enthralling	Capturing and holding one's attention; fascinating. <i>An enthralling best seller.</i>
<u>entrancing</u>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>I find you entrancing.</i>
<u>fascinating</u>	Capable of arousing and holding the attention. <i>A fascinating book.</i>
hypnotic	Attracting and holding interest as if by a spell. <i>Her voice had a hypnotic quality.</i>
<u>inviting</u>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>The sea down there looks so inviting.</i>
<u>irresistible</u>	Overpoweringly attractive. <i>What happens when an irresistible force meets an immovable object.</i>
magic	Very effective in producing the desired results. <i>It was a great time magic.</i>
<u>magical</u>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare. <i>It was a magical evening of pure nostalgia.</i>
magnetised	Having the properties of a magnet; i.e. of attracting iron or steel.
magnetized	Having the properties of a magnet; i.e. of attracting iron or steel.
mesmeric	Causing a person to become completely transfixed and unaware of their surroundings. <i>Mesmeric anaesthesia.</i>
prepossessing	Creating a favorable impression. <i>Strong and vigorous and of prepossessing appearance.</i>
<u>seductive</u>	Tending to entice into a desired action or state. <i>A seductive voice.</i>
<u>tantalizing</u>	Very pleasantly inviting. <i>The tantalizing fragrance of fried bacon.</i>
<u>tempting</u>	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>A tempting financial offer.</i>

between	In between. <i>Sets of exercises with no rest in between.</i>

charismatic	An adherent of the charismatic movement. A charismatic leader.
charming	(of a person or their manner) very polite, friendly, and likeable. A charming personality.
electromagnet	A soft metal core made into a magnet by the passage of electric current through a coil surrounding it.
enchancing	Capturing interest as if by a spell. Enchancing views.
engaging	Attracting or delighting. An engaging smile.
enthraling	Capturing interest as if by a spell. An enthraling best seller.
enticing	Attractive or tempting; alluring. An enticing prospect.
entrancing	Capturing interest as if by a spell. An entrancing smile.
fetching	Very attractive; capturing interest. A fetching new hairstyle.
glamorize	Make glamorous and attractive. The lyrics glamorize drugs.
inviting	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. The sea down there looks so inviting .
iron	A tool or implement now or originally made of iron. An iron constitution.
personable	(of persons) pleasant in appearance and personality. She is quite a personable young woman.
polarity	A relation between two opposite attributes or tendencies. It exhibits polarity when presented to a magnetic needle.
pole	Support on poles. They tell you on the tin that their tuna is entirely caught with pole and line.
pull	A handle to hold while pulling. Pull one's horse to a stand.
rod	A fishing rod. The royal insignia included the ring the sceptre and the rod .
seductive	Tempting and attractive; enticing. A seductive voice.

spindle	A Eurasian shrub or small tree with slender toothed leaves and pink capsules containing bright orange seeds Its hard timber was formerly used for making spindles. <i>Chromosomes are distributed by spindles in mitosis and meiosis.</i>
steel	A rod of roughened steel on which knives are sharpened. <i>She steeled herself to remain calm.</i>
tempt	Try to seduce. <i>The window displays tempted the shoppers.</i>
tempting	Very pleasantly inviting. <i>It is often tempting to bring about change rapidly.</i>
tipi	A Native American tent; usually of conical shape.
winsome	Charming in a childlike or naive way. <i>A winsome smile.</i>
