<b>enthralling</b>	Capturing and holding one's attention; fascinating. <i>An <b>enthralling</b> best seller.</i>
<b><u>entrancing</u></b>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>I find you <b>entrancing</b>.</i>
<b><u>fascinating</u></b>	Capable of arousing and holding the attention. <i>A <b>fascinating</b> book.</i>
<b>hypnotic</b>	Attracting and holding interest as if by a spell. <i>Her voice had a <b>hypnotic</b> quality.</i>
<b><u>inviting</u></b>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>The sea down there looks so <b>inviting</b>.</i>
<b><u>irresistible</u></b>	Overpoweringly attractive. <i>What happens when an <b>irresistible</b> force meets an immovable object.</i>
<b>magic</b>	Very effective in producing the desired results. <i>It was a great time <b>magic</b>.</i>
<b><u>magical</u></b>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare. <i>It was a <b>magical</b> evening of pure nostalgia.</i>
<b>magnetised</b>	Having the properties of a magnet; i.e. of attracting iron or steel.
<b>magnetized</b>	Having the properties of a magnet; i.e. of attracting iron or steel.
<b>mesmeric</b>	Causing a person to become completely transfixed and unaware of their surroundings. <i><b>Mesmeric</b> anaesthesia.</i>
<b>prepossessing</b>	Creating a favorable impression. <i>Strong and vigorous and of <b>prepossessing</b> appearance.</i>
<b><u>seductive</u></b>	Tending to entice into a desired action or state. <i>A <b>seductive</b> voice.</i>
<b><u>tantalizing</u></b>	Very pleasantly inviting. <i>The <b>tantalizing</b> fragrance of fried bacon.</i>
<b><u>tempting</u></b>	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>A <b>tempting</b> financial offer.</i>

<b>attraction</b>	The quality of arousing interest; being attractive or something that attracts. <i>The church is the town's main tourist <b>attraction</b>.</i>
<b>attractive</b>	(of a person) appealing to look at; sexually alluring. <i>An <b>attractive</b> opportunity.</i>
<b>bamboo</b>	The hard woody stems of bamboo plants used in construction and crafts and fishing poles. <i>A <b>bamboo</b> bench.</i>
<b>between</b>	In between. <i>Sets of exercises with no rest in <b>between</b>.</i>

<b>charismatic</b>	An adherent of the charismatic movement. A <b>charismatic</b> leader.
<b>charming</b>	(of a person or their manner) very polite, friendly, and likeable. A <b>charming</b> personality.
<b>electromagnet</b>	A soft metal core made into a magnet by the passage of electric current through a coil surrounding it.
<b>enchancing</b>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <b>Enchancing</b> views.
<b>engaging</b>	Attracting or delighting. An <b>engaging</b> smile.
<b>enthraling</b>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. An <b>enthraling</b> best seller.
<b>enticing</b>	Attractive or tempting; alluring. An <b>enticing</b> prospect.
<b>entrancing</b>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. An <b>entrancing</b> smile.
<b>fetching</b>	Very attractive; capturing interest. A <b>fetching</b> new hairstyle.
<b>glamorize</b>	Make glamorous and attractive. The lyrics <b>glamorize</b> drugs.
<b>inviting</b>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. The sea down there looks so <b>inviting</b> .
<b>iron</b>	A tool or implement now or originally made of iron. An <b>iron</b> constitution.
<b>personable</b>	(of persons) pleasant in appearance and personality. She is quite a <b>personable</b> young woman.
<b>polarity</b>	A relation between two opposite attributes or tendencies. It exhibits <b>polarity</b> when presented to a magnetic needle.
<b>pole</b>	Support on poles. They tell you on the tin that their tuna is entirely caught with <b>pole</b> and line.
<b>pull</b>	A handle to hold while pulling. <b>Pull</b> one's horse to a stand.
<b>rod</b>	A fishing rod. The royal insignia included the ring the sceptre and the <b>rod</b> .
<b>seductive</b>	Tempting and attractive; enticing. A <b>seductive</b> voice.

<b>spindle</b>	A Eurasian shrub or small tree with slender toothed leaves and pink capsules containing bright orange seeds Its hard timber was formerly used for making spindles. <i>Chromosomes are distributed by <b>spindles</b> in mitosis and meiosis.</i>
<b>steel</b>	A rod of roughened steel on which knives are sharpened. <i>She <b>steeled</b> herself to remain calm.</i>
<b>tempt</b>	Try to seduce. <i>The window displays <b>tempted</b> the shoppers.</i>
<b>tempting</b>	Very pleasantly inviting. <i>It is often <b>tempting</b> to bring about change rapidly.</i>
<b>tipi</b>	A Native American tent; usually of conical shape.
<b>winsome</b>	Charming in a childlike or naive way. <i>A <b>winsome</b> smile.</i>
