<u>accommodating</u>	Willing to fit in with someone's wishes or needs. Made a special effort to be accommodating .
accomplishable	Able to be achieved or completed successfully. We will have to negotiate and see what is accomplishable .
<u>achievable</u>	Able to be brought about or reached successfully. It was an ambitious goal but it seemed achievable .
acquiescent	Willing to carry out the orders or wishes of another without protest. <i>His acquiescent mood.</i>
<u>amenable</u>	Disposed or willing to conform. The president is amenable to the constitutional court.
<u>attainable</u>	Able to be attained; achievable. Choose an attainable goal.
biddable	Strong enough to justify a bid. A gentle biddable soul.



complaisant	Showing a cheerful willingness to do favors for others. There are too many complaisant doctors signing sick notes.
compliant	Disposed or willing to comply. The conversion of the gel to a much less compliant rigid glass.
controllable	Capable of being directed or influenced. Discontent began to give way to barely controllable rage.
doable	Within one's powers; feasible. None of the jobs were fun but they were doable .
<u>docile</u>	Willing to be taught or led or supervised or directed. She s a black Labrador gentle and docile .
easy to use	Affording pleasure.
feasible	Possible to do easily or conveniently. The Dutch have demonstrated that it is perfectly feasible to live below sea level.
governable	Capable of being controlled.
<u>handy</u>	Useful and convenient. <i>Handy</i> with an axe.
<u>malleable</u>	(of a metal or other material) able to be hammered or pressed into shape without breaking or cracking. <i>They are as malleable and easily led as sheep.</i>
manipulable	Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded.
<u>pliable</u>	Capable of being bent or flexed or twisted without breaking. Pliable teenage minds.
pliant	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out. A pliant young tree.
<u>possible</u>	Having as much or as little of a specified quality as can be achieved. <i>The shortest</i> possible route.
practicable	Able to be used; useful. A practicable solution.
realizable	In or able to be converted into cash. The need to define realizable targets.
reasonable	Not excessive or extreme. It seems a reasonable enough request.
submissive	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant S H Adams. <i>Submissive</i> servants.
tameable	Capable of being tamed.



<u>tractable</u>	Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded)- Samuel Butler. <i>Tractable</i> young minds.
user-friendly	Easy to use.
viable	(of a plant, animal, or cell) capable of surviving or living successfully, especially under particular environmental conditions. <i>Viable seeds</i> .
yielding	Giving a product or generating a financial return of a specified amount. <i>A timid vieldina person.</i>

acquiescent	Willing to carry out the orders or wishes of another without protest. <i>His acquiescent mood.</i>
<u>amenable</u>	Readily reacting to suggestions and influences. An amenable hospitalization should not result in untimely death.
chasten	(especially of God) discipline; punish. The director was somewhat chasten ed by his recent flops.
civilize	Raise from a barbaric to a civilized state. Both countries feel they have a mission to civilize the world.
compliant	Having the property of compliance. The conversion of the gel to a much less compliant rigid glass.
control	The economic policy of controlling or limiting or curbing prices or wages etc. <i>Crime control.</i>



controllable	Capable of being directed or influenced. <i>The glider was fully controllable</i> .
controlled	Having been limited in intensity or level; kept in check. <i>Rebel</i> controlled areas of the country.
<u>docile</u>	Ready to accept control or instruction; submissive. She s a black Labrador gentle and docile .
doctrinaire	A doctrinaire person. The administration s doctrinaire economic policy.
<u>domestic</u>	Converted or adapted to domestic use. They are often called to sort out a domestic .
domesticated	(of an animal) tame and kept as a pet or on a farm. Some men think it unmanly to be domesticated others find gratification in it.
dominate	Be greater in significance than. A picturesque city dominate d by the cathedral tower.
dominated	Harassed by persistent nagging.
dutiful	Willingly obedient out of a sense of duty and respect. A dutiful visit.
foreseeable	Capable of being anticipated. <i>The situation is unlikely to change in the</i> foreseeable future.
govern	Exercise authority over; as of nations. The future of Jamaica will be govern ed by geography not history.
<u>malleable</u>	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out. A malleable metal can be beaten into a sheet.
<u>meek</u>	Very docile- Langston Hughes. A fine fiery blast against meek conformity.
<u>obedience</u>	The trait of being willing to obey. Obedience to moral standards.
<u>obedient</u>	Complying or willing to comply with an order or request; submissive to another's authority. <i>An obedient</i> soldier.
<u>predictable</u>	Capable of being foretold. The characters are stereotyped and extremely predictable .
rule	Linguistics a rule describing or prescribing a linguistic practice. It was his rule to take a walk before breakfast.
submissive	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant. <i>Submissive</i> servants.



subservience	The condition of being less important than something else. Blind subservience to authority.
<u>subservient</u>	Serving or acting as a means or aid. The whole narration is subservient to the moral plan of exemplifying twelve virtues in twelve knights.
tame	Very docile- Langston Hughes. The wolf was tame d and evolved into the house dog.
tractability	The trait of being easily persuaded.
<u>tractable</u>	Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded. <i>Tractable</i> young minds.
<u>willing</u>	The act of making a choice. <i>Willing</i> and prompt obedience.
