<b>funny</b>	A joke or witty remark. <i>I had a <b>funny</b> feeling you d be around.</i>
<b>gaiety</b>	The state or quality of being light-hearted or cheerful. <i>The sudden <b>gaiety</b> of children s laughter.</i>
<a href="#">glee</a>	Malicious satisfaction. <i>His face lit up with impish <b>glee</b>.</i>
<a href="#">hilarious</a>	Boisterously merry. <i>The meal was noisy and <b>hilarious</b>.</i>
<b>hilarity</b>	Boisterous merriment. <i>His incredulous expression was the cause of much <b>hilarity</b>.</i>
<b>humor</b>	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. <i>The <b>humors</b> are blood and phlegm and yellow and black bile.</i>
<b>humorous</b>	Causing laughter and amusement; comic. <i><b>Humorous</b> stories.</i>
<b>humour</b>	The ability to express humour or amuse other people. <i>Her good <b>humour</b> vanished.</i>
<b>jocular</b>	With humor. <i>They tried to deal with this painful subject <b>jocularly</b>.</i>

<b>joggle</b>	Fasten or join with a joggle. <i>The lurch and <b>joggle</b> of the car.</i>
<b>joke</b>	Tell a joke speak humorously. <i>He told a very funny <b>joke</b>.</i>
<b>jollity</b>	Lively and cheerful activity or celebration. <i>A night of riotous <b>jollity</b>.</i>
<b>jolly</b>	Lively and entertaining. <i>Some regard it as a bit of a <b>jolly</b>.</i>
<b>jovial</b>	Cheerful and friendly. <i>She was in a <b>jovial</b> mood.</i>
<b>joviality</b>	A jovial nature.
<b>joy</b>	A thing that causes joy. <i>You ll get no <b>joy</b> out of her.</i>
<b>laugh</b>	Something that causes laughter a source of fun amusement or derision. <i>He <b>laughed</b> unpleasantly at his own jest.</i>
<b>laughing</b>	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i><b>Laughing</b> children.</i>
<b>merriment</b>	Activities that are enjoyable or amusing. <i>Her eyes sparkled with <b>merriment</b>.</i>
<b>merry</b>	Full of or showing high-spirited merriment- Wordsworth. <i>The streets were dense with <b>merry</b> throngs of students.</i>
<b>mirth</b>	Great merriment. <i>His six foot frame shook with <b>mirth</b>.</i>
<b>pleasure</b>	Enjoyment and entertainment, as opposed to necessity. <i>He took his <b>pleasure</b> of her.</i>
<b>repartee</b>	Adroitness and cleverness in reply. <i>Quick fire <b>repartee</b>.</i>
<b>slapstick</b>	Characterized by horseplay and physical action. <i>A loud and exhilarating rattle of bladders and <b>slapsticks</b>.</i>
<b>smile</b>	Express with a smile. <i>She <b>smiled</b> her thanks.</i>
<b>witticism</b>	A message whose ingenuity or verbal skill or incongruity has the power to evoke laughter. <i>Maurice roared with laughter at his own <b>witticisms</b>.</i>
