Definitions of "Marginal" as an adjective

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "marginal" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- (of costs or benefits) relating to or resulting from small or unit changes.
- Just barely adequate or within a lower limit.
- Close to the limit of profitability, especially through difficulty of exploitation.
- Relating to water adjacent to the land's edge or coast.
- Relating to or at the edge or margin.
- Minor and not important; not central.
- At or constituting a border or edge.
- *Producing at a rate that barely covers production costs.*
- (of a parliamentary or council seat) held by a small majority and therefore at risk in an election.
- (of taxation) relating to increases in income.
- Of questionable or minimal quality.
- (of a decision or distinction) very narrow; borderline.

slight A slight increase.


small Made to seem smaller or less especially in worth.
