### Definitions of "Malleable" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “malleable” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a metal or other material) able to be hammered or pressed into shape without breaking or cracking.*
- *Easily influenced.*
- *Easily influenced; pliable.*
- *Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out.*



## Synonyms of "Malleable" as an adjective (17 Words)

- accommodating** Obliging; willing to do favors.  
*We always found the our local branch most **accommodating**.*
- adaptable** Capable of adapting (of becoming or being made suitable) to a particular situation or use.  
*The frame was **adaptable** to cloth bolts of different widths.*
- amenable** Open to being acted upon in a certain way.  
*The tumor was not **amenable** to surgical treatment.*
- compliant** Disposed to agree with others or obey rules, especially to an excessive degree; acquiescent.  
*A **compliant** labour force.*
- cooperative** Willing to adjust to differences in order to obtain agreement.  
*They have been extremely considerate polite and **cooperative**.*
- ductile** (of a metal) able to be drawn out into a thin wire.  
***Ductile** copper.*

<b><u>impressionable</u></b>	Easily impressed or influenced. An <b>impressionable</b> youngster.
<b><u>plastic</u></b>	Made of plastic. <b>Plastic</b> substances such as wax or clay.
<b><u>pliable</u></b>	Easily influenced. Quality leather is <b>pliable</b> and will not crack.
<b><u>pliant</u></b>	Easily bent. A <b>pliant</b> nature.
<b><u>soft</u></b>	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music soft in a quiet subdued tone. Julia's <b>soft</b> heart was touched by his grief.
<b><u>suggestible</u></b>	Open to suggestion; easily swayed. A <b>suggestible</b> client would comply.
<b><u>susceptible</u></b>	(of a person) easily influenced by feelings or emotions; sensitive. <b>Susceptible</b> to colds.
<b><u>tensile</u></b>	Of or relating to tension. A <b>tensile</b> steel rod.
<b><u>tractable</u></b>	Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded)- Samuel Butler. She has always been <b>tractable</b> and obedient even as a child.
<b><u>tractile</u></b>	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out.
<b><u>workable</u></b>	Capable of being done with means at hand and circumstances as they are. More flour and salt can be added until they make a <b>workable</b> dough.

- They are as malleable and easily led as sheep.
- A malleable metal can be beaten into a sheet.
- Malleable metals such as gold.

<b>elastic</b>	A narrow band of elastic rubber used to hold things such as papers together. <i>The definition of nationality is <b>elastic</b> in this cosmopolitan country.</i>
<b>flexibility</b>	The property of being flexible; easily bent or shaped. <i>Players gained improved <b>flexibility</b> in their ankles.</i>
<b><u>flexible</u></b>	Bending and snapping back readily without breaking. <i><b>Flexible</b> rubber seals.</i>
<b><u>impressionable</u></b>	Easily influenced. <i>An <b>impressionable</b> age.</i>
<b>limber</b>	Attach the limber. <i>A <b>limber</b> imagination.</i>
<b><u>manageable</u></b>	Capable of existing or taking place or proving true; possible to do. <i>Her long hair was black wavy and <b>manageable</b>.</i>
<b><u>obedient</u></b>	Complying or willing to comply with an order or request; submissive to another's authority. <i>An <b>obedient</b> soldier.</i>
<b><u>pliable</u></b>	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out. <i>They soaked the leather to make it <b>pliable</b>.</i>
<b>pliant</b>	Easily bent. <i>A <b>pliant</b> young tree.</i>
<b>readjust</b>	Adjust again after an initial failure. <i>I <b>readjusted</b> the rear view mirror.</i>
<b>rein</b>	Stop or slow up one's horse or oneself by or as if by pulling the reins. <i>He took up the <b>reins</b> of government.</i>
<b>responsiveness</b>	The quality of being responsive; reacting quickly; as a quality of people, it involves responding with emotion to people and events. <i>The <b>responsiveness</b> of the vehicle.</i>

<b>saddle</b>	Put a saddle on. <i>He <b>saddles</b> Native Mission in today s Tote Gold Trophy Hurdle at Newbury.</i>
<b>subdued</b>	Not brilliant or glaring. <i>A <b>subdued</b> glow came through the curtains.</i>
<u><b>susceptible</b></u>	Easily impressed emotionally. <i><b>Susceptible</b> to colds.</i>
<b>tame</b>	Brought from wildness into a domesticated state. <i>She was one of the <b>tamest</b> and most abject creatures imaginable with no will or power to act but as directed.</i>
<b>tensile</b>	Capable of being drawn out or stretched. <i>A <b>tensile</b> force.</i>
<b>thermostat</b>	Control the temperature with a thermostat.
<b>tractability</b>	The trait of being easily persuaded.
<u><b>tractable</b></u>	Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded). <i><b>Tractable</b> young minds.</i>
<u><b>versatile</b></u>	Having great diversity or variety. <i><b>Versatile</b> moods.</i>
<u><b>vulnerable</b></u>	(of a partnership) liable to higher penalties, either by convention or through having won one game towards a rubber. <i>We were in a <b>vulnerable</b> position.</i>
<b>waxy</b>	Made of or covered with wax. <i>A thin face with a <b>waxy</b> paleness.</i>
