### [alchemist](#)

A person who practises alchemy.

*Phosphorus was discovered by German **alchemist** Hennig Brand in 1669.*

### conjuror

Someone who performs magic tricks to amuse an audience.

### conjurer

A witch doctor who practices conjury.

### druid

A pre-Christian priest among the Celts of ancient Gaul and Britain and Ireland.

### enchanter

A person who uses magic or sorcery, especially to put someone or something under a spell.

### enchantress

A woman who uses magic to put someone or something under a spell.

### expert

A person with special knowledge or ability who performs skillfully.  
*A financial **expert**.*

### genius

Exceptional creative ability.  
*She was a teacher of **genius**.*

<b>illusionist</b>	A person who performs tricks that deceive the eye; a magician. <i><b>Illusionist</b> techniques.</i>
<b>juggler</b>	An entertainer who continuously tosses into the air and catches a number of objects so as to keep at least one in the air while handling the others. <i>A circus <b>juggler</b>.</i>
<b>maestro</b>	A distinguished figure in any sphere. <i>A Vietnam vet turned movie <b>maestro</b>.</i>
<b>magus</b>	A sorcerer.
<a href="#"><u>marvel</u></a>	Something that causes feelings of wonder. <i>The <b>marvels</b> of technology.</i>
<b>master</b>	Someone who holds a master's degree from academic institution. <i>The <b>master</b> tape.</i>
<b>necromancer</b>	One who practices magic or sorcery. <i>Dr Faustus a <b>necromancer</b> of the 16th century.</i>
<b>prestidigitator</b>	Someone who performs magic tricks to amuse an audience.
<a href="#"><u>shaman</u></a>	In societies practicing shamanism one acting as a medium between the visible and spirit worlds practices sorcery for healing or divination.
<a href="#"><u>sorcerer</u></a>	One who practices magic or sorcery.
<b>sorceress</b>	A female sorcerer; a witch.
<b>spellcaster</b>	A person or creature with magical powers. <i>I never believed in love spells or magic until I met this <b>spellcaster</b>.</i>
<b>thaumaturge</b>	A worker of wonders and performer of miracles; a magician.
<b>thaumaturgist</b>	One who practices magic or sorcery.
<b>virtuoso</b>	A person with a special knowledge of or interest in works of art or curios. <i><b>Virtuoso</b> guitar playing.</i>
<b>warlock</b>	A male witch or demon.
<a href="#"><u>witch</u></a>	A woman who is bewitchingly attractive. <i>He can marry the old <b>witch</b> for all I care.</i>
<b>witch doctor</b>	A believer in Wicca.
<a href="#"><u>wizard</u></a>	One who practices magic or sorcery. <i>A financial <b>wizard</b>.</i>

## Associations of "Magician" (30 Words)

<b><u>alchemist</u></b>	A person who practises alchemy. <i>Phosphorus was discovered by German <b>alchemist</b> Hennig Brand in 1669.</i>
<b>amulet</b>	An ornament or small piece of jewellery thought to give protection against evil, danger, or disease.
<b>bewitchment</b>	A magical spell.
<b><u>charm</u></b>	A characteristic property of certain subatomic particles specifically charm quarks charm antiquarks and hadrons containing these expressed as a quantum number. <i>His <b>charm</b> has captivated the media.</i>
<b>charmed</b>	Filled with wonder and delight. <i>I felt that I had a <b>charmed</b> life.</i>
<b><u>dexterity</u></b>	Adroitness in using the hands. <i>Her <b>dexterity</b> with chopsticks.</i>

<b><u>enthrall</u></b>	Hold spellbound.
<b><u>entrance</u></b>	Put into a trance. <i>At their abrupt <b>entrance</b> he rose to his feet.</i>
<b><u>fascinate</u></b>	Attract; cause to be enamored. <i>I've always been <b>fascinated</b> by computers.</i>
<b>genie</b>	An invisible spirit mentioned in the Koran and believed by Muslims to inhabit the earth and influence mankind by appearing in the form of humans or animals.
<b>hypnotic</b>	(of a drug) sleep-inducing. <i>A <b>hypnotic</b> state.</i>
<b>hypnotist</b>	A person who carries out hypnosis, either for medical reasons or for entertainment. <i>A stage <b>hypnotist</b>.</i>
<b>hypnotize</b>	Produce a state of hypnosis in (someone). <i>She gazed down <b>hypnotized</b> by the swirling tide.</i>
<b>magic</b>	An illusory feat considered magical by naive observers. <i>A <b>magic</b> wand.</i>
<b><u>magical</u></b>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare. <i>A <b>magical</b> spell.</i>
<b>mesmerize</b>	Hypnotize (someone). <i>They were <b>mesmerized</b> by his story.</i>
<b><u>mystic</u></b>	Relating to or resembling mysticism. <i><b>Mystical</b> intuition.</i>
<b>narcissist</b>	Someone in love with themselves. <i><b>Narcissists</b> who think the world revolves around them.</i>
<b>necromancer</b>	One who practices divination by conjuring up the dead. <i>Dr Faustus a <b>necromancer</b> of the 16th century.</i>
<b><u>shaman</u></b>	In societies practicing shamanism one acting as a medium between the visible and spirit worlds practices sorcery for healing or divination.
<b>sleight</b>	The use of dexterity or cunning, especially so as to deceive. <i>Except by <b>sleight</b> of logic the two positions cannot be harmonized.</i>
<b><u>sorcerer</u></b>	A person who claims or is believed to have magic powers; a wizard.
<b>sorcery</b>	The belief in magical spells that harness occult forces or evil spirits to produce unnatural effects in the world.
<b><u>spell</u></b>	Place under a spell. <i>She <b>spelled</b> her husband at the wheel.</i>

<b>spellbind</b>	Hold the complete attention of (someone) as though by magic; fascinate. <i>The singer held the audience spellbound.</i>
<u><a href="#">talisman</a></u>	An object, typically an inscribed ring or stone, that is thought to have magic powers and to bring good luck. <i>A dolphin <b>talisman</b> would ensure a safe journey on land or at sea.</i>
<u><a href="#">trance</a></u>	Put into a trance. <i>She put him into a light <b>trance</b>.</i>
<b>ventriloquist</b>	A person, especially an entertainer, who can make their voice appear to come from somewhere else, typically a dummy of a person or animal.
<u><a href="#">witch</a></u>	A follower or practitioner of Wicca or of modern witchcraft. <i>She <b>witched</b> Jake.</i>
<u><a href="#">wizard</a></u>	(in legends and fairy tales) a man who has magical powers. <i><b>Wizard</b> wands.</i>
