
## Magnify as a Verb

#### Definitions of "Magnify" as a verb

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "magnify" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Increase or exaggerate the importance or effect of.
- To enlarge beyond bounds or the truth.
- Praise highly; glorify.
- Make large.
- Make (something) appear larger than it is, especially with a lens or microscope.
- Increase in size, volume or significance.





### Synonyms of "Magnify" as a verb (27 Words)

<u>adore</u>	Love and respect (someone) deeply. <i>He <b>adore</b>d his mother.</i>
<u>amplify</u>	Make multiple copies of (a gene or DNA sequence. <i>Amplify</i> sound.
augment	Make (something) greater by adding to it; increase. <i>He</i> <b>augment</b> ed his summer income by painting houses.
<u>bless</u>	(especially in Christian church services) call (God) holy; praise (God). <i>The dying man</i> <b>bless</b> <i>ed his son.</i>
blow up	Spend thoughtlessly; throw away.
boost	Give a boost to be beneficial to. The specially designed circuit <b>boost</b> s signal strength.
<u>broaden</u>	Make broader. He has to <b>broaden</b> Labour s appeal to the whole community.



<u>deepen</u>	Make more intense, stronger, or more marked. They <b>deepen</b> ed the lake so that bigger pleasure boats could use it.
dilate	Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing. <i>Dilated pupils.</i>
enhance	Increase. This sauce will <b>enhance</b> the flavor of the meat.
<u>enlarge</u>	Develop a larger print of (a photograph. She <b>enlarge</b> d the flower beds.
<u>exaggerate</u>	To enlarge beyond bounds or the truth. <i>He was apt to <b>exaggerate</b> any aches and pains.</i>
expand	Expand the influence of. The work began as a short story and was later <b>expand</b> ed into a novel.
<u>extend</u>	Extend in scope or range or area. The awning <b>extend</b> s several feet over the sidewalk.
<u>extol</u>	Praise, glorify, or honor. <i>Extol</i> the virtues of one s children.
heighten	Make more extreme; raise in quantity, degree, or intensity. <i>Heighten</i> the tension.
hyperbolise	To enlarge beyond bounds or the truth.
hyperbolize	Represent something as being larger, better, or worse than it really is; exaggerate. <i>His wife had somewhat <b>hyperbolize</b>d his claim.</i>
increase	Become bigger or greater in amount. The boss finally <b>increase</b> d her salary.
<u>intensify</u>	Become more intense. The dispute began to <b>intensify</b> .
<u>maximize</u>	Make as large or great as possible. The company was aiming to <b>maximize</b> profits.
overdraw	To enlarge beyond bounds or the truth. You only pay interest if your account is <b>overdraw</b> n.
overstate	State too strongly; exaggerate. I <b>overstate</b> d my case to make my point.
praise	Express approval of. We can t <b>praise</b> Chris enough he did a brilliant job.
<u>venerate</u>	Regard with great respect; revere. Philip of Beverley was <b>venerate</b> d as a saint.



# widenBecome broader or wider or more extensive.<br/>The lane widened out into a small clearing.worshipLove unquestioningly and uncritically or to excess; venerate as an idol.<br/>The Maya built jungle pyramids to worship their gods.

<u>aggrandize</u>	Increase the power, status, or wealth of. He hoped to <b>aggrandize</b> himself by dying a hero s death.
amplification	The action of enlarging upon or adding detail to a story or statement. The <b>amplification</b> of radio signals is possible.
amplify	To enlarge beyond bounds or the truth. The notes <b>amplify</b> information contained in the statement.
augment	Make (something) greater by adding to it; increase. <i>The pressure <b>augment</b>ed</i> .
<b>augmentation</b> An addition to a coat of arms granted as a mark of special honour. The <b>augmentation</b> of the curriculum with new subjects.	
<u>bloat</u>	Make bloated or swollen. The dead man s stomach was <b>bloat</b> ed.
<u>broaden</u>	Become broader. The river slowed and <b>broaden</b> ed out slightly.
corroboration	Evidence which confirms or supports a statement, theory, or finding; confirmation. <i>There is no independent corroboration for this.</i>
dilate	Make or become wider, larger, or more open. Her eyes <b>dilate</b> d with horror.



distend	Swell or cause to swell by pressure from inside. The <b>distend</b> ed bellies of the starving cows.	
diversify	Spread into new habitats and produce variety or variegate. <i>Diversify a course of study</i> .	
<u>enlarge</u>	Make or become larger or more extensive. They have renovated and <b>enlarge</b> d the four storey building.	
escalation	An increase to counteract a perceived discrepancy. There was a gradual <b>escalation</b> of hostilities.	
expand	Expand the influence of. Alice opened and <b>expand</b> ed in this normality.	
expanded	Increased in extent or size or bulk or scope. The <b>expanded</b> fins of the ray.	
expansion	A thing formed by the enlargement or broadening of something. A small <b>expansion</b> of industry.	
expansionist	A follower or advocate of a policy of territorial or economic expansion. <i>The imperial government became increasingly bent on</i> <b>expansionist</b> <i>policies.</i>	
exponentially	By means of or as expressed by a mathematical exponent. The coefficients show an <b>exponentially</b> decaying trend.	
<u>extend</u>	Thrust or extend out. <i>Extend</i> the TV antenna.	
<u>extension</u>	A subsidiary telephone on the same line as the main one. Most applications provide <b>extension</b> s for the files they create.	
increase	A change resulting in an increase. The <b>increase</b> in unemployment.	
magnification	Making to seem more important than it really is. The lines are only visible under high <b>magnification</b> .	
<u>maximize</u>	Make the most of. <i>He maximized his role.</i>	
overstate	To enlarge beyond bounds or the truth. I <b>overstate</b> d my case to make my point.	
prolongation	The act of prolonging something. There was an indefinite <b>prolongation</b> of the peace talks.	
stretched	Extended or spread over a wide area or distance. Well <b>stretched</b> muscles are less susceptible to injury.	
stretching	Act of expanding by lengthening or widening.	



swell	Excellent; very good. There was a heavy <b>swell</b> .
telescopic	Capable of discerning distant objects. <i>Telescopic lenses.</i>
widen	Make wider. <b>Widen</b> the road.
