<b>exhibitor</b>	A person who displays works of art or other items of interest at an exhibition. <i>The trade fair attracted 89 <b>exhibitors</b> and 37 000 visitors.</i>
<b>film</b>	Be well or badly suited to portrayal in a film. <i>A new range of <b>films</b> and cameras.</i>
<b>fresco</b>	The method of painting frescoes used in Roman times and by the great masters of the Italian Renaissance including Giotto Raphael and Michelangelo. <i>Four scenes had been <b>frescoed</b> on the wall.</i>
<b>gallery</b>	A collection of pictures. <i>An extensive <b>gallery</b> of colour photographs.</i>
<b>literary</b>	Of language associated with literary works or other formal writing having a marked style intended to create a particular emotional effect. <i>The great <b>literary</b> works of the nineteenth century.</i>
<b>literature</b>	The humanistic study of a body of literature. <i>The technical <b>literature</b>.</i>
<b>minstrel</b>	A performer in a minstrel show. <i>They listened to the <b>minstrels</b> singing songs of knightly prowess.</i>
<b>montage</b>	A sequence of film made using the technique of montage. <i>The art of <b>montage</b> in theatre and film.</i>
<b>mosaic</b>	A pattern resembling a mosaic. <i>The bird s plumage was a <b>mosaic</b> of slate grey blue and brown.</i>
<b>movie</b>	Films generally or the film industry. <i>A <b>movie</b> star.</i>
<b>mural</b>	A painting or other work of art executed directly on a wall. <i><b>Mural</b> thrombosis.</i>
<b>novel</b>	The literary genre represented or exemplified by novels. <i>He burned all the <b>novels</b>.</i>
<b>painting</b>	The occupation of a house painter. <i>He bought the <b>painting</b> as an investment.</i>
<b>performer</b>	A person who entertains an audience. <i>A circus <b>performer</b>.</i>
<b>photo</b>	Take a photograph of. <i>Do we wait till you ve had him <b>photoed</b>.</i>
<b>photocopy</b>	Make a photocopy of. <i>You can <b>photocopy</b> the entry form.</i>

<b>photographer</b>	Someone who takes photographs professionally. <i>A freelance press <b>photographer</b>.</i>
<b>picture</b>	Show in or as in a picture. <i>We were warned not to take <b>pictures</b>.</i>
<u><b>poem</b></u>	A composition written in metrical feet forming rhythmical lines. <i>The sun is an important symbol in this <b>poem</b>.</i>
<b>poesy</b>	Literature in metrical form. <i>They were enamoured of <b>poesy</b> and the fine arts.</i>
<b>portrayal</b>	An instance of an actor playing a part in a film or play; a performance. <i>The media <b>portrayal</b> of immigration.</i>
<u><b>theater</b></u>	A building where theatrical performances or motion-picture shows can be presented. <i>He served in the Vietnam <b>theater</b> for three years.</i>
<b>theatrical</b>	Relating to acting, actors, or the theatre. <i>A <b>theatrical</b> pose.</i>
<u><b>writer</b></u>	A person who is able to write and has written something. <i>The <b>writer</b> of the letter.</i>
