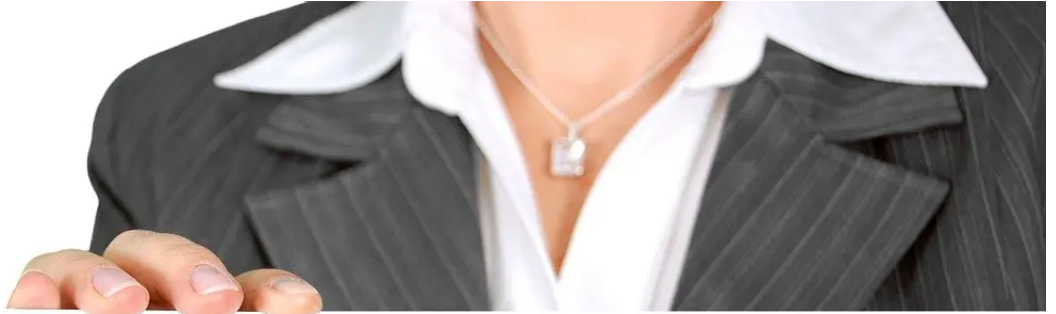

## Manageable as an Adjective

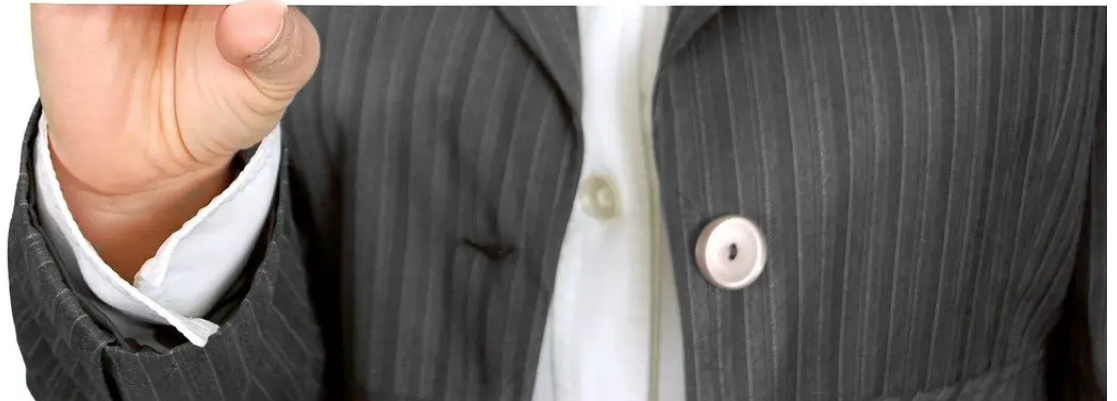
### Definitions of "Manageable" as an adjective

- *Capable of existing or taking place or proving true; possible to do.*
- *Able to be controlled or dealt with without difficulty.*
- *Capable of being managed or controlled.*

- accommodating** Willing to fit in with someone's wishes or needs.  
*Made a special effort to be **accommodating**.*
- accomplishable** Able to be achieved or completed successfully.  
*We will have to negotiate and see what is **accomplishable**.*
- achievable** Able to be brought about or reached successfully.  
*It was an ambitious goal but it seemed **achievable**.*
- acquiescent** Willing to carry out the orders or wishes of another without protest.  
*His **acquiescent** mood.*
- amenable** Disposed or willing to conform.  
*The president is **amenable** to the constitutional court.*
- attainable** Able to be attained; achievable.  
*Choose an **attainable** goal.*
- biddable** Strong enough to justify a bid.  
*A gentle **biddable** soul.*

<b>complaisant</b>	Showing a cheerful willingness to do favors for others. <i>There are too many <b>complaisant</b> doctors signing sick notes.</i>
<b>compliant</b>	Disposed or willing to comply. <i>The conversion of the gel to a much less <b>compliant</b> rigid glass.</i>
<b>controllable</b>	Capable of being directed or influenced. <i>Discontent began to give way to barely <b>controllable</b> rage.</i>
<b>doable</b>	Within one's powers; feasible. <i>None of the jobs were fun but they were <b>doable</b>.</i>
<b><u>docile</u></b>	Willing to be taught or led or supervised or directed. <i>She s a black Labrador gentle and <b>docile</b>.</i>
<b>easy to use</b>	Affording pleasure.
<b>feasible</b>	Possible to do easily or conveniently. <i>The Dutch have demonstrated that it is perfectly <b>feasible</b> to live below sea level.</i>
<b>governable</b>	Capable of being controlled.
<b><u>handy</u></b>	Useful and convenient. <i><b>Handy</b> with an axe.</i>
<b><u>malleable</u></b>	(of a metal or other material) able to be hammered or pressed into shape without breaking or cracking. <i>They are as <b>malleable</b> and easily led as sheep.</i>
<b>manipulable</b>	Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded.
<b><u>pliable</u></b>	Capable of being bent or flexed or twisted without breaking. <i><b>Pliable</b> teenage minds.</i>
<b>pliant</b>	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out. <i>A <b>pliant</b> young tree.</i>
<b><u>possible</u></b>	Having as much or as little of a specified quality as can be achieved. <i>The shortest <b>possible</b> route.</i>
<b>practicable</b>	Able to be used; useful. <i>A <b>practicable</b> solution.</i>
<b>realizable</b>	In or able to be converted into cash. <i>The need to define <b>realizable</b> targets.</i>
<b>reasonable</b>	Not excessive or extreme. <i>It seems a <b>reasonable</b> enough request.</i>
<b>submissive</b>	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant S H Adams. <i><b>Submissive</b> servants.</i>
<b>tameable</b>	Capable of being tamed.

