<b>bewitching</b>	Enchanting or delightful. <i><b>Bewitching</b> smile.</i>
<b><u>brehtaking</u></b>	Tending to cause suspension of regular breathing. <i>The scene was one of <b>brehtaking</b> beauty.</i>
<b>cabbalistic</b>	Relating to or associated with mystical interpretation or esoteric doctrine.
<b>captivating</b>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>Roosevelt was a <b>captivating</b> speaker.</i>
<b><u>charming</u></b>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers. <i>Endowed with <b>charming</b> manners.</i>
<b><u>cryptic</u></b>	Of an obscure nature. <i>A <b>cryptic</b> note.</i>
<b>dark</b>	Used of color having a dark hue. <i>A <b>dark</b> day.</i>
<b><u>delightful</u></b>	Causing delight; charming. <i>A <b>delightful</b> secluded garden.</i>
<b><u>enchancing</u></b>	Delightfully charming or attractive. <i>Dinah looked <b>enchancing</b>.</i>
<b>engaging</b>	Attracting or delighting. <i>An <b>engaging</b> frankness.</i>
<b>enthralling</b>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>An <b>enthralling</b> book.</i>
<b><u>entrancing</u></b>	Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming. <i>An <b>entrancing</b> smile.</i>
<b>exceptional</b>	Unusual; not typical. <i>A child of <b>exceptional</b> ability.</i>
<b>extraordinary</b>	Unusually great. <i>Young children need <b>extraordinary</b> amounts of attention.</i>
<b><u>fascinating</u></b>	Extremely interesting. <i>A <b>fascinating</b> story.</i>
<b><u>ghostly</u></b>	Resembling or characteristic of a phantom. <i>A <b>ghostly</b> face at the window.</i>
<b>glorious</b>	Having great beauty and splendor. <i>A <b>glorious</b> sunset.</i>
<b>heady</b>	Extremely exciting as if by alcohol or a narcotic. <i>Several bottles of <b>heady</b> local wine.</i>

<b>hypnotic</b>	Relating to or producing hypnosis. <i>Read the bedtime story in a <b>hypnotic</b> voice.</i>
<b>idyllic</b>	Excellent and delightful in all respects. <i>His <b>idyllic</b> life in Tahiti.</i>
<b>inconceivable</b>	Not capable of being imagined or grasped mentally; unbelievable. <i>It seemed <b>inconceivable</b> that the president had been unaware of what was going on.</i>
<b>incredible</b>	Beyond belief or understanding. <i>At <b>incredible</b> speed.</i>
<b>intoxicating</b>	Exhilarating or exciting. <i>An <b>intoxicating</b> drink.</i>
<b>intriguing</b>	Arousing one's curiosity or interest; fascinating. <i>An <b>intriguing</b> smile.</i>
<b>inviting</b>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>An <b>inviting</b> offer.</i>
<b>irresistible</b>	Too attractive and tempting to be resisted. <i>She felt an <b>irresistible</b> urge to object.</i>
<b>lovely</b>	Very beautiful or attractive. <i>How <b>lovely</b> to see you.</i>
<b>magic</b>	Very effective in producing the desired results. <i><b>Magic</b> signs that protect against adverse influence.</i>
<b>magnetic</b>	Determined by earth's magnetic fields. <i>His <b>magnetic</b> personality.</i>
<b>magnificent</b>	Very good; excellent. <i>She paid tribute to their <b>magnificent</b> efforts.</i>
<b>marvellous</b>	Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers. <i>These <b>marvellous</b> technological toys are fun to play with.</i>
<b>mesmeric</b>	Attracting and holding interest as if by a spell. <i>She had a warm <b>mesmeric</b> charm.</i>
<b>mesmerizing</b>	Capturing one's complete attention as if by magic. <i>A <b>mesmerizing</b> stare.</i>
<b>miraculous</b>	Being or having the character of a miracle. <i>A <b>miraculous</b> cure.</i>
<b>mystic</b>	Relating to or characteristic of mysticism. <i>The <b>mystical</b> style of Blake.</i>
<b>mystical</b>	Concerned with the soul or the spirit, rather than with material things. <i>The <b>mystical</b> city of Kathmandu.</i>

