Definitions of "Mapping" as a noun

- *A mathematical relation such that each element of a given set (the domain of the function) is associated with an element of another set (the range of the function).*
- *An operation that associates each element of a given set (the domain) with one or more elements of a second set (the range).*
- *The process of locating genes on a chromosome.*
- *(mathematics) a mathematical relation such that each element of a given set (the domain of the function) is associated with an element of another set (the range of the function).*
- *(genetics) the process of locating genes on a chromosome.*



Synonyms of "Mapping" as a noun (4 Words)

chromosome mapping

A threadlike strand of DNA in the cell nucleus that carries the genes in a linear order.

function

A mathematical relation such that each element of a given set the domain of the function is associated with an element of another set the range of the function.

*The **function** $b \times c$.*

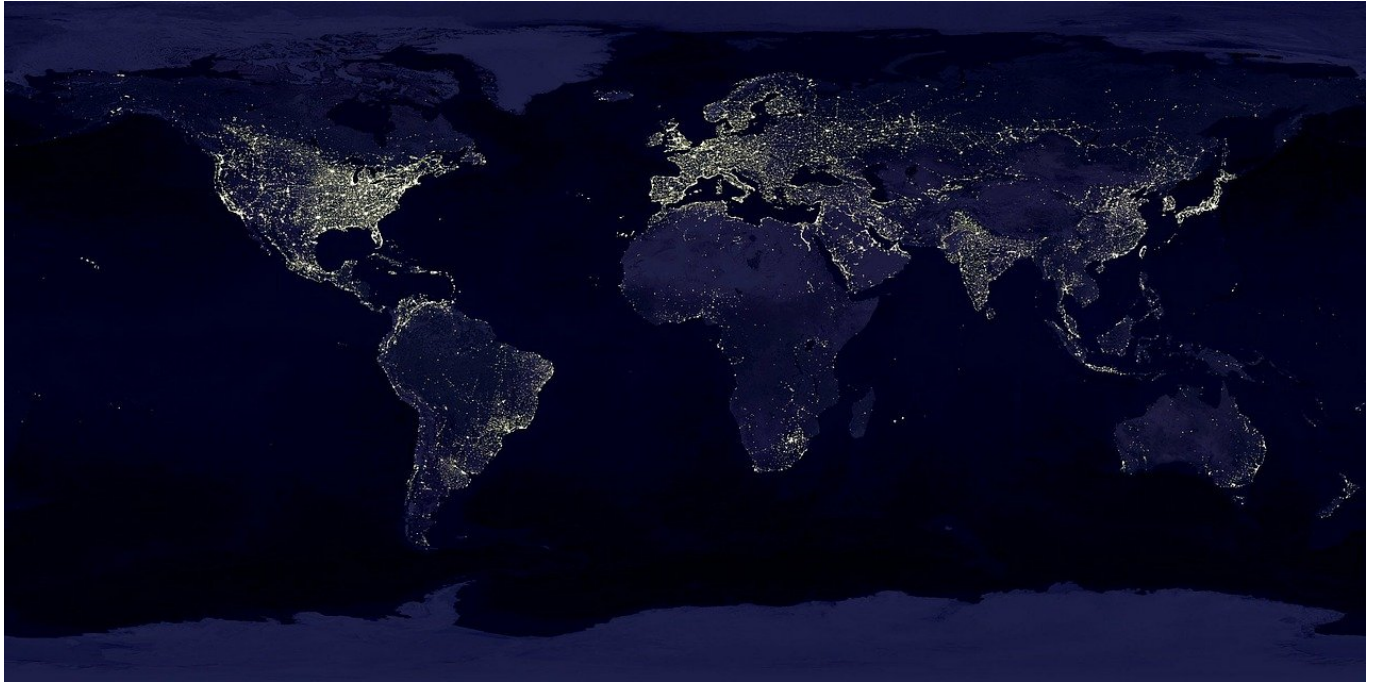
map

A set sequence of steps, part of larger computer program.

geographical	Based on or derived from the physical features of an area. <i>Geographical boundaries.</i>
geography	The study of the physical features of the earth and its atmosphere, and of human activity as it affects and is affected by these, including the distribution of populations and resources and political and economic activities. <i>The geography of post war London.</i>
geologic	Of or relating to or based on geology. <i>Geological formations.</i>
geology	The geological features of an area. <i>An article on the Moon s geology.</i>
ground	Of a batter hit a pitched ball so that it bounces on the ground. <i>An adjoining area of ground had been purchased.</i>
hotspot	A lively entertainment spot. <i>Teams will patrol anti social behaviour hotspots in all parts of the borough.</i>
land	Put someone or something on land from a boat. <i>The pilot managed to land the airplane safely.</i>
map	Represent an area on a map make a map of. <i>A physical and genetic map of the entire human genome.</i>
marine	Of or relating to the sea. <i>Marine insurance.</i>
physiography	The study of physical features of the earth's surface.
plat	Make a plat of. <i>They looked out over the plats of dark ground.</i>
plot	Mark (a route or position) on a chart. <i>He outlined his idea for a movie plot.</i>
region	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>The promotion of investment in the regions.</i>

- volcanic** Relating to or produced by or consisting of volcanoes.
