buffoonery	Behaviour that is ridiculous but amusing. <i>The film is full of wordplay and buffoonery.</i>
cheerfulness	The quality of being cheerful and dispelling gloom. <i>The cheerfulness from the fire.</i>
entertaining	Providing amusement or enjoyment. <i>A charming and entertaining companion.</i>
exhilaration	A feeling of excitement, happiness, or elation. <i>They felt the exhilaration of victory.</i>
funny	A joke or witty remark. <i>I had a funny feeling you d be around.</i>
gaiety	The state or quality of being light-hearted or cheerful. <i>The sudden gaiety of children s laughter.</i>
glee	Malicious satisfaction. <i>His face lit up with impish glee.</i>
hilarious	Boisterously merry. <i>The meal was noisy and hilarious.</i>
hilarity	Boisterous merriment. <i>His incredulous expression was the cause of much hilarity.</i>
humor	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. <i>The humors are blood and phlegm and yellow and black bile.</i>
humorous	Causing laughter and amusement; comic. <i>Humorous stories.</i>
humour	The ability to express humour or amuse other people. <i>Her good humour vanished.</i>
jocular	With humor. <i>They tried to deal with this painful subject jocularly.</i>

joggle	Fasten or join with a joggle. <i>The lurch and joggle of the car.</i>
joke	Tell a joke speak humorously. <i>He told a very funny joke.</i>
jollity	Lively and cheerful activity or celebration. <i>A night of riotous jollity.</i>
jolly	Lively and entertaining. <i>Some regard it as a bit of a jolly.</i>
jovial	Cheerful and friendly. <i>She was in a jovial mood.</i>
joviality	A jovial nature.
joy	A thing that causes joy. <i>You ll get no joy out of her.</i>
laugh	Something that causes laughter a source of fun amusement or derision. <i>He laughed unpleasantly at his own jest.</i>
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing children.</i>
merriment	Activities that are enjoyable or amusing. <i>Her eyes sparkled with merriment.</i>
merry	Full of or showing high-spirited merriment- Wordsworth. <i>The streets were dense with merry throngs of students.</i>
mirth	Great merriment. <i>His six foot frame shook with mirth.</i>
pleasure	Enjoyment and entertainment, as opposed to necessity. <i>He took his pleasure of her.</i>
repartee	Adroitness and cleverness in reply. <i>Quick fire repartee.</i>
slapstick	Characterized by horseplay and physical action. <i>A loud and exhilarating rattle of bladders and slapsticks.</i>
smile	Express with a smile. <i>She smiled her thanks.</i>
witticism	A message whose ingenuity or verbal skill or incongruity has the power to evoke laughter. <i>Maurice roared with laughter at his own witticisms.</i>
