Definitions of "Maturity" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “maturity” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The period of time in your life after your physical growth has stopped and you are fully developed.*
- *State of being mature; full development.*
- *The time when an insurance policy, security, etc. matures.*
- *The state, fact, or period of being mature.*
- *An insurance policy, security, etc. having a fixed maturity date.*
- *The date on which an obligation must be repaid.*



Synonyms of "Maturity" as a noun (13 Words)

- adulthood** The period of time in your life after your physical growth has stopped and you are fully developed.
*The crucial years between adolescence and **adulthood**.*
- coming-of-age** How long something has existed.
- due date** A payment that is due (e.g., as the price of membership).
- full growth** The time when the Moon is fully illuminated.
- majority** The age at which a person is legally a full adult, usually either 18 or 21.
*In the **majority** of cases all will go smoothly.*
- manhood** The men of a country or society regarded collectively.
*The unity of Godhead and **manhood** in Christ.*
- maturess** The state or quality of being mature; maturity.
- maturity date** State of being mature; full development.

mellowness	Kindheartedness through maturity or old age. <i>A mellowness of light and shade not attainable in marble.</i>
puberty	The time of life when sex glands become functional. <i>A particularly traumatic puberty.</i>
pubescence	Soft down on the leaves and stems of plants or on various parts of animals, especially insects.
ripeness	The state of being ripe.
womanhood	The state of being an adult woman. <i>It s an insult to American womanhood.</i>



Usage Examples of "Maturity" as a noun

- *The maturity date.*
- *Interest is not paid until maturity.*
- *The fish takes 35 years to reach maturity.*
- *Some investors found a safe harbour in shorter-term maturities.*
- *The progress of an ingénue from childhood to maturity.*



Associations of "Maturity" (30 Words)

- adolescence** In the state that someone is in between puberty and adulthood.
*During **adolescence** teenagers often experience violent mood swings.*
- adolescent** Relating to or peculiar to or suggestive of an adolescent.
*The books are aimed at children and **adolescents**.*
- adult** Behave in a way characteristic of a responsible adult especially by accomplishing mundane but necessary tasks.
*An **adult** animal.*

adulthood	The period of time in your life after your physical growth has stopped and you are fully developed. <i>Most of the larvae die although some survive to adulthood.</i>
age	A particular stage in someone's life. <i>It was replaced because of its age.</i>
amplify	Increase in size, volume or significance. <i>The manufacturers have developed a system of amplifying the radio signal.</i>
childhood	The state or period of being a child. <i>The idealized world of childhood.</i>
dating	Use of chemical analysis to estimate the age of geological specimens.
development	Processing a photosensitive material in order to make an image visible. <i>In chess you should take care of your development before moving your queen.</i>
fledged	(of an arrow) fitted with feathers. <i>A recently fledged bird.</i>
grow	Grow emotionally or mature. <i>Morels grow in a variety of places.</i>
growing	The process of an individual organism growing organically a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>The growing concern over ozone levels.</i>
grown	(of animals) fully developed. <i>A grown woman.</i>
humanity	Human beings collectively. <i>He praised them for their standards of humanity and care.</i>
immature	Having or showing an emotional or intellectual development appropriate to someone younger. <i>His immature sense of humour.</i>
infancy	The earliest state of immaturity. <i>A son who died in infancy.</i>
lad	A boy or young man (often as a form of address). <i>A furious row ensued between the referee and our lads.</i>
manhood	The state of being a man; manly qualities. <i>We drank to prove our manhood.</i>
maturation	Coming to full development; becoming mature. <i>Sexual maturation.</i>
maturational	Relating to or involved in maturation.

mature	Fully developed or matured and ready to be eaten or used. <i>A mature cell.</i>
matured	Fully considered and perfected.
nubile	(of a young woman) sexually attractive. <i>He employed a procession of nubile young secretaries.</i>
precocious	(of a plant) flowering or fruiting earlier than usual. <i>A precocious solitary boy.</i>
puberty	The time of life when sex glands become functional. <i>The onset of puberty.</i>
teen	A teenager. <i>Managing troubled teens has become a difficult task for parents.</i>
teenage	Relating to or characteristic of teenagers. <i>A teenage girl.</i>
teenager	A juvenile between the onset of puberty and maturity.
unaided	Carried out without aid or assistance. <i>She can no longer walk unaided.</i>
young	Young people collectively. <i>Young tender mint leaves.</i>