<b>tractable</b>	Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded)- Samuel Butler. <b>Tractable</b> young minds.
<b>user-friendly</b>	Easy to use.
<b>viable</b>	(of a plant, animal, or cell) capable of surviving or living successfully, especially under particular environmental conditions. <b>Viable</b> seeds.
<b>yielding</b>	Giving a product or generating a financial return of a specified amount. A timid <b>yielding</b> person.

- acquiescent** Willing to carry out the orders or wishes of another without protest.  
*His **acquiescent** mood.*
- amenable** Readily reacting to suggestions and influences.  
*An **amenable** hospitalization should not result in untimely death.*
- chasten** (especially of God) discipline; punish.  
*The director was somewhat **chastened** by his recent flops.*
- civilize** Raise from a barbaric to a civilized state.  
*Both countries feel they have a mission to **civilize** the world.*
- compliant** Having the property of compliance.  
*The conversion of the gel to a much less **compliant** rigid glass.*
- control** The economic policy of controlling or limiting or curbing prices or wages etc.  
*Crime **control**.*

<b>controllable</b>	Capable of being directed or influenced. <i>The glider was fully <b>controllable</b>.</i>
<b>controlled</b>	Having been limited in intensity or level; kept in check. <i>Rebel <b>controlled</b> areas of the country.</i>
<b><u>docile</u></b>	Ready to accept control or instruction; submissive. <i>She s a black Labrador gentle and <b>docile</b>.</i>
<b>doctrinaire</b>	A doctrinaire person. <i>The administration s <b>doctrinaire</b> economic policy.</i>
<b><u>domestic</u></b>	Converted or adapted to domestic use. <i>They are often called to sort out a <b>domestic</b>.</i> (of an animal) tame and kept as a pet or on a farm.
<b>domesticated</b>	<i>Some men think it unmanly to be <b>domesticated</b> others find gratification in it.</i>
<b>dominate</b>	Be greater in significance than. <i>A picturesque city <b>dominated</b> by the cathedral tower.</i>
<b>dominated</b>	Harassed by persistent nagging.
<b>dutiful</b>	Willingly obedient out of a sense of duty and respect. <i>A <b>dutiful</b> visit.</i>
<b>foreseeable</b>	Capable of being anticipated. <i>The situation is unlikely to change in the <b>foreseeable</b> future.</i>
<b>govern</b>	Exercise authority over; as of nations. <i>The future of Jamaica will be <b>governed</b> by geography not history.</i>
<b><u>malleable</u></b>	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out. <i>A <b>malleable</b> metal can be beaten into a sheet.</i>
<b><u>meek</u></b>	Very docile- Langston Hughes. <i>A fine fiery blast against <b>meek</b> conformity.</i>
<b><u>obedience</u></b>	The trait of being willing to obey. <i><b>Obedience</b> to moral standards.</i>
<b><u>obedient</u></b>	Complying or willing to comply with an order or request; submissive to another's authority. <i>An <b>obedient</b> soldier.</i>
<b><u>predictable</u></b>	Capable of being foretold. <i>The characters are stereotyped and extremely <b>predictable</b>.</i>
<b>rule</b>	Linguistics a rule describing or prescribing a linguistic practice. <i>It was his <b>rule</b> to take a walk before breakfast.</i>
<b>submissive</b>	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant. <i><b>Submissive</b> servants.</i>

- subservience** The condition of being less important than something else.  
*Blind **subservience** to authority.*
- subservient** Serving or acting as a means or aid.  
*The whole narration is **subservient** to the moral plan of exemplifying twelve virtues in twelve knights.*
- tame** Very docile- Langston Hughes.  
*The wolf was **tamed** and evolved into the house dog.*
- tractability** The trait of being easily persuaded.
- tractable** Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded).  
***Tractable** young minds.*
- willing** The act of making a choice.  
***Willing** and prompt obedience.*
