## Associations of "Make sense" (30 Words)

<b>build</b>	Commission finance and oversee the building of something. <i>People scrimp and save to <b>build</b> a better life for their children.</i>
<b>compel</b>	Bring about (something) by the use of force or pressure. <i>The water shortage <b>compels</b> conservation.</i>
<a href="#">compulsion</a>	An irrational motive for performing trivial or repetitive actions, even against your will. <i>He felt a <b>compulsion</b> to babble on about what had happened.</i>
<a href="#">concoct</a>	Make a concoction of by mixing. <i>She began to <b>concoct</b> a dinner likely to appeal to him.</i>
<b>constrain</b>	Restrict. <i>Calypso in her caves <b>constrained</b> his stay.</i>
<b>construct</b>	Form (a sentence) according to grammatical rules. <i>These rules tell us how to <b>construct</b> a grammatical sentence in a given language.</i>
<b>create</b>	Create or manufacture a man made product. <i><b>Create</b> a furor.</i>
<b>creativity</b>	The ability to create. <i>Firms are keen to encourage <b>creativity</b>.</i>
<a href="#">devise</a>	A gift of real property by will. <i><b>Devise</b> a plan to take over the director s office.</i>
<b>fabricate</b>	Construct or manufacture (an industrial product), especially from prepared components. <i>Officers <b>fabricated</b> evidence.</i>
<a href="#">factory</a>	A plant consisting of one or more buildings with facilities for manufacturing. <i>He is chaplain to the British <b>factory</b> at St Petersburg.</i>

<b>figment</b>	A thing that someone believes to be real but that exists only in their imagination. <i>It really was Ross and not a <b>figment</b> of her overheated imagination.</i>
<b>forge</b>	Create (something) strong, enduring, or successful. <i><b>Forge</b> a pair of tongues.</i>
<b>idea</b>	The aim or purpose. <i>The <b>idea</b> of linking pay to performance has caught on.</i>
<b>imagination</b>	The faculty or action of forming new ideas, or images or concepts of external objects not present to the senses. <i>She'd never been blessed with a vivid <b>imagination</b>.</i>
<b>impromptu</b>	Done without being planned, organized, or rehearsed. <i>He spoke <b>impromptu</b>.</i>
<b>improvised</b>	Done or made using whatever is available; makeshift. <i>Crossed the river on <b>improvised</b> bridges.</i>
<b>instinctive</b>	Unthinking; prompted by (or as if by) instinct. <i>He was an <b>instinctive</b> cook.</i>
<b>invent</b>	Make up something artificial or untrue. <i>He <b>invented</b> an improved form of the steam engine.</i>
<b>invention</b>	The action of inventing something, typically a process or device. <i>Medieval <b>inventions</b> included spectacles for reading and the spinning wheel.</i>
<b>inventive</b>	Showing creativity or original thought. <i>The most <b>inventive</b> composer of his time.</i>
<b>inventor</b>	Someone who is the first to think of or make something.
<b>makeshift</b>	Done or made using whatever is available. <i>Arranging a row of chairs to form a <b>makeshift</b> bed.</i>
<b>manufacture</b>	Manufactured articles. <i>Julia <b>manufactured</b> a smile.</i>
<b>originality</b>	The ability to think and act independently. <i>He congratulated her on the <b>originality</b> of her costume.</i>
<b>produce</b>	Make or manufacture from components or raw materials. <i>The video was <b>produced</b> and directed by film maker Neil Campbell.</i>
<b>productive</b>	Achieving a significant amount or result. <i>A <b>productive</b> vineyard.</i>
<b>ruse</b>	An action intended to deceive someone; a trick. <i>Emma tried to think of a <b>ruse</b> to get Paul out of the house.</i>
