Definitions of "Malleable" as an adjective

- *(of a metal or other material) able to be hammered or pressed into shape without breaking or cracking.*
- *Easily influenced.*
- *Easily influenced; pliable.*
- *Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out.*



Synonyms of "Malleable" as an adjective (17 Words)

<u>accommodating</u>	Obliging; willing to do favors. <i>We always found the our local branch most accommodating.</i>
<u>adaptable</u>	Capable of adapting (of becoming or being made suitable) to a particular situation or use. <i>The frame was adaptable to cloth bolts of different widths.</i>
<u>amenable</u>	Open to being acted upon in a certain way. <i>The tumor was not amenable to surgical treatment.</i>
compliant	Disposed to agree with others or obey rules, especially to an excessive degree; acquiescent. <i>A compliant labour force.</i>
<u>cooperative</u>	Willing to adjust to differences in order to obtain agreement. <i>They have been extremely considerate polite and cooperative.</i>
ductile	(of a metal) able to be drawn out into a thin wire. <i>Ductile copper.</i>

<u>impressionable</u>	Easily impressed or influenced. <i>An impressionable youngster.</i>
<u>plastic</u>	Made of plastic. <i>Plastic substances such as wax or clay.</i>
<u>pliable</u>	Easily influenced. <i>Quality leather is pliable and will not crack.</i>
<u>pliant</u>	Easily bent. <i>A pliant nature.</i>
<u>soft</u>	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music soft in a quiet subdued tone. <i>Julia's soft heart was touched by his grief.</i>
<u>suggestible</u>	Open to suggestion; easily swayed. <i>A suggestible client would comply.</i>
<u>susceptible</u>	(of a person) easily influenced by feelings or emotions; sensitive. <i>Susceptible to colds.</i>
<u>tensile</u>	Of or relating to tension. <i>A tensile steel rod.</i>
<u>tractable</u>	Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded)- Samuel Butler. <i>She has always been tractable and obedient even as a child.</i>
<u>tractile</u>	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out.
<u>workable</u>	Capable of being done with means at hand and circumstances as they are. <i>More flour and salt can be added until they make a workable dough.</i>

Usage Examples of "Malleable" as an adjective

- *They are as malleable and easily led as sheep.*
- *A malleable metal can be beaten into a sheet.*
- *Malleable metals such as gold.*

<u>adjustable</u>	Capable of being changed so as to match or fit. <i>An adjustable spanner.</i>

<u>amenable</u>	Readily reacting to suggestions and influences. <i>Someone amenable to the instruction of others.</i>
convertible	A convertible security. <i>The bonds are convertible into ordinary shares.</i>
<u>docile</u>	Ready and willing to be taught. <i>The docile masses of an enslaved nation.</i>
ductile	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out. <i>Ductile copper.</i>
ductility	The malleability of something that can be drawn into threads or wires or hammered into thin sheets.

flexibility	The property of being flexible; easily bent or shaped. <i>Players gained improved flexibility in their ankles.</i>
<u>flexible</u>	Bending and snapping back readily without breaking. <i>Flexible rubber seals.</i>
<u>impressionable</u>	Easily influenced. <i>An impressionable age.</i>
limber	Attach the limber. <i>A limber imagination.</i>
<u>manageable</u>	Capable of existing or taking place or proving true; possible to do. <i>Her long hair was black wavy and manageable.</i>
<u>obedient</u>	Complying or willing to comply with an order or request; submissive to another's authority. <i>An obedient soldier.</i>
<u>pliable</u>	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out. <i>They soaked the leather to made it pliable.</i>
pliant	Easily bent. <i>A pliant young tree.</i>
readjust	Adjust again after an initial failure. <i>I readjusted the rear view mirror.</i>
rein	Stop or slow up one's horse or oneself by or as if by pulling the reins. <i>He took up the reins of government.</i>
responsiveness	The quality of being responsive; reacting quickly; as a quality of people, it involves responding with emotion to people and events. <i>The responsiveness of the vehicle.</i>

saddle	Put a saddle on. <i>He saddles Native Mission in today s Tote Gold Trophy Hurdle at Newbury.</i>
subdued	Not brilliant or glaring. <i>A subdued glow came through the curtains.</i>
<u>susceptible</u>	Easily impressed emotionally. <i>Susceptible to colds.</i>
tame	Brought from wildness into a domesticated state. <i>She was one of the tamest and most abject creatures imaginable with no will or power to act but as directed.</i>
tensile	Capable of being drawn out or stretched. <i>A tensile force.</i>
thermostat	Control the temperature with a thermostat.
tractability	The trait of being easily persuaded.
<u>tractable</u>	Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded). <i>Tractable young minds.</i>
<u>versatile</u>	Having great diversity or variety. <i>Versatile moods.</i>
<u>vulnerable</u>	(of a partnership) liable to higher penalties, either by convention or through having won one game towards a rubber. <i>We were in a vulnerable position.</i>
waxy	Made of or covered with wax. <i>A thin face with a waxy paleness.</i>
