Synonyms of "Maximize" as a verb (15 Words)

- amplify** Increase in size, volume or significance.
*The manufacturers have developed a system of **amplifying** the radio signal.*
- augment** Enlarge or increase.
*The recent speech of the president **augmented** tensions in the Near East.*

- boost** Give a boost to be beneficial to.
***Boost** the voltage in an electrical circuit.*
- broaden** Extend in scope or range or area.
*Her interests **broadened** as she grew up.*
- deepen** Make or become deep or deeper.
*This event only **deepened** my convictions.*
- dilate** Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing.
*The woman **dilated** her nostrils.*
- enhance** Increase.
*This sauce will **enhance** the flavor of the meat.*
- enlarge** Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing.
*Very often a favourite photograph is **enlarged** and framed.*
- expand** Expand the influence of.
*The work began as a short story and was later **expanded** into a novel.*
- extend** Thrust or extend out.
*The war **extended** over five years.*
- heighten** Make more intense, stronger, or more marked.
*The stage will be extended **heightening** the grid by 3 4 metres.*
- increase** Become bigger or greater in amount.
*The boss finally **increased** her salary.*
- intensify** Make more intense, stronger, or more marked.
*The dispute began to **intensify**.*
- maximise** Make as big or large as possible.
- widen** Make (clothes) larger.
*His grin **widened**.*



Usage Examples of "Maximize" as a verb

- *The company was aiming to maximize profits.*
- *He maximized his role.*
- *A thriller that maximizes the potential of its locations.*



Associations of "Maximize" (30 Words)

- assistance** The provision of money, resources, or information to help someone.
*His job was to give technical **assistance** over the phone.*
- augment** Grow or intensify.
*The pressure **augmented**.*
- behalf** For someone's benefit usually expressed as in behalf rather than on behalf and usually with a possessive.
*In your **behalf**.*
- benefit** Derive a benefit from.
*Families on **benefit**.*
- bolster** Prop up with a pillow or bolster.
*They **bolstered** the seats for a more comfortable ride.*
- distend** Cause to expand as if by internal pressure.
*The abdomen **distended** rapidly.*

earnings	The excess of revenues over outlays in a given period of time (including depreciation and other non-cash expenses). <i>They saved a quarter of all their earnings.</i>
efficiency	An action designed to achieve efficiency. <i>The boiler has an efficiency of 45 per cent.</i>
enhance	Intensify, increase, or further improve the quality, value, or extent of. <i>This will enhance your enjoyment.</i>
<u>enlarge</u>	Become larger or bigger. <i>They have renovated and enlarged the four storey building.</i>
expand	Expand the influence of. <i>Alice opened and expanded in this normality.</i>
expansion	A function expressed as a sum or product of terms. <i>The expansion of $a^2 + b^2$ is $(a + b)(a + b)$.</i>
fund	Place or store up in a fund for accumulation. <i>He had set up a fund to coordinate economic investment.</i>
help	The action of helping someone to do something. <i>He was helped down the steps.</i>
improve	Get better. <i>Efforts to improve relations between the countries.</i>
increase	The amount by which something increases. <i>The university increased the number of students it admitted.</i>
increment	A regular increase in salary on an incremental scale. <i>Your first increment will be payable six months from your date of commencement.</i>
<u>magnify</u>	Increase or exaggerate the importance or effect of. <i>Praise the Lord and magnify Him.</i>
<u>prerogative</u>	Arising from the prerogative of the Crown usually delegated to the government or the judiciary and based in common law rather than statutory law. <i>The monarch retained the formal prerogative power to appoint the Prime Minister.</i>
privilege	Grant a privilege or privileges to. <i>Education is a right not a privilege.</i>
proceeds	Money obtained from an event or activity. <i>Proceeds from the event will go to aid the work of the charity.</i>
profit	Make a profit gain money or materially. <i>Record pre tax profits.</i>

profitability	The state of yielding profit or financial gain. <i>Intense rivalry reduces industry profitability.</i>
<u>profitable</u>	(of a business or activity) yielding profit or financial gain. <i>A professionally run and profitable company.</i>
rates	A local tax on property (usually used in the plural).
<u>refurbish</u>	Renovate and redecorate (something, especially a building). <i>The premises have been completely refurbished in our corporate style.</i>
<u>reinforcement</u>	A device designed to provide additional strength. <i>Reinforcements set in the concrete.</i>
<u>revenue</u>	The department of the civil service collecting state revenue. <i>His priority was to raise government revenue and to lower expenditure.</i>
strengthen	Make strong or stronger. <i>This exercise will strengthen your upper body.</i>
<u>upgrade</u>	An act of upgrading something. <i>The power plant received a new upgrade.</i>