<b><u>occult</u></b>	Hidden and difficult to see. <i>An <b>occult</b> fracture.</i>
<b>outstanding</b>	Of major significance or importance. <i>Julian s <b>outstanding</b> debts.</i>
<b>paranormal</b>	Seemingly outside normal sensory channels. <i>An investigator of the <b>paranormal</b>.</i>
<b><u>phenomenal</u></b>	Perceptible by the senses or through immediate experience. <i>The town expanded at a <b>phenomenal</b> rate.</i>
<b>preternatural</b>	Existing outside of or not in accordance with nature-Aldous Huxley. <i>Beyond his <b>preternatural</b> affability there is some acid and some steel.</i>
<b>prodigious</b>	So great in size or force or extent as to elicit awe. <i>A <b>prodigious</b> storm.</i>
<b><u>rare</u></b>	Recurring only at long intervals. <i>A <b>rare</b> skill.</i>
<b>remarkable</b>	Worthy of attention because interesting, significant, or unusual. <i>A <b>remarkable</b> coincidence.</i>
<b>secret</b>	Given in confidence or in secret. <i>A <b>secret</b> marriage.</i>
<b><u>seductive</u></b>	Tending to entice into a desired action or state. <i>A <b>seductive</b> voice.</i>
<b><u>sensational</u></b>	Commanding attention. <i>Cheap <b>sensational</b> periodicals.</i>
<b>shamanistic</b>	Of or relating to shamanism.
<b><u>singular</u></b>	Relating to or of the nature of singularity. <i>A <b>singular</b> example.</i>
<b>sorcerous</b>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers.
<b>spectral</b>	Of or relating to a spectrum. <i>A <b>spectral</b> menacing face.</i>
<b>spellbinding</b>	Attracting and holding interest as if by a spell. <i>A place of <b>spellbinding</b> beauty.</i>
<b><u>staggering</u></b>	Deeply shocking; astonishing. <i>The <b>staggering</b> bills for maintenance and repair.</i>
<b>stunning</b>	Strikingly beautiful or attractive. <i><b>Stunning</b> photographs of Canada s wilderness areas.</i>
<b><u>sublime</u></b>	Lifted up or set high. <i>His face assumed an expression of <b>sublime</b> conceit.</i>

<b>superb</b>	Used in names of birds with attractive or colourful plumage e.g. superb lyrebird. A <b>superb</b> performance.
<b>superlative</b>	Highest in quality. A <b>superlative</b> piece of skill.
<b>supernatural</b>	Unnaturally or extraordinarily great. A <b>supernatural</b> being.
<b>surpassing</b>	Exceeding or surpassing usual limits especially in excellence. A picture of <b>surpassing</b> beauty.
<b>unbelievable</b>	Having a probability too low to inspire belief. Your audacity is <b>unbelievable</b> .
<b>uncanny</b>	Strange or mysterious, especially in an unsettling way. An <b>uncanny</b> feeling that she was being watched.
<b>uncommon</b>	Marked by an uncommon quality especially superlative or extreme of its kind. He owed his greatest debt to his mother's <b>uncommon</b> character and ability.
<b>unimaginable</b>	Totally unlikely. Lives of almost <b>unimaginable</b> deprivation.
<b>unique</b>	Being the only one of its kind; unlike anything else. Spoke with a <b>unique</b> accent.
<b>unparalleled</b>	Having no parallel or equal; exceptional. <b>Unparalleled</b> athletic ability.
<b>unprecedented</b>	Never done or known before. An <b>unprecedented</b> expansion in population and industry.
<b>unusual</b>	Not usual or common or ordinary. A scene of <b>unusual</b> beauty.
<b>witching</b>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare. <i>Tis now the very <b>witching</b> time of night.</i>
<b>wizard</b>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare. <i>I've just had a <b>wizard</b> idea.</i>
<b>wizardly</b>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare. <b>Wizardly</b> powers.
<b>wonderful</b>	Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers. <i>The climate was <b>wonderful</b> all the year round.</i>

