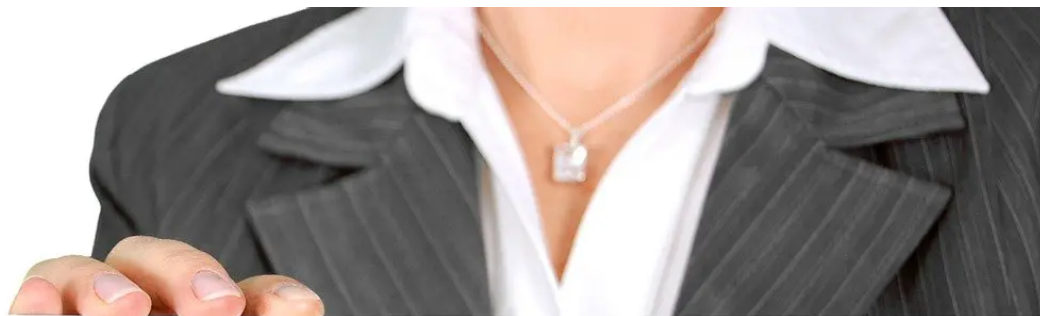

Manageable as an Adjective

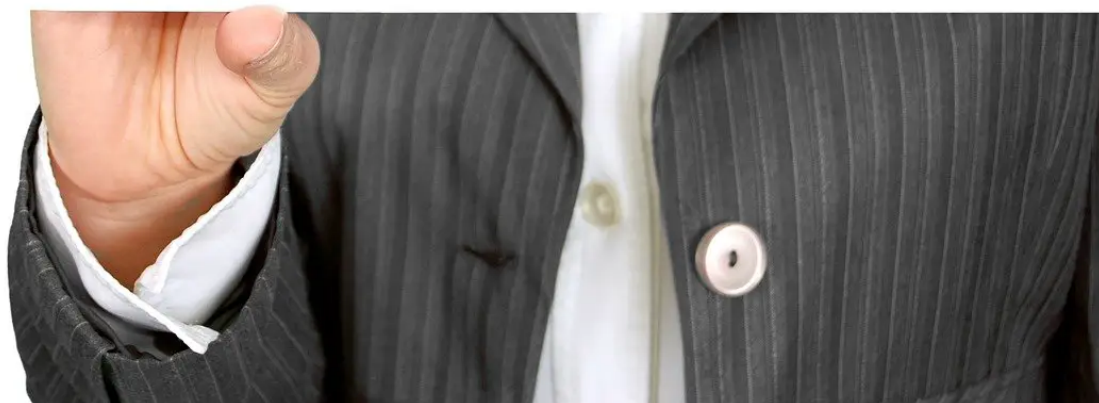
Definitions of "Manageable" as an adjective

Synonyms of "Manageable" as an adjective (30 Words)

<u>accommodating</u>	Willing to fit in with someone's wishes or needs. <i>Made a special effort to be accommodating.</i>
accomplishable	Able to be achieved or completed successfully. <i>We will have to negotiate and see what is accomplishable.</i>
<u>achievable</u>	Able to be brought about or reached successfully. <i>It was an ambitious goal but it seemed achievable.</i>
acquiescent	Willing to carry out the orders or wishes of another without protest. <i>His acquiescent mood.</i>
<u>amenable</u>	Disposed or willing to conform. <i>The president is amenable to the constitutional court.</i>
<u>attainable</u>	Able to be attained; achievable. <i>Choose an attainable goal.</i>
biddable	Strong enough to justify a bid. <i>A gentle biddable soul.</i>

