### Definitions of "Marketplace" as a noun

- *An area in a town where a public mercantile establishment is set up.*
- *An open space where a market is or was formerly held.*
- *The arena of commercial dealings.*

**market** The free market.  
A *market* economy.

**market place** The customers for a particular product or service.

**mart** An area in a town where a public mercantile establishment is set up.  
A *liquor mart*.

## Associations of "Marketplace" (30 Words)

<b>bazaar</b>	A shop where a variety of goods are sold. <i>The church <b>bazaar</b>.</i>
<b>bearish</b>	Expecting prices to fall. <i>A <b>bearish</b> figure with mutton chop whiskers.</i>
<b>clothier</b>	A person or company that makes or sells clothes or cloth.
<b>deli</b>	A shop selling ready-to-eat food products.
<b>discount</b>	Deduct an amount from (the usual price of something). <i>The bill will be <b>discounted</b> sold for a sum less than its maturity value.</i>
<b>fishmonger</b>	A person or shop that sells fish for food.
<b>foodstuff</b>	A substance suitable for consumption as food. <i>Rationing of staple <b>foodstuffs</b> was introduced.</i>
<b>grocery</b>	Items of food sold in a grocery or supermarket. <i>The <b>grocery</b> store included a meat market.</i>
<b>huckster</b>	A person who writes radio or tv advertisements. <i>He was <b>huckstering</b> a video.</i>
<b>market</b>	The securities markets in the aggregate. <i>There is a <b>market</b> for high priced wine.</i>

<b>mart</b>	An area in a town where a public mercantile establishment is set up. <i>A liquor <b>mart</b>.</i>
<b><u>merchant</u></b>	In historical contexts relating to merchants or commerce. <i>Prosperous <b>merchants</b> and clothiers had established a middle class.</i>
<b>outsell</b>	Sell more than others. <i>The new Toyota <b>outsells</b> the Honda by a wide margin.</i>
<b>peddle</b>	Try to sell (something, especially small goods) by going from place to place. <i>He <b>peddled</b> printing materials around the country.</i>
<b>price</b>	Discover or establish the price of something for sale. <i>They say that every politician has a <b>price</b>.</i>
<b>purchaser</b>	A person who buys. <i>One of the club's prospective <b>purchasers</b>.</i>
<b>retail</b>	At a retail price. <i>It is not yet available <b>retail</b>.</i>
<b>sales</b>	Income (at invoice values) received for goods and services over some given period of time.
<b><u>salesman</u></b>	A man whose job involves selling or promoting commercial products, either in a shop or visiting locations to get orders. <i>An insurance <b>salesman</b>.</i>
<b>sell</b>	Sell all of one's stock of something. <i>Every other television commercial is a <b>sell</b> for Australian lager.</i>
<b><u>seller</u></b>	A product that sells in some specified way. <i>The book became the biggest <b>seller</b> in the history of royal publishing.</i>
<b>selling</b>	The exchange of goods for an agreed sum of money.
<b>shopping</b>	The commodities purchased from storeswomen carrying home shopping didn't give me a second glance. <i>A busy <b>shopping</b> area.</i>
<b><u>store</u></b>	Find a place for and put away for storage. <i>Her vast <b>store</b> of knowledge.</i>
<b>supermarket</b>	A large self-service shop selling foods and household goods.
<b>undersell</b>	Promote or value (something) insufficiently. <i>We can equal or <b>undersell</b> mail order.</i>
<b>vend</b>	Sell (something). <i>The company makes and <b>vends</b> environmentally friendly beauty products.</i>
<b><u>vendor</u></b>	A person or company offering something for sale, especially a trader in the street. <i>An Italian ice cream <b>vendor</b>.</i>



**vintner** Someone who makes wine.

**wholesale** At a wholesale price.  
*Bottles from this region sell **wholesale** at about 72 a case.*
