**down pat** Shut.



## Associations of "Mastered" (30 Words)

- adroit** Clever or skilful.  
*His **adroit** replies to hecklers won him many followers.*
- artisan** (of food or drink) made in a traditional or non-mechanized way using high-quality ingredients.  
*The growing appreciation of **artisan** foods.*
- blacksmith** A smith who forges and shapes iron with a hammer and anvil.
- calligrapher** Someone skilled in penmanship.
- carpenter** Do the work of a carpenter.  
*She **carpenters** and goes on archaeological digs.*
- chieftain** The head of a tribe or clan.  
*Powerful feudal **chieftains**.*
- craftsman** A skilled worker who practices some trade or handicraft.  
*As an actor he was a consummate **craftsman**.*

<b>deft</b>	Skillful in physical movements; especially of the hands. <i>The script was both <b>deft</b> and literate.</i>
<b>dexterous</b>	Skillful in physical movements; especially of the hands. <i><b>Dexterous</b> of hand and inventive of mind.</i>
<b>dextrous</b>	Skillful in physical movements; especially of the hands.
<b>expert</b>	A person who is very knowledgeable about or skilful in a particular area. <i>An <b>expert</b> in healthcare.</i>
<b>glazier</b>	Someone who cuts flat glass to size.
<b>handcraft</b>	Make skilfully by hand. <i>We <b>handcraft</b> all our paper.</i>
<b>host</b>	Be the host of or for. <i>They were always gracious <b>hosts</b> at the numerous dinner parties they held for friends.</i>
<b>leader</b>	The person who leads or commands a group, organization, or country. <i>A <b>leader</b> in the use of video conferencing.</i>
<b>liege</b>	City in eastern Belgium; largest French-speaking city in Belgium. <i>The king s <b>lieges</b>.</i>
<b>lord</b>	Make a lord of someone. <i><b>Lords</b> and ladies were entertained here.</i>
<b>mason</b>	A Freemason. <i>One course of massive stones roughly <b>masoned</b>.</i>
<b>overlord</b>	A ruler, especially a feudal lord. <i>The Jews rebelled against their Roman <b>overlords</b>.</i>
<b>owner</b>	Someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business. <i>He is the <b>owner</b> of a chain of restaurants.</i>
<b>plumber</b>	A craftsman who installs and repairs pipes and fixtures and appliances.
<b>proprietor</b>	The owner of a business, or a holder of property. <i>Chinese restaurant <b>proprietors</b>.</i>
<b>silversmith</b>	Someone who makes or repairs articles of silver.
<b>skilled</b>	Based on or proceeding from the ability to do something well. <i><b>Skilled</b> draughtsmen.</i>
<b>skillful</b>	Done with delicacy and skill. <i>The effect was achieved by <b>skillful</b> retouching.</i>
<b>skipper</b>	Work as the skipper on a vessel. <i>The <b>skipper</b> and one other man were convicted of smuggling.</i>



- squad** A small squad of policemen trained to deal with a particular kind of crime.  
*The 39 year old actress and her **squad** snapped some pics together after the show.*
- tanner** A small coin of the United Kingdom worth six pennies; not minted since 1970.  
*Skincare companies are coming to the rescue of consumers with sunless **tanners**.*
- workmanlike** Worthy of a good workman.  
*The book is a **workmanlike** job with chronology and bibliography and index.*
- wright** United States aviation pioneer who (with his brother Orville Wright) invented the airplane (1867-1912).