complaisant	Showing a cheerful willingness to do favors for others. <i>There are too many complaisant doctors signing sick notes.</i>
compliant	Disposed or willing to comply. <i>The conversion of the gel to a much less compliant rigid glass.</i>
controllable	Capable of being directed or influenced. <i>Discontent began to give way to barely controllable rage.</i>
doable	Within one's powers; feasible. <i>None of the jobs were fun but they were doable.</i>
<u>docile</u>	Willing to be taught or led or supervised or directed. <i>She s a black Labrador gentle and docile.</i>
easy to use	Affording pleasure.
feasible	Possible to do easily or conveniently. <i>The Dutch have demonstrated that it is perfectly feasible to live below sea level.</i>
governable	Capable of being controlled.
<u>handy</u>	Useful and convenient. <i>Handy with an axe.</i>
<u>malleable</u>	(of a metal or other material) able to be hammered or pressed into shape without breaking or cracking. <i>They are as malleable and easily led as sheep.</i>
manipulable	Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded.
<u>pliable</u>	Capable of being bent or flexed or twisted without breaking. <i>Pliable teenage minds.</i>
pliant	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out. <i>A pliant young tree.</i>
<u>possible</u>	Having as much or as little of a specified quality as can be achieved. <i>The shortest possible route.</i>
practicable	Able to be used; useful. <i>A practicable solution.</i>
realizable	In or able to be converted into cash. <i>The need to define realizable targets.</i>
reasonable	Not excessive or extreme. <i>It seems a reasonable enough request.</i>
submissive	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant S H Adams. <i>Submissive servants.</i>
tameable	Capable of being tamed.

tractable	Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded)- Samuel Butler. Tractable young minds.
user-friendly	Easy to use.
viable	(of a plant, animal, or cell) capable of surviving or living successfully, especially under particular environmental conditions. Viable seeds.
yielding	Giving a product or generating a financial return of a specified amount. A timid yielding person.

acquiescent	Willing to carry out the orders or wishes of another without protest. <i>His acquiescent mood.</i>
<u>amenable</u>	Readily reacting to suggestions and influences. <i>An amenable hospitalization should not result in untimely death.</i>
chasten	(especially of God) discipline; punish. <i>The director was somewhat chastened by his recent flops.</i>
civilize	Raise from a barbaric to a civilized state. <i>Both countries feel they have a mission to civilize the world.</i>
compliant	Having the property of compliance. <i>The conversion of the gel to a much less compliant rigid glass.</i>
control	The economic policy of controlling or limiting or curbing prices or wages etc. <i>Crime control.</i>

controllable	Capable of being directed or influenced. <i>The glider was fully controllable.</i>
controlled	Having been limited in intensity or level; kept in check. <i>Rebel controlled areas of the country.</i>
<u>docile</u>	Ready to accept control or instruction; submissive. <i>She s a black Labrador gentle and docile.</i>
doctrinaire	A doctrinaire person. <i>The administration s doctrinaire economic policy.</i>
<u>domestic</u>	Converted or adapted to domestic use. <i>They are often called to sort out a domestic.</i> (of an animal) tame and kept as a pet or on a farm.
domesticated	<i>Some men think it unmanly to be domesticated others find gratification in it.</i>
dominate	Be greater in significance than. <i>A picturesque city dominated by the cathedral tower.</i>
dominated	Harassed by persistent nagging.
dutiful	Willingly obedient out of a sense of duty and respect. <i>A dutiful visit.</i>
foreseeable	Capable of being anticipated. <i>The situation is unlikely to change in the foreseeable future.</i>
govern	Exercise authority over; as of nations. <i>The future of Jamaica will be governed by geography not history.</i>
<u>malleable</u>	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out. <i>A malleable metal can be beaten into a sheet.</i>
<u>meek</u>	Very docile- Langston Hughes. <i>A fine fiery blast against meek conformity.</i>
<u>obedience</u>	The trait of being willing to obey. <i>Obedience to moral standards.</i>
<u>obedient</u>	Complying or willing to comply with an order or request; submissive to another's authority. <i>An obedient soldier.</i>
<u>predictable</u>	Capable of being foretold. <i>The characters are stereotyped and extremely predictable.</i>
rule	Linguistics a rule describing or prescribing a linguistic practice. <i>It was his rule to take a walk before breakfast.</i>
submissive	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant. <i>Submissive servants.</i>

subservience The condition of being less important than something else.
*Blind **subservience** to authority.*

subservient Serving or acting as a means or aid.
*The whole narration is **subservient** to the moral plan of exemplifying twelve virtues in twelve knights.*

tame Very docile- Langston Hughes.
*The wolf was **tamed** and evolved into the house dog.*

tractability The trait of being easily persuaded.

tractable Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded).
***Tractable** young minds.*

willing The act of making a choice.
***Willing** and prompt obedience.*
