A person who practises alchemy.

*Phosphorus was discovered by German **alchemist** Hennig Brand in 1669.*

conjuror

Someone who performs magic tricks to amuse an audience.

conjuror

A witch doctor who practices conjury.

druid

A pre-Christian priest among the Celts of ancient Gaul and Britain and Ireland.

enchanter

A person who uses magic or sorcery, especially to put someone or something under a spell.

enchantress

A woman who uses magic to put someone or something under a spell.

expert

A person with special knowledge or ability who performs skillfully.
*A financial **expert**.*

genius

Exceptional creative ability.
*She was a teacher of **genius**.*

illusionist	A person who performs tricks that deceive the eye; a magician. <i>Illusionist techniques.</i>
juggler	An entertainer who continuously tosses into the air and catches a number of objects so as to keep at least one in the air while handling the others. <i>A circus juggler.</i>
maestro	A distinguished figure in any sphere. <i>A Vietnam vet turned movie maestro.</i>
magus	A sorcerer.
<u>marvel</u>	Something that causes feelings of wonder. <i>The marvels of technology.</i>
master	Someone who holds a master's degree from academic institution. <i>The master tape.</i>
necromancer	One who practices magic or sorcery. <i>Dr Faustus a necromancer of the 16th century.</i>
prestidigitator	Someone who performs magic tricks to amuse an audience.
<u>shaman</u>	In societies practicing shamanism one acting as a medium between the visible and spirit worlds practices sorcery for healing or divination.
<u>sorcerer</u>	One who practices magic or sorcery.
sorceress	A female sorcerer; a witch.
spellcaster	A person or creature with magical powers. <i>I never believed in love spells or magic until I met this spellcaster.</i>
thaumaturge	A worker of wonders and performer of miracles; a magician.
thaumaturgist	One who practices magic or sorcery.
virtuoso	A person with a special knowledge of or interest in works of art or curios. <i>Virtuoso guitar playing.</i>
warlock	A male witch or demon.
<u>witch</u>	A woman who is bewitchingly attractive. <i>He can marry the old witch for all I care.</i>
witch doctor	A believer in Wicca.
<u>wizard</u>	One who practices magic or sorcery. <i>A financial wizard.</i>

<u>alchemist</u>	A person who practises alchemy. <i>Phosphorus was discovered by German alchemist Hennig Brand in 1669.</i>
amulet	An ornament or small piece of jewellery thought to give protection against evil, danger, or disease.
bewitchment	A magical spell.
<u>charm</u>	A characteristic property of certain subatomic particles specifically charm quarks charm antiquarks and hadrons containing these expressed as a quantum number. <i>His charm has captivated the media.</i>
charmed	Filled with wonder and delight. <i>I felt that I had a charmed life.</i>
<u>dexterity</u>	Adroitness in using the hands. <i>Her dexterity with chopsticks.</i>

<u>enthrall</u>	Hold spellbound.
<u>entrance</u>	Put into a trance. <i>At their abrupt entrance he rose to his feet.</i>
<u>fascinate</u>	Attract; cause to be enamored. <i>I've always been fascinated by computers.</i>
genie	An invisible spirit mentioned in the Koran and believed by Muslims to inhabit the earth and influence mankind by appearing in the form of humans or animals.
hypnotic	(of a drug) sleep-inducing. <i>A hypnotic state.</i>
hypnotist	A person who carries out hypnosis, either for medical reasons or for entertainment. <i>A stage hypnotist.</i>
hypnotize	Produce a state of hypnosis in (someone). <i>She gazed down hypnotized by the swirling tide.</i>
magic	An illusory feat considered magical by naive observers. <i>A magic wand.</i>
<u>magical</u>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare. <i>A magical spell.</i>
mesmerize	Hypnotize (someone). <i>They were mesmerized by his story.</i>
<u>mystic</u>	Relating to or resembling mysticism. <i>Mystical intuition.</i>
narcissist	Someone in love with themselves. <i>Narcissists who think the world revolves around them.</i>
necromancer	One who practices divination by conjuring up the dead. <i>Dr Faustus a necromancer of the 16th century.</i>
<u>shaman</u>	In societies practicing shamanism one acting as a medium between the visible and spirit worlds practices sorcery for healing or divination.
sleight	The use of dexterity or cunning, especially so as to deceive. <i>Except by sleight of logic the two positions cannot be harmonized.</i>
<u>sorcerer</u>	A person who claims or is believed to have magic powers; a wizard.
sorcery	The belief in magical spells that harness occult forces or evil spirits to produce unnatural effects in the world.
<u>spell</u>	Place under a spell. <i>She spelled her husband at the wheel.</i>

spellbind	Hold the complete attention of (someone) as though by magic; fascinate. <i>The singer held the audience spellbound.</i>
<u>talisman</u>	An object, typically an inscribed ring or stone, that is thought to have magic powers and to bring good luck. <i>A dolphin talisman would ensure a safe journey on land or at sea.</i>
<u>trance</u>	Put into a trance. <i>She put him into a light trance.</i>
ventriloquist	A person, especially an entertainer, who can make their voice appear to come from somewhere else, typically a dummy of a person or animal.
<u>witch</u>	A follower or practitioner of Wicca or of modern witchcraft. <i>She witched Jake.</i>
<u>wizard</u>	(in legends and fairy tales) a man who has magical powers. <i>Wizard wands.</i>
