instructions	A manual usually accompanying a technical device and explaining how to install or operate it.





- Of or relating to the hands.
- Using or working with the hands.
- Relating to or done with the hands.

ingenuity	The quality of being clever, original, and inventive. The ingenuity of Haydn s scoring.
labor	An organized attempt by workers to improve their status by united action particularly via labor unions or the leaders of this movement. <i>His labor did not require a great deal of skill.</i>
laborer	Someone who works with their hands; someone engaged in manual labor.
oaken	Consisting of or made of wood of the oak tree. The old oaken bucket.
proficiency	A high degree of skill; expertise. <i>He demonstrated his proficiency in Chinese.</i>
quality	Of good quality excellent. A masterpiece for connoisseurs of quality .