## Associations of "Magical" (30 Words)

<b>amulet</b>	A trinket or piece of jewelry usually hung about the neck and thought to be a magical protection against evil or disease.
<b>bewitchment</b>	A magical spell.
<b>captivated</b>	Strongly attracted.
<b><u>charm</u></b>	Induce into action by using one's charm. <i>The trinkets were <b>charms</b> from his wife's bracelet.</i>
<b>charmed</b>	Strongly attracted. <i>I felt that I had a <b>charmed</b> life.</i>
<b>coven</b>	A secret or close-knit group of associates. <i><b>Covens</b> of militants within the party.</i>
<b>disbelieve</b>	Reject as false; refuse to accept. <i>He seemed to <b>disbelieve</b> her.</i>



<b>enchantment</b>	A feeling of great pleasure; delight. <i>The <b>enchantment</b> of the mountains.</i>
<b>fascinate</b>	(especially of a snake) deprive (prey) of the ability to resist or escape by the power of a gaze. <i>I've always been <b>fascinated</b> by computers.</i>
<b>genie</b>	An invisible spirit mentioned in the Koran and believed by Muslims to inhabit the earth and influence mankind by appearing in the form of humans or animals.
<b>hypnotist</b>	A person who carries out hypnosis, either for medical reasons or for entertainment. <i>A stage <b>hypnotist</b>.</i>
<b>incantation</b>	A ritual recitation of words or sounds believed to have a magical effect. <i>There was no magic in such <b>incantation</b>.</i>
<b>magic</b>	An illusory feat considered magical by naive observers. <i>It was a great time <b>magic</b>.</i>
<b>magician</b>	Someone who performs magic tricks to amuse an audience. <i>He was the <b>magician</b> of the fan belt.</i>
<b>mermaid</b>	Half woman and half fish; lives in the sea.
<b>miraculously</b>	In a way that suggests or resembles a miracle. <i>A shrine where people bring the sick to be <b>miraculously</b> healed.</i>
<b>mystic</b>	Relating to or resembling mysticism. <i><b>Mystical</b> theories about the securities market.</i>
<b>myth</b>	A fictitious or imaginary person or thing. <i>The book is a scholarly study of the Churchill <b>myth</b>.</i>
<b>necromancer</b>	One who practices magic or sorcery. <i>Dr Faustus a <b>necromancer</b> of the 16th century.</i>
<b>potion</b>	A medicinal or magical or poisonous beverage. <i>A healing <b>potion</b>.</i>
<b>shaman</b>	In societies practicing shamanism one acting as a medium between the visible and spirit worlds practices sorcery for healing or divination.
<b>sorcerer</b>	A person who claims or is believed to have magic powers; a wizard.
<b>sorcery</b>	The belief in magical spells that harness occult forces or evil spirits to produce unnatural effects in the world.
<b>spell</b>	Orally recite the letters of or give the spelling of. <i>The workers <b>spell</b> every four hours.</i>
<b>supernatural</b>	Supernatural forces and events and beings collectively. <i>A woman of <b>supernatural</b> beauty.</i>

**talisman**

A trinket or piece of jewelry usually hung about the neck and thought to be a magical protection against evil or disease.

*Those rings so fresh and gleaming were their **talismans**.*

**trance**

Put into a trance.

*The kind of **trance** he went into whenever illness was discussed.*

**witch**

A woman who is bewitchingly attractive.

*He can marry the old **witch** for all I care.*

**witchcraft**

The art of sorcery.

*Children and goods were believed to be vulnerable to the **witchcraft** of jealous neighbours.*

**wizard**

One who practices magic or sorcery.

*I've just had a **wizard** idea.*
