently ascending forest path.</i> |
| ascent | An upward slope or grade (as in a road). <i>The first balloon ascent was in 1783.</i> |
| boost | Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>The tax cut will boost the economy.</i> |
| climb | The act of climbing something. <i>We decided to climb to 6 000 feet.</i> |
| climbing | The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>Climbing equipment.</i> |
| construct | Build or make (something, typically a building, road, or machine). <i>Poetics should construct a theory of literary discourse.</i> |
| create | Create by artistic means. <i>The company was created 25 years ago.</i> |
| elevate | Raise from a lower to a higher position. <i>The exercise will naturally elevate your chest and head.</i> |
| elevator | A shoe with a raised insole designed to make the wearer appear taller. <i>Something in his gait made me sure he was wearing elevator shoes.</i> |
| ennoble | Confer dignity or honor upon. <i>They receive life baronies on appointment unless they are already ennobled.</i> |
| escalator | A stairway whose steps move continuously on a circulating belt. |
| exalt | Raise to a higher rank or position. <i>The party will continue to exalt their hero.</i> |
| forge | Move ahead steadily. <i>He forged a great suit of black armour.</i> |

| heave | A horizontal dislocation. <i>She heaved a deep sigh when she saw the list of things to do.</i> |
| hoist | A group of flags raised as a signal. <i>Hoist the bicycle onto the roof of the car.</i> |
| lift | A wave that lifts the surface of the water or ground. <i>He responded with a lift of his eyebrow.</i> |
| mounting | The action of mounting something. <i>The mounting of rapid fire guns.</i> |
| precipitate | A substance precipitated from a solution. <i>I must apologize for my staff their actions were precipitate.</i> |
| raise | Raise in rank or condition. <i>Raise a smile.</i> |
| rise | Rise up. <i>Rise to the occasion.</i> |
| risen | (of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i> |
| rising | (of a bird) depicted with the wings open but not fully displayed, as if preparing for flight. <i>The rising generation.</i> |
| soar | The act of rising upward into the air. <i>The dollar soared against the yen.</i> |
| stairs | A flight of stairs or a flight of steps. |
| underpin | Support (a building or other structure) from below by laying a solid foundation below ground level or by substituting stronger for weaker materials. <i>The theme of honour underpinning the two books.</i> |
| uphill | Towards the top of a hill or slope. <i>An uphill struggle to gain worldwide recognition.</i> |
| upstairs | On or of upper floors of a building. <i>The upstairs maid.</i> |
| upward | Directed up. <i>The cards were face upward.</i> |
| vertically | (with reference to passage of diseases) from one generation to the next. <i>Vertically stacked books.</i> |
