marshland	Low-lying wet land with grassy vegetation; usually is a transition zone between land and water. <i>Thousands of acres of marshland</i> .
mire	A soft wet area of low-lying land that sinks underfoot. <i>Caught in the <b>mire</b> of poverty.</i>
morass	An area of muddy or boggy ground. In midwinter the track beneath this bridge became a muddy <b>morass</b> .

peat bog	Partially carbonized vegetable matter saturated with water; can be used as a fuel when dried.
quag	A soft wet area of low-lying land that sinks underfoot.
<u>quagmire</u>	A soft boggy area of land that gives way underfoot. A legal <b>quagmire</b> .
reginald marsh	New Zealand writer of detective stories (1899-1982.
slough	A hollow filled with mud. The economic <b>slough</b> of the interwar years.
sump	A cesspool.
<u>swamp</u>	An area of low-lying, uncultivated ground where water collects; a bog or marsh. The ceaseless deluge had turned the lawn into a <b>swamp</b> .
swampland	Land consisting of swamps. Many had trekked through <b>swampland</b> to reach the border.
wetland	A low area where the land is saturated with water. <i>The draining of British <b>wetland</b>s.</i>

arroyo	A stream or brook.
bog	Be or become stuck in mud or wet ground. The vote would <b>bog</b> down the house.
<u>canyon</u>	A ravine formed by a river in an area with little rainfall. <i>The Grand Canyon</i> .
<u>clay</u>	A hardened clay surface for a tennis court. A <b>clay</b> tile.
cypress	A cypress tree or branches from it as a symbol of mourning.
<u>damp</u>	Damp air or atmosphere. She tried to <b>damp</b> down her feelings of despair.
dank	Unpleasantly cool and humid. Huge <b>dank</b> caverns.
delta	The 4th letter of the Greek alphabet. There s a <b>delta</b> between perception and reality.
foothill	A relatively low hill on the lower slope of a mountain. The camp lies in the <b>foothill</b> s of the Andes.

marshland	Land consisting of marshes. <i>Marshland</i> landscapes.
marshy	Characteristic of or resembling a marsh; waterlogged. A <b>marshy</b> coastline.
mire	Cause to get stuck as if in a mire. <i>The mud <b>mire</b>d our cart.</i>
morass	An area of muddy or boggy ground. She would become lost in a <b>morass</b> of lies and explanations.
<u>mud</u>	Soil with mud muck or mire. The two sides took over the local media to throw <b>mud</b> at each other.
<u>quagmire</u>	An awkward, complex, or hazardous situation. Torrential rain turned the building site into a <b>quagmire</b> .
quicksand	A pit filled with loose wet sand into which objects are sucked down. It s best to travel with a local as there are <b>quicksand</b> s.
ravine	A deep, narrow gorge with steep sides.
riparian	Of or relating to or located on the banks of a river or stream. All the <b>riparian</b> states must sign an agreement.
shoal	Of fish form shoals. <b>Shoal</b> s of people were coming up the drive.
slough	Cast off hair, skin, horn, or feathers. The economic <b>slough</b> of the interwar years.
sludge	The precipitate produced by sewage treatment. A <b>sludge</b> green.
soggy	Dull and lifeless. We squelched through the <b>soggy</b> ground.
splashing	The act of splashing a liquid substance on a surface.
<u>swamp</u>	Low land that is seasonally flooded; has more woody plants than a marsh and better drainage than a bog. <i>He was trapped in a medical swamp</i> .
swampy	Characteristic of or resembling a swamp. <i>Swampy bayous.</i>
<u>vale</u>	A valley (used in place names or as a poetic term. <i>The Vale of Glamorgan.</i>
<u>valley</u>	A low area of land between hills or mountains, typically with a river or stream flowing through it. <i>The valley floor.</i>
