Associations of "Make fun of" (30 Words)

<u>amusement</u>	A roundabout, game machine, etc. for providing entertainment at a fairground or resort. <i>We looked with amusement at our horoscopes.</i>
<u>banter</u>	Be silly or tease one another. <i>There was much good natured banter.</i>
buffoonery	Behaviour that is ridiculous but amusing. <i>The film is full of wordplay and buffoonery.</i>
cheerfulness	The quality or state of being noticeably happy and optimistic. <i>The cheerfulness from the fire.</i>
<u>comedy</u>	The style or genre represented by comedy films plays and broadcast programmes. <i>The show combines theatre with the best of stand up comedy.</i>
<u>entertaining</u>	Agreeably diverting. <i>An entertaining puppet show.</i>
<u>exhilaration</u>	The feeling of lively and cheerful joy. <i>They felt the exhilaration of victory.</i>
funny	Arousing or provoking laughter. <i>Her speech has a funny twang.</i>
gaiety	Lively celebration or festivities. <i>The sudden gaiety of children s laughter.</i>
<u>hilarious</u>	Extremely amusing. <i>Hilarious broad comedy.</i>
hilarity	Boisterous merriment. <i>By midnight the hilarity had increased.</i>
humor	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. <i>She didn t appreciate my humor.</i>

humorous	Full of or characterized by humor. <i>Humorous cartoons.</i>
humour	The ability to express humour or amuse other people. <i>His tales are full of humour.</i>
jest	Tell a joke; speak humorously. <i>You jest surely.</i>
jocose	Characterized by jokes and good humor. <i>A jocose allusion.</i>
jocular	Fond of or characterized by joking; humorous or playful. <i>His voice was jocular.</i>
joke	Make jokes talk humorously or flippantly. <i>Public transport is a joke.</i>
jollity	Lively and cheerful activity or celebration. <i>A night of riotous jollity.</i>
jolly	Full of or showing high-spirited merriment. <i>Ideas to jolly up a winter s party.</i>
jovial	Full of or showing high-spirited merriment- Wordsworth. <i>A jovial old gentleman.</i>
joviality	A jovial nature.
laugh	A humorous anecdote or remark intended to provoke laughter. <i>We fell about laughing.</i>
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing children.</i>
merriment	Gaiety and fun. <i>Her eyes sparkled with merriment.</i>
merry	Offering fun and gaiety. <i>After the third beer he began to feel quite merry.</i>
repartee	Conversation or speech characterized by quick, witty comments or replies. <i>He had a quick mind and a splendid gift of repartee.</i>
slapstick	Comedy based on deliberately clumsy actions and humorously embarrassing events. <i>A loud and exhilarating rattle of bladders and slapsticks.</i>
wit	A witty person. <i>She is such a wit.</i>
witticism	A witty remark. <i>Maurice roared with laughter at his own witticisms.</i>
