flaw	A fault or weakness in a person's character. A <b>flaw</b> caused the crystal to shatter.

cease to function	Have an end, in a temporal, spatial, or quantitative sense; either spatial or metaphorical.
cease to work	Have an end, in a temporal, spatial, or quantitative sense; either spatial or metaphorical.
crash	Cause to crash. The test pilot <b>crash</b> ed a Hurricane fighter plane.
develop a fault	Make something new, such as a product or a mental or artistic creation.
fail	Fail to get a passing grade. The criteria used to pass or <b>fail</b> the candidate.
go wrong	Stretch out over a distance, space, time, or scope; run or extend between two points or beyond a certain point.
misfunction	Fail to function or function improperly.
stop working	Cause to stop.

<u>discovery</u>	The act of discovering something. <i>The drug is not a new <b>discovery</b>.</i>
espy	Catch sight of. She espied her daughter rounding the corner.
explore	Examine (organs) for diagnostic purposes. <i>Explore</i> unknown territory in biology.
failure	Inability to discharge all your debts as they come due. <i>Their <b>failure</b> to comply with the basic rules.</i>
find	Come upon after searching find the location of something that was missed or lost. <i>The majority of staff <b>find</b> the magazine to be informative and useful.</i>
happening	An event or occurrence. Altogether it was an eerie <b>happening</b> .
improperly	In a way that lacks modesty or decency. Evidence is inadmissible if it is <b>improperly</b> obtained.
inappropriate	Not suitable or proper in the circumstances. There are penalties for <b>inappropriate</b> behaviour.
<u>incidence</u>	The relative frequency of occurrence of something. <i>The point of <b>incidence</b> of the beam.</i>
kaput	Broken and useless; no longer working or effective. <i>The water pump s broken <b>kaput</b></i> .
<u>mishap</u>	An unpredictable outcome that is unfortunate. Although there were a few minor <b>mishap</b> s none of the pancakes stuck to the ceiling.
<u>newfound</u>	Newly discovered. Hudson pointed his ship down the coast of the <b>newfound</b> sea.
notice	Notice or perceive. <i>He gave <b>notice</b> two months before he moved.</i>



occur	Happen; take place. The accident <b>occur</b> red at about 3 30 p m.
<u>occurrence</u>	An incident or event. A disease of frequent <b>occurrence</b> .
prevention	The action of stopping something from happening or arising. The treatment and <b>prevention</b> of malaria.
problem	A question raised for consideration or solution. The <b>problem</b> of ageism in Hollywood.
seismograph	An instrument that measures and records details of earthquakes, such as force and duration.
<u>startling</u>	Very surprising, astonishing, or remarkable. <i>Startling earthquake shocks</i> .
<u>unsuitable</u>	Not capable of being applied. The display is <b>unsuitable</b> for young children.
