fantastic	Ludicrously odd. <i>Gaudi's fantastic architecture.</i>
grand	Magnificent and imposing in appearance, size, or style. <i>This was opera on a grand scale.</i>
howling	Filled with or characterized by howling. <i>A howling success.</i>
improbable	Too improbable to admit of belief. <i>An improbable event.</i>
marvellous	Too improbable to admit of belief. <i>These marvellous technological toys are fun to play with.</i>
<u>miraculous</u>	Remarkable and bringing very welcome consequences. <i>I felt amazed and grateful for our miraculous escape.</i>
rattling	Making a series of knocking sounds. <i>Had a rattling conversation about politics.</i>

tall	Great in vertical dimension; high in stature. <i>Tall</i> people.
terrific	Causing terror. A <i>terrific</i> noise.
tremendous	Inspiring awe or dread. A plane took off with a <i>tremendous</i> noise.
wonderful	Inspiring delight, pleasure, or admiration; extremely good; marvellous. The climate was <i>wonderful</i> all the year round.
wondrous	Inspiring a feeling of wonder or delight; marvellous. This <i>wondrous</i> city.

<u>amaze</u>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>She amazed doctors by fighting back when her deteriorating condition caused her to suffer heart failure.</i>
amazing	Surprising greatly. <i>She makes the most amazing cakes.</i>
astonish	Affect with wonder. <i>You never fail to astonish me.</i>
<u>astonishing</u>	Extremely surprising or impressive; amazing. <i>The dog was capable of astonishing tricks.</i>
astound	Affect with wonder. <i>Her bluntness astounded him.</i>
<u>astounding</u>	Surprisingly impressive or notable. <i>An astounding achievement.</i>

awesome	Extremely impressive or daunting; inspiring awe. <i>My yearly review went awesome.</i>
enormous	Very large in size, quantity, or extent. <i>An enormous boulder.</i>
exceeding	Extremely exceedingly. <i>A night of exceeding darkness.</i>
excellent	Very good; of the highest quality. <i>Made an excellent speech.</i>
exceptional	Deviating widely from a norm of physical or mental ability; used especially of children below normal in intelligence. <i>A child of exceptional ability.</i>
fantastic	Fanciful and unrealistic; foolish. <i>She had spent a fantastic amount of cash.</i>
incredible	Difficult to believe; extraordinary. <i>I was mesmerized she looked so incredible.</i>
magnificent	Characterized by grandeur. <i>Magnificent cathedrals.</i>
miraculous	Peculiarly fortunate or appropriate; as if by divine intervention. <i>I felt amazed and grateful for our miraculous escape.</i>
outstanding	Exceptionally good. <i>An outstanding fact of our time is that nations poisoned by anti semitism proved less fortunate in regard to their own freedom.</i>
prodigious	Remarkably or impressively great in extent, size, or degree. <i>Rumours of prodigious happenings such as monstrous births.</i>
profound	Profound quality. <i>A profound sigh.</i>
redoubtable	(of a person) formidable, especially as an opponent. <i>A tougher and more redoubtable adversary than the heel clicking jackbooted fanatic.</i>
remarkable	Worthy of notice. <i>A remarkable achievement.</i>
shattering	Very shocking or upsetting. <i>Shattering rain striking the windowpanes.</i>
smashing	The act of breaking something into small pieces. <i>You look simply smashing.</i>
staggering	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>Suffered a staggering defeat.</i>

*A slightly bizarre and **unconvincing** fusion of musical forces.*
- unexpectedly** Without advance planning.
*He died **unexpectedly** of a heart attack.*
- unimaginable** Difficult or impossible to imagine or comprehend.
*Lives of almost **unimaginable** deprivation.*
- wonderful** Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers.
*The climate was **wonderful** all the year round.*
