- Very attractive or alluring.

bewitching	Enchanting or delightful. I gazed deeply into the most bewitching blue eyes.
captivating	Capturing interest as if by a spell. A captivating smile.
<u>charismatic</u>	Relating to the charismatic movement in the Christian Church. A charismatic leader.



<u>charming</u>	Pleasing or delighting. <i>He was a charming affectionate colleague.</i>
<u>enchanting</u>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. Dinah looked enchanting .
engaging	Charming and attractive. An engaging frankness.
enthralling	Capturing and holding one's attention; fascinating. An enthralling best seller.
<u>entrancing</u>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. I find you entrancing .
<u>fascinating</u>	Capable of arousing and holding the attention. A fascinating book.
hypnotic	Attracting and holding interest as if by a spell. <i>Her voice had a hypnotic quality.</i>
<u>inviting</u>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>The sea down there looks so inviting</i> .
<u>irresistible</u>	Overpoweringly attractive. What happens when an irresistible force meets an immovable object.
magic	Very effective in producing the desired results. <i>It was a great time magic.</i>
<u>magical</u>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare. It was a magical evening of pure nostalgia.
magnetised	Having the properties of a magnet; i.e. of attracting iron or steel.
magnetized	Having the properties of a magnet; i.e. of attracting iron or steel.
mesmeric	Causing a person to become completely transfixed and unaware of their surroundings. <i>Mesmeric</i> anaesthesia.
prepossessing	Creating a favorable impression. Strong and vigorous and of prepossessing appearance.
<u>seductive</u>	Tending to entice into a desired action or state. A seductive voice.
<u>tantalizing</u>	Very pleasantly inviting. The tantalizing fragrance of fried bacon.
<u>tempting</u>	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. A tempting financial offer.

between	In between. Sets of exercises with no rest in between .




<u>charismatic</u>	An adherent of the charismatic movement. A charismatic leader.
<u>charming</u>	(of a person or their manner) very polite, friendly, and likeable. A charming personality.
electromagnet	A soft metal core made into a magnet by the passage of electric current through a coil surrounding it.
<u>enchanting</u>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>Enchanting</i> views.
engaging	Attracting or delighting. An engaging smile.
enthralling	Capturing interest as if by a spell. An enthralling best seller.
enticing	Attractive or tempting; alluring. An enticing prospect.
<u>entrancing</u>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. An entrancing smile.
fetching	Very attractive; capturing interest. A fetching new hairstyle.
glamorize	Make glamorous and attractive. <i>The lyrics glamorize drugs.</i>
<u>inviting</u>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>The sea down there looks so</i> inviting .
iron	A tool or implement now or originally made of iron. An iron constitution.
<u>personable</u>	(of persons) pleasant in appearance and personality. <i>She is quite a personable young woman.</i>
polarity	A relation between two opposite attributes or tendencies. It exhibits polarity when presented to a magnetic needle.
pole	Support on poles. They tell you on the tin that their tuna is entirely caught with pole and <i>line</i> .
pull	A handle to hold while pulling. Pull one s horse to a stand.
rod	A fishing rod. The royal insignia included the ring the sceptre and the rod .
<u>seductive</u>	Tempting and attractive; enticing. A seductive voice.



spindle	A Eurasian shrub or small tree with slender toothed leaves and pink capsules containing bright orange seeds Its hard timber was formerly used for making spindles. <i>Chromosomes are distributed by</i> spindles <i>in mitosis and meiosis.</i>
<u>steel</u>	A rod of roughened steel on which knives are sharpened. She steel ed herself to remain calm.
<u>tempt</u>	Try to seduce. The window displays tempt ed the shoppers.
<u>tempting</u>	Very pleasantly inviting. It is often tempting to bring about change rapidly.
tipi	A Native American tent; usually of conical shape.
winsome	Charming in a childlike or naive way. A winsome smile.
