aggrandize	Increase the power, status, or wealth of. He hoped to <b>aggrandize</b> himself by dying a hero s death.
amplification	The act of increasing voltage or power or current. The words no real prospect of succeeding do not need any <b>amplification</b> .
amplify	To enlarge beyond bounds or the truth. <i>Amplify</i> sound.



augment	A vowel prefixed to past tenses of verbs in Greek and certain other Indo- European languages. <i>The pressure augmented</i> .
augmentation	The statement of a theme in notes of greater duration (usually twice the length of the original. The <b>augmentation</b> of the curriculum with new subjects.
<u>bloat</u>	Make bloated or swollen. The fungus has <b>bloat</b> ed their abdomens.
<u>broaden</u>	Become broader. <b>Broaden</b> the road.
corroboration	Confirmation that some fact or statement is true through the use of documentary evidence. There is no independent <b>corroboration</b> for this.
dilate	Become wider. <b>Dilate</b> d pupils.
distend	Cause to expand as it by internal pressure. <i>The abdomen <b>distend</b>ed rapidly.</i>
diversify	Make (more) diverse. <b>Diversify</b> a course of study.
<u>enlarge</u>	Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing. <i>She</i> <b>enlarge</b> <i>d</i> the flower beds.
escalation	An increase to counteract a perceived discrepancy. An <b>escalation</b> of violence.
expand	Expand the influence of. The minister <b>expand</b> ed on the government s proposals.
expanded	Increased in extent or size or bulk or scope. <i>The <b>expanded</b> fins of the ray.</i>
expansion	The act of increasing (something) in size or volume or quantity or scope. <i>A small expansion of industry.</i>
expansionist	Relating to or characteristic of a policy of territorial or economic expansion. <i>The imperial government became increasingly bent on</i> <b>expansionist</b> <i>policies.</i>
exponentially	(with reference to an increase) more and more rapidly. Values distributed <b>exponentially</b> according to a given time constant.
<u>extend</u>	Thrust or extend out. My memory <b>extend</b> s back to my fourth year of life.



<u>extension</u>	A room or rooms added to an existing building. They applied for an <b>extension</b> of the loan.
increase	The amount by which something increases. The boss finally <b>increase</b> d her salary.
magnification	A magnified reproduction of something. The lines are only visible under high <b>magnification</b> .
<u>maximize</u>	Make as large or great as possible. The company was aiming to <b>maximize</b> profits.
overstate	State too strongly; exaggerate. I <b>overstate</b> d my case to make my point.
prolongation	The act of prolonging something. An examiner analysed the angle formed by the <b>prolongation</b> s of the lines.
stretched	Extended or spread over a wide area or distance. Broad fields lay <b>stretched</b> on both sides of us.
stretching	Exercise designed to extend the limbs and muscles to their full extent.
swell	A crescendo followed by a decrescendo. The soft <b>swell</b> of her breast.
telescopic	Capable of viewing and magnifying distant objects. A <b>telescopic</b> eye.
widen	Become broader or wider or more extensive. The road <b>widen</b> ed.
