abominable	Unequivocally detestable- Edmund Burke. <i>What an abominable mess.</i>
aileron	An airfoil that controls lateral motion.
<u>alter</u>	Make an alteration to. <i>Our outward appearance alters as we get older.</i>
<u>brainwash</u>	Submit to brainwashing indoctrinate forcibly. <i>People are brainwashed into believing family life is the best.</i>
contort	Twist and press out of shape. <i>A spasm of pain contorted his face.</i>
crimp	A small connecting piece for crimping wires or lines together. <i>Mum crimped my hair for the party.</i>
deform	Become distorted or misshapen undergo deformation. <i>His body was deformed by leprosy.</i>
<u>deformed</u>	So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly. <i>His deformed hands.</i>
disfigure	Mar or spoil the appearance of. <i>The vandals disfigured the statue.</i>
<u>distort</u>	Twist and press out of shape. <i>You re distorting the sound by overdriving the amp.</i>
flex	The act of flexing. <i>A group of bodybuilders flexed their muscles.</i>
garble	A garbled account or transmission. <i>Most readers assumed the word was a typographical garble.</i>
handle	The feel of goods especially textiles when handled. <i>This blender can t handle nuts.</i>

<u>insinuate</u>	Introduce or insert (oneself) in a subtle manner. <i>He insinuated himself into the conversation of the people at the nearby table.</i>
irreversibly	In a way that cannot be undone or altered. <i>Our landscape will be irreversibly damaged.</i>
kink	Form a curl curve or kink. <i>Though the system is making some headway there are still some kinks to iron out.</i>
mutate	Undergo mutation. <i>The virus is able to mutate into new forms that are immune to the vaccine.</i>
operate	(of a person) control the functioning of (a machine, process, or system). <i>Doctors refused to operate because of the risks involved.</i>
overstate	To enlarge beyond bounds or the truth. <i>I overstated my case to make my point.</i>
<u>pervert</u>	Practice sophistry; change the meaning of or be vague about in order to mislead or deceive. <i>Hector is a man who is simply perverted by his time.</i>
retouch	Give retouches to hair. <i>This photograph has been retouched.</i>
torsion	A twisting force.
transformed	Given a completely different form or appearance. <i>Shocked to see the transformed landscape.</i>
<u>twist</u>	A paper packet with twisted ends. <i>It broke off after much twisting.</i>
warp	In weaving arrange yarn so as to form the warp of a piece of cloth. <i>The main canal may be cut so as to warp the lands on each side of it.</i>
wrench	Turn something especially a nut or bolt with a wrench. <i>Wrench one's ankle.</i>
wrest	Obtain by seizing forcibly or violently, also metaphorically. <i>Leila tried to wrest her arm from his hold.</i>
wrestle	Take part in a fight, either as sport or in earnest, that involves grappling with one's opponent and trying to throw or force them to the ground. <i>She wrestled the keys out of the ignition.</i>
wry	Humorously sarcastic or mocking. <i>A remedy for wry necks.</i>
